## THE GAME

The Bemidji State University football program opens its 85th season of football Thursday as it welcomes Minot State University to Chet Anderson Stadium. In addition to the match up marking the 11th Annual Beaver Bash, the contest is also being held in conjunction with BSU's Fourth Annual Community Appreciation Day. The event will include 'A Taste of Bemidji' with food samples from local vendors, activities for children, a chance to meet BSU student-athletes and of course Bucky the Beaver. The night will conclude with a fireworks display over Lake Bemidji brought to you by Paul Bunyan Telephone.

## THE SERIES

Tonight's contest between BSU and MSU marks the 11th meeting between the teams. BSU enters the game holding a 9-1 advantage in the all-time series and has won each of the last six. Bemidji State has scored at least 25 points in each previous meeting, has netted over 40 points on three occasions, while it has outscored MSU by an average margin of 34.7 to 13.3 since the series began in 1999. BSU is 3-1 when hosting MSU, which includes a 1-0 mark when hosting the Beavers in the season opener. Speaking of home-openers, Bemidji State opens the season at home for just the fifth time in 14 seasons under Tesch and has posted a 3-1 mark in those outings.

## THE COACHES

**Bemidji State:** Jeff Tesch is in his 14th season roaming the sidelines at Bemidji State. He has posted an overall record of 83-57 (.593), which includes a 62-42 (.596) mark in NSIC tilts and a 9-1 record versus Minot State. In 13 years, Tesch has established BSU standards for games coached (134), victories (83), career winning percentage (.593) and conference wins (62).

**Minot State:** Paul Rudolph enters his third season at Minot State and his 11th season as a collegiate head coach. In his first two seasons at MSU, he has led the Beavers to a 11-3 league mark in league play, consecutive top-two finishes in the Dakota Athletic Conference and was named DAC Coach of the Year in 2007. Rudolph also served as head coach at Upper Iowa University from 1991-99.

## THE PROGRAM

Bemidji State's all-time record is 300-391-24 (.436) dating back to 1926, which includes a 165-241-9 (.408) mark in NSIC play. The Beavers own five conference titles (1947, 50, 57, 59 and 2006) and count the 2006 Mineral Water Bowl as their first post-season appearance. Under the direction of Tesch, BSU has posted winning records in 10 of the last 11 years and have posted seven consecutive winning home campaigns.

## THE LINE ON THE LINES

The Beavers return four of five from the 2008 offensive line and all three from the starting defensive front for the 2009 season. **Davis Mickelson, Jordan Anderson, Chad Whaley** and **Cory Immerman** each started all 11 games a year ago kickstarting a running game that averaged nearly 150 yards per contest in the final three games of the season and protected quarterback Derek Edholm, who set BSU marks for completions and completion percentage. On the defensive front, 2008 *Second-Team All-NSIC Rob Wills*, who has collected 36 tackles this season with 7.5 coming for a loss and 4.0 quarterback sacks, will lead the pursuit and will be joined by Jordan Lardinois and Bryan Wick who solidified roles as starters down the stretch in 2008.

## SEEING RED ZONE

In 2008, BSU ventured inside its opponents 20 yard line 35 times, and of those the Beavers have scored on 22 (.629 with 20 coming by way of TDs). On the other hand, BSU's opponents have found the BSU red zone 40 times and have scored 77-percent of the time (31).

## EFFICIENT QB PLAY

In the four games after returning from injury, sophomore quarterback *Second-Team All-NSIC* selection **Derek Edholm** completed 71 of 108 passes for 926 yards and 11 touchdowns. Edholm has not thrown an interception since Oct. 4, 2008 at St. Cloud State—a streak spanning five games and 76 completions. On the season, he set school marks for completions (193) and completion percentage (62.5).

## CAPITALIZING ON OPPORTUNITIES

In 2008, the Beavers forced 25 turnovers, but didn't always take advantage of those opportunities. BSU failed to score a single point off of a takeaway in its six losses. Conversely, in BSU's five wins, the team piled up 52 points on 15 turnovers.

## THE EARLY BIRD GETS THE WIN


The Beavers were slow out of the gate in 2008. In fact, BSU was first on the scoreboard just three times all season, and those resulted in two wins and a loss. Since 1999, BSU is a scorching 51-10 when scoring first while it is just 22-26 when its opponent beats it to the scoreboard.

## SCORING STREAK STRETCHED TO 121

Although BSU's scoring output was down last season, the Beavers still managed to get on the scoreboard in each of their 11 contests. With 24 points versus Concordia-St. Paul in the 2008 finale, the Beavers have now scored in 121 consecutive games. The last time BSU was held without a single point was Nov. 8, 1997 when Minnesota Duluth defeated BSU 41-0.

## WE'VE MADE IT TO 300

Bemidji State has fielded a football team since the 1926 season and in the 2008 finale BSU hit a milestone. With a 24-12 victory over Concordia-St. Paul, BSU moved to 300-381-24 for a .436 winning percentage.

## LAST TIME THESE TEAMS MET

Last fall the Beavers opened the season at Minot State. Although BSU pulled out of North Dakota with a 27-24 victory, it took a fourth quarter drive capped by a three-yard TD strike from Edholm to **George Kadlec** to keep the winning streak over MSU alive.

In the game Edholm was 32-44 for 305 yards with two touchdowns, setting career marks for passing yardage and completions in just his second career start. Kadlec grabbed 10 catches for his first 100-yard game of the season while hauling in both Edholm TD passes. The Beaver rushing attack, led by **Brandon Miles** (16att-67yds-1td), went for 132 yards and a pair of scoring plunges.

For Minot State, Jon Meier was 10-of-23 for 102 yards, while throwing two interceptions. Nick Banks rushed 19 times for 126 yards and a touchdown, but it was return specialist Johnny Lester who gave the Beavers a spark. He returned a second quarter punt 73 yards for seven and the opening kick of the second half 84 yards for a touchdown to give MSU a 21-12 lead just 10 seconds into the third period.

## STOP THE REVOLVING DOOR

For the first time in five seasons, the Beavers will have a familiar face calling the signals on offense in consecutive seasons. **Derek Edholm** stepped up to gained control of the first-team offense last fall, gained *Second-Team All-NSIC* honors and is back for his junior campaign. It marks the first time the same quarterback has been in the starting lineup in consecutive season-opening games since **Nathan Sannes** did in 2004 and 2005.

## OPENING THE SEASON WITH THE BEAVERS

Bemidji State is 40-43-1 in season-openers since 1926. Under Tesch the team has posted a 8-5 mark going 3-1 wwhen opening the season at home.

## SIX YARDS OF SEPARATION

The connections to Minot State run deep for the Beavers. It seems that no matter where you look, there are ties to MSU. The first, and most obvious, is that BSU associate head coach/co-defensive coordinator **Rich Jahner** and MSU head coach Paul Rudolph were college teammates at Minot State from 19885-85--Jahner's junior and senior seasons--when they played under Randy Headberg. Previous to MSU, Rudolph coached at St. Cloud State (1999-2006) under former mentor Headberg. Headberg was also an assistant coaching colleague of Jahner at Central Missouri State from 1990-92.

New for this season, Jahner's son Trace, is now a freshman roaming the defensive secondary for the MSU Beavers.

## TOP TACKLER

Linebacker **Jake Anderson** is again expected to be the glue that holds the 2009 edition of BSU's Gang Green defense together. Anderson, returns as the team's top tackler from each of the last two seasons (2007-68 and 2008-70). The 2008 *Second-Team All-NSIC* pick, a 2008 and 2009 *NSIC Preseason Player to Watch* and 2009 team captain is coming of a season during which he not only led the team in total tackles (70), he topped the charts in assisted tackles (38) tackles for loss (11.5) and sacks (4.5), while ranking second on the team in interceptions (3).

It begins in early October with the turning of the fall leaves. Students, proud alumni and families from surrounding communities file into a small, picturesque stadium on the shore of Lake Bemidji with fevered expectations for the battles to come. Through the autumn combat, those watchful souls have been blessed to witness an unprecedented era of success. All-America honorees. School records falling by the wayside with an almost dazzling regularity. A stadium where victories occurred with the frequency of a bigfoot sighting just a few short years ago now hosts men with annual dreams of championship and glory.

It's an era of success and excitement that once might have seemed akin to the Christmas fantasies of youth. But under the masterful guidance of 13th-year head coach Jeff Tesch, the Bemidji State football program has undergone a remarkable metamorphosis and gone from annual doormat to title contender.

Tesch has posted a 83-57 record at BSU and led the Beavers to a school-record streak of 10 consecutive winning seasons from 1998-2007. During that historic streak he posted four of the five eight-win seasons for a program now in its 84rd season of competition. He is the only coach in Bemidji State history to oversee back-to-back eight-win seasons, and his 2000 and 2006 teams set matching school records of nine wins.

Tesch's success at BSU has been remarkable. Upon being named BSU's 15th field general in May 1996, he inherited a program which had won just 16 games in its previous eight seasons, suffering losing streaks of nine, 11 and 18 games in that time. Today, his 83 wins represent nearly 28 percent of the program's all-time victories. He has averaged six wins a season at a program which in 70 years prior to his arrival averaged barely three victories each fall. In fact, Tesch's 80 wins in 13 years surpass the number of victories garnered by the Bemidji State program in the 29 full seasons prior to his arrival — 81.

Tesch has further cemented his legendary status by becoming Bemidji State's all-time leader in coaching victories. He posted his 53rd win at BSU with a 28-20 victory over Minnesota Crookston on Oct. 16, 2004, moving him past H. "Jolly" Erickson, who won 52 games during a 17-year career at BSU from 1938-54.

Tesch's growing list of achievements at Bemidji State has him amongst the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference's coaching deans as well. A two-time NSIC Coach of the Year now in his 13th season at the Bemidji State helm, Tesch is the second-longest tenured coach in the conference, trailing only Winona State's Tom Sawyer who enters his 14th year with the Warriors.

Before taking over at BSU, Tesch spent 11 years as an assistant for annual NCAA Division II playoff contender North Dakota. There, he assumed assistant head coaching duties in 1995. The Fighting Sioux captured at least a share of the North Central Conference championship three consecutive seasons before Tesch's departure in 1996. In addition to coaching duties, Tesch helped the Sioux achieve a 92 percent graduation rate while serving as academic advisor.

Prior to his UND appointment, Tesch spent one year as an assistant at Montana State, followed by a two-year stint as offensive coordinator at Central Missouri State.

A graduate of Moorhead State (Minn.) University who was a free-agent signee with the Atlanta Falcons, Tesch was inducted into the MSU Hall of Fame in the spring of 1998. In 1977, Tesch was the NCAA Division II receiving champion and still holds Dragon single-game and single-season records for receptions.

In 29 years of coaching, Tesch has produced 12 All-America selections and five NFL draft picks.

Jeff and his wife Susan have two children — daughter Tara and son Vincent.
