### THE GAME

Bemidji State University football team (2-1; 1-1 NSIC) rekindles its oldest active rivalry this weekend as it welcomes Minnesota State University, Moorhead (1-2; 0-2 NSIC) to Chet Anderson Stadium for a 1 p.m. Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference clash. In addition to the match up being the first NSIC North contest of the season for either team, the Beavers know there is more on the line. The BSU/MSUM series is known as the "Battle for the Axe" series and there has been a noticeable void in the Bemidji State trophy case since Sept. 20, 2008. BSU is determined to fill that vacancy this weekend. With a victory over the Dragons, the Beavers would regain possession of the coveted Battle Axe—NCAA Division II's second-oldest traveling trophy. In addition, BSU, which is 2-0 at "The Chet" this season, looks to extend its home winning streak to seven games.

### THE SERIES

The Bemidji State/MSU Moorhead rivalry is as rich as any on the docket for the Beavers this fall. Beginning Sept. 28, 1929, the Dragons currently lead the all-time series 43-30-3, and are coming off of a 27-7 win last fall, but in recent history, the Beavers have been nothing but dominant. Since the 1998 season, BSU is 9-2 versus the Dragons. Despite winning eight of the last nine in the 'Battle for the Axe' series, BSU trails MSUM 24-34-3 for possession of the traveling trophy. MSUM holds an 15-14-2 advantage in 'Battle Axe' games played in Bemidji, Minn.

### THE COACHES

**Bemidji State:** Jeff Tesch is in his 14th season roaming the sidelines at Bemidji State. He has posted an overall record of 85-58 (.594), which includes a 63-43 (.596) mark in NSIC tilts and a 9-4 record versus MSU Moorhead. In 14 seasons, Tesch has established BSU standards for games coached (143), victories (85), career winning percentage (.594) and conference wins (63).

**MSU Moorhead:** In his fourth season at MSU Moorhead, Damon Tomeo has posted a 13-23 overall, while his squads are 9-20 in league play. Prior to grabbing the reigns of the Dragon football program, Tomeo served as its defensive coordinator for two seasons. The California native began his coaching career running the west coast football circuit making stops at University of Redlands, California Lutheran and the University of Arizona where served as assistant director of recruiting and football operations.

### THE PROGRAM

Bemidji State's all-time record is 303-392-24 (.436) dating back to 1926, which includes a 166-242-9 (.408) mark in NSIC play. The Beavers own five conference titles (1947, 50, 57, 59 and 2006) and count the 2006 Mineral Water Bowl as their first post-season appearance. Under the direction of Tesch, BSU has posted winning records in 10 of the last 11 years and have posted seven consecutive winning home campaigns.

## THE LINE ON THE LINES

Bemidji State's offensive line may be young, but returning four of five starters from the 2008 line, there is no lack of experience. **Davis Mickelson, Jordan Anderson, Chad Whaley** and **Cory Immerman** each started all 11 games a year ago and have jumped in along with newcomers **Brett DeLange** and **Alonzo Melton** to provide a the push up front to power the BSU running game to an average of 222 yards per game, which is good for second in the NSIC. On the defensive front, BSU returns all three starters from a year ago, including 2008 *Second-Team All-NSIC Rob Wills*, who currently ranks third on the team with 13 tackles (six-solo), three tackles for loss a sack and an interception returned for a touchdown.

## SEEING RED ZONE

After a season in which, BSU ventured inside it opponents 20 yard line 35 times, and scored on 22 occasions (.629 with 20 coming by way of TDs), the Beavers have opened the 2009 season scoring on each of the 12 times they entered the redzone with 10 of 12 coming by way of TDs (83-percent)).

## HOME COOKIN'

The Beavers enter this weekend having won each of their last six home games and 12 of the last 14. Since Jeff Tesch took the helm of the BSU football program prior to the 1996 season, the Beavers have posted a 46-18 overall record with a 36-12 mark in NSIC play at "The Chet." Tesch and the Beavers are riding a wave of seven consecutive winning seasons on their home turf, which includes undefeated home slates in 1998 (4-0), 2000 (5-0) and 2005 (4-0).

## CAPITALIZING ON OPPORTUNITIES

In 2008, the Beavers forced 25 turnovers, but didn't always take advantage of those opportunities--BSU failed to record a single point off of a takeaway in its six losses. However, the team has gotten off on the right foot in 2009 turning four of its seven take-a-ways into points, which includes a Sept. 5th game at Minnesota State during which it turned four takeaways into 21 points.

## BSU IN THE TOP 15

Bemidji State enters this week's contest ranked among NCAA Division II's top 20 in two statistical categories. The Beavers are tied for 17th in the country and lead the NSIC in turnover margin at +1.33 takeaways per game and 19th in rushing offense with 222 yards per contest.

team is averaging 35.0 points per game. Only four times in BSU's 83-year history has it scored for a better average over the course of a season. The 2004 team currently holds the BSU single-season scoring mark after putting up 422 points in 11 games for a 38.4 points per game average.

## SCORING STREAK STRETCHED TO 124

With 24 points versus Winona State Sept. 12, the Beavers have now scored in 124 consecutive games. The last time BSU was held without a single point was Nov. 8, 1997 when Minnesota Duluth defeated BSU 41-0.

## RUNNING FOR YOUR LIFE...

In 2009, 10 of BSU's 12 offensive touchdowns have come on the ground (83-percent) marking the first time since the 2004 season that the Beavers have rushed for more touchdowns than they passed. The last time BSU's offensive attack was even remotely this run-heavy dates back to the 1995 season, during which the Beavers rushed for 13 touchdowns, while passing for just five (72-percent) in 10 games.

## I'LL TAKE 2 IN THE PICK SIX

The Beavers have intercepted two passes this season and both have been returned the distance for a touchdown.

Since 1985, only four BSU teams have turned more interceptions into touchdowns. In 2003, the team picked off 23 passes and returned four for scores, while in 1996, 2005, 2006 three TDs were the result of INTs.

## LAST TIME THESE TEAMS MET

MSU Moorhead got the best of the Beavers and gained possession of the coveted Battle Axe for the first time in nine meetings in when these teams last met Sept. 20, 2009 at Alex Nemzek Stadium in Moorhead, Minn. The Dragons forced BSU to punt after gaining just five yards on its first possession and Josh Jones returned the kick for a school-record 94 yards and a touchdown. The Beavers would never regain their composure. BSU managed just 13 yards on the ground and a season-low 217 yards of total offense.

MSUM took a 13-7 into halftime, would add a touchdown in the third and fourth while holding BSU scoreless in the game's final 30 minutes.

Tim Hanson led the Dragon ground game with 58 yards and a TD on 16 attempts, while Craig Kutz passed for 150 yards with an interception on 19-of-34. Jabari Taylor grabbed seven passes for 73 yards.

BSU's Derek Edholm completed 19-of-30 passing attempts for 150 yards and an interception. George Kadlec and Andrew Schultz each hauled in five passes with Kadlec racking up a team-leading 69 yards.

## BALL HOGS

This season Bemidji State has dominated time of possession in each of its three games. In 180 minutes of play, the Beavers have had the ball in their possession for 109:46--that leaves just 70:14 for their opponents. On average BSU has held the ball for 36:35 per game to lead the NSIC by more than two minutes per outing.

## BEAVERS VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

When Bemidji State defeated No. 20 Winona State Sept. 12, 2009, it marked just the second time BSU had defeated a nationally-ranked opponent since the school elevated its program to the NCAA Division II ranks in the mid-1990s. BSU is 2-7 versus ranked opponents at the Division II ranks and is 1-1 during the 2009 season.

In 2009 BSU has already faced two nationally-ranked opponents marking the second time the Beavers have battled two of the American Football Coaches Association's (AFCA) top 25 teams in the same season.

The Beavers have never faced more than two ranked opponents in one campaign.

## THE BATTLE FOR THE AXE

The 1948 Bemidji State College football homecoming committee decided that something symbolic was needed to add color to the festivities. Publicity stunts that year included dropping leaflets, which included game admissions among them, from an airplane.

Homecoming committee chairman Ron Smith and others decided that an axe, then in possession of Smith, would serve as a suitable trophy to mark the hotly-contested annual Beaver-Dragon gridiron clash. The axe would be awarded to the university president representing the victor of the contest.

Smith's axe originated in the native village of Mount Hagon, New Guinea. The axe is hand made and was polished underwater by its maker. Two types of axe are produced by natives in the Mount Hagon area, one with a blade of black stone for work and one of gray stone for ceremonies. Smith procured the gray trophy axe through a series of shrewd trades with the natives.

In 1948 the teams fought to the bitter end for possession of the weapon in the inaugural Battle for the Axe, with Moorhead State winning 13-6. Despite a loss in the first battle, Bemidji State dominated the early history of the trophy series posting a 10-3-1 record in its first 14 games. BSU won five consecutive meetings in the series from 1957-'61 and was unbeaten in seven consecutive meetings from 1955-'61.

The tide turned in 1962, with the Dragons taking control of the series for the next few decades. In 21 games played from 1962 to 1982, the Beavers brought home the battle axe just twice - after a 28-12 win in Bemidji in 1969 and a 24-22 win in Moorhead in 1976. The Beavers broke through with two wins in four games from 1983-'86, but would then win just once - a 28-27 win in Bemidji in 1992 - in 11 games from 1987-'97.

But the tide has once again turned in BSU's favor, as the Beavers have captured seven of the last eight battles for the axe - including an active series-long streak of six consecutive wins.

### From the Sep. 29, 1948 edition of The Northern Student:

"Bemidji Presents Trophy to MSTC

Today a Homecoming committee journeyed to Moorhead State Teachers college for a special pep convocation. At this time invitations were extended to the faculty, student body, band and queen to come to BSTC where they will be given an active part in the Homecoming activities. At the convocation Ron Smith presented the New Guinea "Battle Ax" which is the new trophy between BSTC and MSTC."

It begins in early October with the turning of the fall leaves. Students, proud alumni and families from surrounding communities file into a small, picturesque stadium on the shore of Lake Bemidji with fevered expectations for the battles to come. Through the autumn combat, those watchful souls have been blessed to witness an unprecedented era of success. All-America honorees. School records falling by the wayside with an almost dazzling regularity. A stadium where victories occurred with the frequency of a bigfoot sighting just a few short years ago now hosts men with annual dreams of championship and glory.

It's an era of success and excitement that once might have seemed akin to the Christmas fantasies of youth. But under the masterful guidance of 14th-year head coach Jeff Tesch, the Bemidji State football program has undergone a remarkable metamorphosis and gone from annual doormat to title contender.

Tesch has posted a 85-58 record at BSU and led the Beavers to a school-record streak of 10 consecutive winning seasons from 1998-2007. During that historic streak he posted four of the five eight-win seasons for a program now in its 84th season of competition. He is the only coach in Bemidji State history to oversee back-to-back eight-win seasons, and his 2000 and 2006 teams set matching school records of nine wins.

Tesch's success at BSU has been remarkable. Upon being named BSU's 15th field general in May 1996, he inherited a program which had won just 16 games in its previous eight seasons, suffering losing streaks of nine, 11 and 18 games in that time. Today, his 85 wins represent nearly 28 percent of the program's all-time victories. He has averaged six wins a season at a program which in 70 years prior to his arrival averaged barely three victories each fall. In fact, Tesch's 80 wins in 14 years surpass the number of victories garnered by the Bemidji State program in the 29 full seasons prior to his arrival — 81.

Tesch has further cemented his legendary status by becoming Bemidji State's all-time leader in coaching victories. He posted his 53rd win at BSU with a 28-20 victory over Minnesota Crookston on Oct. 16, 2004, moving him past H. "Jolly" Erickson, who won 52 games during a 17-year career at BSU from 1938-54.

Tesch's growing list of achievements at Bemidji State has him amongst the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference's coaching deans as well. A two-time NSIC Coach of the Year now in his 13th season at the Bemidji State helm, Tesch is the second-longest tenured coach in the conference, trailing only Winona State's Tom Sawyer who enters his 15th year with the Warriors.

Before taking over at BSU, Tesch spent 11 years as an assistant for annual NCAA Division II playoff contender North Dakota. There, he assumed assistant head coaching duties in 1995. The Fighting Sioux captured at least a share of the North Central Conference championship three consecutive seasons before Tesch's departure in 1996. In addition to coaching duties, Tesch helped the Sioux achieve a 92 percent graduation rate while serving as academic advisor.

Prior to his UND appointment, Tesch spent one year as an assistant at Montana State, followed by a two-year stint as offensive coordinator at Central Missouri State.

A graduate of Moorhead State (Minn.) University who was a free-agent signee with the Atlanta Falcons, Tesch was inducted into the MSU Hall of Fame in the spring of 1998. In 1977, Tesch was the NCAA Division II receiving champion and still holds Dragon single-game and single-season records for receptions.

In 29 years of coaching, Tesch has produced 12 All-America selections and five NFL draft picks.

Jeff and his wife Susan have two children — daughter Tara and son Vincent.
