## NSIC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jordan Smith helped the Huskies score 57 runs in six conference games this week and set a school record with 416 runs scored this season, going 13-for-24 from the plate. Smith posted four doubles, a triple, a three-run home run and 16 RBI during the week. He went 4-for-5 with three RBI and three runs scored with a pair of doubles in an 11-9 win over Wayne State. He then put up more impressive numbers in a 15-2 win over Northern State Sunday, going a perfect 5-for-5 with six RBI, before closing out the series with a 2-for-5, four RBI game that included a triple. His 16 RBI this week also helped the team set a school record for most RBI in a single season with 376, while the Huskies sit on top of the conference with a league-high 21 wins.

### AUGUSTANA COLLEGE

Deryk Marks (Jr., IF, Cottage Grove, Minn.) posted a .519 (14-for-27) average this week, driving in 11 runs for the Vikings to lead to a 4-2 team record. Of Marks 14 hits, seven were for extra bases, including six doubles and one grand slam home run. Marks did not strike out in all six games and was error-free in the field.

Bennett Johnson (Fr., P, Minneapolis, Minn.) had two appearances this week. In 5 1/3 innings, Johnson gave up only two hits and one run while striking out seven. His ERA for the week was 1.69.

### BEMIDJI STATE

#32 Chad Hanson (Fr., OF) batted 8-for-24 (.333) in the 3-3 NSIC week by the Beavers. Hanson batted lead-off all six games, producing a team-best 10 runs. He added two RBI in the six games, while taking 11 total bases. Two of his eight hits were for extra bases, including his first-career triple. In the 4-3 win against Concordia University, Hanson batted 3-for-4, his first-career three-hit game, adding two runs. In the field on the weekend he had six putouts with one assists for a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Over the six games, Hanson improved his batting average from .278 to .310.

#27 Dan Bauer (Jr., RHP, Bemidji, Minn., Bemidji HS) had a career-high 15 strikeouts in a 7-3 victory against University of Mary Wednesday at the BSU Baseball Field. The three runs allowed by Bauer all came from solo homeruns, as he relinquished just four hits in the game. He went the distance for BSU, pitching all seven innings, improving to 3-3. Bauer threw 113 pitches, 71 for strikes, while facing 28 batters. His 15 K's is the most by a BSU pitcher this season.

### CONCORDIA-ST. PAUL

Bryan Lippincott continues to mash Northern Sun pitching, hitting .478 (11-23) last week against two of #25 Minnesota State's top pitchers and again in the weekend series against Bemidji State. His bat at the top of the order guided Concordia to a 4-2 record as they continue their late season surge. In the six games, he had a .586 on base pct. and a .870 slugging pct as he delivered three doubles and two home runs, scoring 11 runs. He was perfect on the bases, swiping four bases to give him a team leading 17-17 on the season. His 11 hits have propelled him to a new single season record with 77, shattering the old mark of 69 with six games remaining on the year in the regular season. While defense has been the one area he has struggled this year, Lippincott was stellar in the field last week committing just one error while delivering 13 strikes from shortstop and making a handful of dazzling defensive plays on the diamond. He leads Concordia with 31 extra base hits and is among the NSIC leaders in the batting title race, hitting .486 in NSIC play in 25 games.

Nick Anderson continues to do it all on the mound. He appeared in three consecutive games for Concordia, pitching the second game against Bemidji State working the extra inning in the 8th for his sixth victory. In the first game on Monday, Anderson saved it for Concordia in a 12-9 win before turning around and hurling a complete game in the final game of the series as he was charged with a loss. He is now 6-6 with 6 saves on the season and has tied the school record for appearances with 23 and is just three outs away from the most innings in a season, having already registered 74.2. On the week, Anderson was 1-1 with 1 save in three appearances with a 3.86 earned run average over 9.1 innings. He struck out six and walked one. His outstanding play down the stretch has lowered his season ERA to 4.46 and he has 57 strikeouts. In league play, Anderson has appeared in 13 of CU's 25 games with three starts (and three complete games) while posting a 4-3 record with 4 saves and a 4.15 ERA. He has struck out 31 in 43.1 innings in Northern Sun action.

Freshman 2B J.T. Schneider (Oak Creek, Wis.) had his hitting streak halted at 20 games on Wednesday at #25 Minnesota State in game two of the doubleheader. In the first game, he extended the streak in his first at bat in the first inning with a solo home run that set the pace for a stunning 17-7 10-run rule victory in 7-innings over the Mavericks ... seniors Blake DeVries and Brenden Furrow have each clubbed 10 home runs in 25 league games as they are in the race for the home run crown ... Furrow's 2009 record of 69 hits was broken by teammate Lippincott but Furrow is right behind him with 72 with six games to play and holds three of the top four hits seasons in school history ... Furrow also drove in 13 RBI last week and now has 59, just six shy of the single season record with as many games to play ... sophomore Troy DuBay hit .500 (8-16) with a .619 on base pct. and two sacrifice hits last week from the ninth spot in the order ... Concordia's loss in the final game against Bemidji State snapped a 9-game home winning streak at Barnes Field.

### UNIVERSITY OF MARY

Shane Gathman (C, Jr., Minot, ND) batted .467 and had a hit in all five games he played last week. The junior catcher went 7-for-15 at the plate with two doubles and five RBI, scoring twice. Gathman slugged .600 with a .529 on base percentage. Gathman went 2-for-4 to start the week against Bemidji State and closed with a 2-for-3 contest with two RBI and a double in a win over Upper Iowa on Sunday. He also drove in two runs with a long double against UIU on Saturday. Andy Leer (SS, Sr., Williston, ND) had a hit in all six games and had a .391 batting average for the week. He had two doubles, a home run, drove in three, scored twice and stole three bases.

Ryan Schnell (Sr., Mandan, ND) threw a six hit, nine inning complete game in a 3-2 win over Upper Iowa on Saturday. In his lone appearance of the week, Schnell allowed one earned run, no walks and struck out six. It was his team-leading fifth complete game of the season and lowered his season ERA to 3.46.

### MINNESOTA, CROOKSTON

UMC went 0-3 on the week and close out the season with six road games. The Golden Eagles travel to Minnesota Duluth on Wednesday and Wayne State on Saturday/Sunday. U of M, Crookston is led by Devin Croal (So, SS, Coon Rapids, Minn.) who is hitting .328 (42-for-128) with 18 RBI. David Lovly (Sr, OF, Goodridge, Minn.) is hitting .325 (40-for-123) with 6 RBI, 21 runs scored and 13 stolen bases. Josh Kraby (Fr, OF/3B, Glencoe, Minn.) is hitting .300 (33-for-110) with 15 RBI.

## MINNESOTA DULUTH

Will Dahlgren (Sr., OF, 5-10, 180, Burnsville, Minn., Dakota County Tech College) batted .458 (11 hits in 24 at bats) to help lead UMD to a 4-2 week. The co-captain launched three home runs in six starts, driving in 11 runs. Dahlgren also scored eight times and added a pair of two-baggers, registering a .917 slugging percentage. His biggest hit came in the first game in the Bulldogs' Monday split against Winona State, with the two-year regular driving in the winning run in the eighth frame of UMD's 8-7 victory.

Anders Engberg (So., RHP/1B, 6-0, 175, Burnsville, Minn., Burnsville HS) tossed a complete-game seven-hitter in UMD's 8-4 Sunday night-cap victory over then-league-leading Winona State. The righty struck out six Warrior batters, walking just one, to help move his record to 4-2 in 2010. It marked the third complete-game performance of the year for Engberg.

UMD went 4-2 last week, sweeping Minnesota-Crookston on Wednesday before splitting with No. 30-ranked Winona State on Sunday and Monday. A pair of seniors shone brightest on UMD's Senior Day in Sunday's split against WSU. Outfielders and co-captains Bryan Denisen and Will Dahlgren teamed up to drive in 14 of the team's 19 runs, combining to swat four big flies. Junior shortstop Tyler Erickson expanded his current school-record hitting streak to 29 games; he also broke UMD's individual season-hits mark (with 73) Monday. The Bulldogs haven't been swept in a double dip in nearly a month (April 2 versus St. Cloud State).

## MINNESOTA STATE

Freshman outfielder Mike Eckhart, a native of Boone, Iowa, went nine-of-13 at the plate, a .692 batting average, in five games last week for MSU, while recording his first career triple and home run; he was walked once and hit by a pitch. In game two of Sunday's action, Eckhart went two-for-three with three RBI and scored once, including his first career homer in the fourth inning, a two-run shot to put MSU's deficit to only one. The freshman followed that up with by going three-for-four in game one on Monday, including his first career triple. Overall on the week Eckhart tallied six RBI, four runs scored and a earned 15 total bases. The Mavericks went 4-2 on the week, splitting with Concordia University last Wednesday and taking three-out-of-four games from Wayne State over the weekend.

Sophomore right-handed pitcher Blake Schwartz, a native of Rosemount, Minn., finished the week with a team-best 2-0 record, including a team-best 11 strikeouts and a team-low 3.21 ERA. The righty opened the week last Wednesday pitching five innings, giving up five runs (three earned) off of seven hits and striking out two in a 8-5 win over Concordia University. Schwartz followed that start up with a nine-inning complete game win over Wayne State by a score of 6-3, Monday. In his nine innings of work, the second year Maverick gave up three runs (two earned) off of four hits and struck out eight. The Mavericks went 4-2 on the week, splitting with Concordia University last Wednesday and taking three-out-of-four games from Wayne State over the weekend.

MSU has outscored their opponents 313-159 on the season and out hit their opponents 431-282.

- The Mavericks have scored the majority of their runs in the third (45) and the fifth (47) innings this season, while also having given up the most runs in the third (26) and fifth (31).

- Senior third baseman Kosuke Hattori, a native of Kanagawa, Japan, ended his team season-high 18-game hit streak Monday afternoon. The switch hitter owns a .331 batting average, with six doubles, three triples,

two home runs and 31 RBI on the year. Hattori sits first on MSU's all-time list in stolen bases with 89 (needing only four more steals this season to become the single season record holder), first in games played with 199 and became the programs all-time walks leader Monday afternoon, earning the 100th of his career. The third baseman also sits second in career runs (157), second in career at bats (617), second in career hits (208) and tied for third in career triples (9). - Junior shortstop Zach Rowles, a native of Sun Prairie, Wis., the only Maverick to record two, four-hit games this season and is the owner of several team-bests including: a .380 batting average, 158 at bats, 52 runs, 60 hits, 15 doubles, 87 total bases, .429 OBP and is second on the team in steals with 24. - Junior designated-hitter Pat Dockendorf, a native of Eagan, Minn., is the owner of a team-best seven-game hitting streak.

## NORTHERN STATE

#23 Kyle Nemece (Fr., P/3B/1B, L/R, 6-3, 220, Vermillion, S.D. / Vermillion HS) led the Wolves with a .385 average (5/13) last week, including a double, a run scored, and three RBI. He also hit his first home run of the season in Northern State's 28-10 loss to Valley City State on Wednesday. The freshman finished his week with a .692 slugging percentage and .467 on-base percentage for a 1.159 OPS.

The Wolves will close out their regular season this weekend when they host in-state rival Augustana College in a four-game homestand.

## SOUTHWEST MINNESOTA STATE

Matt Bauer (3B, Sr., Tracy, Minn.) batted .435 in six games with 10 hits in 23 at bats with two homers, one double and six RBI. He recorded 17 total bases for a .739 slugging percentage.

Adam Schrader (Sr., Easton, Minn.) went 1-0 in two starts with a 4.70 ERA versus Winona State and Augustana. He pitched 15.1 innings, allowing eight earned runs, while striking out 13 and walking three. In Monday's start versus Augustana, Schrader became SMSU's all-time strikeout leader and now has amassed 229 in his career. Schrader tossed a complete game victory vs. Augustana, allowing two runs with six strikeouts.

## ST. CLOUD STATE

Freshman cleanup hitter Jordan Smith (Willmar) helped the Huskies score 57 runs in six conference games this week and set a school record with 416 runs scored this season, going 13-for-24 from the plate. He is currently has a 2.90 earned run average in 71.1 innings for St. Cloud State.

UPPER IOWA

The Peacocks struggled through a rough week of games as they finished 1-7 in four double headers. Upper Iowa was led by Luis Rodriguez at the plate. The third baseman hit .385 with 10 hits including 5 doubles and 2 homeruns for a slugging percentage of .808. The junior scored 9 runs and drove in 7. Mikey Henrichs, Josh Frank, and Jordan Nuss were the only other Peacocks to bat over .300 for the week. The trio combined for 25 hits including 3 doubles and one homer by Nuss. On the mound, UIU got their lone win out of Ryan Lynn, who threw four innings of scoreless relief in the team's game two against U-Mary. UIU wraps up their season this week with a double header at Augustana and then will welcome the Bulldogs of Minnesota Duluth to Robertson Woods Field for the final four game series of the year. UIU will honor their 6 seniors in between games on Sunday.

WAYNE STATE

Joe Wendte led Wayne State during the week with a .417 batting average in six games vs. St. Cloud State and Minnesota State, going 10 for 24 with four doubles, three RBI's and eight runs scored....Wendte saw his season-high 14 game hit streak end on Monday in a 3-0 loss at Minnesota State. Wendte was 5 for 10 with two doubles and three runs scored last Wednesday vs. St. Cloud State and was 4 for 8 with three runs scored in Sunday's split at Minnesota State.

Another Wildcat had a longer hit streak end on Monday as well as junior second baseman Nick Bidroski saw a 19-game hit streak end in Monday's first game vs. Minnesota State. For the season, Bidroski and Wendte lead Wayne State in hitting with averages of .434 and .407 respectively.

WINONA STATE

Winona State University, ranked No. 30 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, split six Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference games during the week.

Joe Kley (OF, Jr., Lester Prairie, Minn.) started all six games and batted .455 with ten hits in 22 atbats. He scored 8 runs, slugged two doubles and four home runs and totaled 24 bases for a 1.091 slugging percentage. His on base percentage was .520 and fielded ten total chances without making an error.
