PLAYER TO WATCH



Junior forward **Matt Read** enters the weekend riding a nine-game scoring streak and has posted two-or-more points in six of the last nine games. The Ilderton, Ontario native has led the Beavers in scoring each of the last two seasons and his 2008-09 total of 15-25=40 points equaled Brendan Cook's BSU Division I-era record set in 2005.

THE MATCH UP

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team loads the bus this weekend to kick off the 2009-10 road schedule with a trip to Michigan's upper peninsula for its first meeting with Northern Michigan University. The series is set to begin Friday at 6:35 p.m. (CST) with the series finale scheduled for a 6:35 p.m. start at NMU's Berry Events Center.

After opening the season with a series sweep over the United State Air Force Academy Oct. 9-10 (3-1 and 7-3), the Beavers had a week off and return to action this weekend. The game marks the first road contest for BSU since it fell to Miami (Ohio) 4-1 in the semifinal game of the 2009 Frozen Four in Washington D.C. The Beavers were 9-12-1 last year when playing away from the John S. Glas Fieldhouse but were 0-8-0 in non-conference road contests.

Northern Michigan welcomes Bemidji State to Marquette, Mich. for their home-opening series. The Wildcats are 1-1-0 on the season after dropping the season-opener to Michigan Tech (5-3) Oct. 9 before defeating Minnesota Duluth (3-1) two days later as a part of the Lake Superior Classic. NMU was 10-8-1 at the Berry Events Center last winter including a two-game sweep of Michigan State to open the 2009 CCHA Tournament.

THE RIVALRY

Despite logging nearly 1,500 games dating back to the 1940s, the Beavers and Wildcats will meet for the first time on record this weekend. After the series, the Beavers will have gone head-to-head with 24 of the current 58 NCAA Division I programs. The Wildcats are one of two now opponents the Beavers will battle in 2009-10. BSU will also face Ohio State of the CCHA at the Subway Holiday Classic Nov. 28 in Grand Forks, N.D.

THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2009-10 season represents the 11th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 54th year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sports.

- ▶ BSU owns 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- ▶ The Beavers have captured 21 conference titles in 53 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- ▶ BSU won the CHA regular-season championship in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, becoming the league's first repeat regular-season titlist and captured the 2008-09 championship on the heels of a 2007-08 crown. BSU has also won CHA Tournament titles in 2005, 2006, and 2009 en route to participating in the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ In 2009, the Beavers became the first No. 16 seed ever to reach the Frozen Four. In just its 10th year of competition at the NCAA Division I level, only Denver reached hockey's grandest stage faster.
- ▶ BSU has developed six NHL players, six Olympians and 81 All-America honorees.
- ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 944-459-82 (.663) in 1,485 games and has the highest all-time winning percentage of the 58 programs which currently comprise NCAA Division I ice hockey.

GENERAL NOTES

THE COACHES

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State '86) is in his ninth season in his current post at BSU and has an overall record of 142-118-29 (.540). He has guided the Beavers to seven consecutive seasons with a record of .500 or better. Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular Season Championships four times in the last six years (2004, 2005, 2008 and 2009) and made three appearances in the NCAA Tournament (2005, 2006, 2009), included a trip to the Frozen Four in 2009. He was named CHA Coach of the Year in 2004, 2005, 2008 and 2009 and is a five-time Spencer Penrose finalist for national coach of the year with a runner-up finish in 2009.

► In seven seasons at Northern Michigan, **Walt Kyle** has guided the Wildcats to a 142-122-26 overall record, which includes five 20-win seasons. A 1981 graduate of Northern Michigan, Kyle has coaching experience in the American Hockey League, International Hockey League and Western Hockey League in addition to stints in the National Hockey League with New York and Anaheim.

BSU CAPS 2008-09 AT 20-16-1

Bemidji State wrapped up its 2008-09 CHA campaign, its ninth as a member of the NCAA Division I ranks, with a record of 12-5-1 to gain its fourth CHA regular-season title in the last six seasons. With a pair of wins in the CHA Tournament and two more in the Midwest Regional guaranteed **Tom Serratore** and his gang it's seventh consecutive season with a record of .500 or better as it finished at 20-16-1 overall--the team's fourth 20-win season under Serratore.

CHA SUCCESS

The Beavers are coming off another successful College Hockey America campaign pulling down its fourth regular-season title in six year with a 12-5-1 record. In the last five years, no NCAA Division I men's ice hockey team has a better winner percentage in league play than the Beaver's .704 mark (79-30-11) versus the CHA.

BSU VERSUS THE CCHA

Bemidji State's match up with may stand as the inaugural meeting between the teams, but the Beavers have a long-standing history with teams hailing from the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) reaching back into the days of NCAA Division II and III play. Since the 1999-2000 season, BSU is 6-13-1 versus the CCHA. BSU has wins over Ferris State, Lake Superior State, Western Michigan and most recently, a 5-1 triumph over then-ranked No. 2 Notre Dame at the NCAA Midwest Regional Semifinal Mar. 28, 2009. The Beavers are 25-32-2 all-time versus teams hailing from the league.

OT UNBEATEN STREAK HALTED AT 12

After nearly three years and without a loss in an overtime contest, Bemidji State's 4-3 loss to North Dakota Jan. 3, 2009 in extra time marked an end to the Beavers' 12-game overtime unbeaten streak. Prior to dropping the 4-3 decision to the Fighting Sioux, BSU last overtime loss came in a game at Niagara Feb. 24, 2006 (L, 6-5).

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 5-1-9 in games extended to sudden death.

NOTING 1-0 VICTORIES

Bemidji State's 1-0 win at Wayne State on Dec. 1, 2006 was just the third 1-0 win in BSU's 54 years of intercollegiate hockey competition, and the first since the program moved to Division I for the 1999-2000 season.

BSU had not posted a 1-0 win since Jan. 14, 1980, when it defeated St. Cloud State. BSU's first 1-0 win came over St. Scholastica on Feb. 17, 1977.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Chris McKelvie** (New Brighton, Minn.) will captain the Beavers during 2009-08 campaign. Senior defenseman **Kyle Hardwick** (Warroad, Minn.) and junior forward **Matt Read** (Ilderton, Ontario) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as assistant captains.

BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

As could be expected from any team, the Beavers' scoring output was headlined in 2008-09 by its upper classmen...but not by much. The seniors led the charge with 50-52=102 points, but ironically it was the freshman class that gave BSU a boost in scoring totalling 25-48=73 points to finish second.

BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 944 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 960 victories. Fifteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2008-09 BSU foes North Dakota (1,274; 7th), Michigan Tech (1,088; 10th) and the possible match up with Army (1,059; 13th) through March 17, 2009, Minnesota leads Division I with 1,593 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,500 or more all-time wins, while Boston College is second with 1,371 victories.

THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In 2008-09 three was the threshold for BSU. The Beavers allowed three or more goals on 18 occasions and were 2-15-1 in those games. Conversely, when BSU scored three or more goals, they were 16-5-1.

THE EARLY GOAL GETS THE WIN

Of the Beavers' 37 2008-09 contests, the team to score first won 26 times. BSU opponents won 12-of-21 of the games they were first to light the lamp while BSU was unbeaten 14-of-16 times it has scored first.

TWO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CHA

This season the Beavers had two players picked to the six-member squad. Forward **Matt Read** and defenseman **Brad Hunt**, both First-Team All-CHA picks last winter, were named 2009-10 Preseason All-CHA with Read pulling down Preseason Player of the Year laurels.

OFFENSIVE DEFENDER

Sophomore defenseman **Brad Hunt** was a big factor for the Beavers on both ends of the ice in 2008-09 and that trend is extending to 2009-10. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has become offensive threat --especially on the power play. A year ago, he led all BSU blue liners and was third on the team in scoring with 9-23=32 points with a team-leading 7-16=23 coming on the man advantage. This winter he already has a goal and an assist to pace all BSU defenders.

D-MEN ON THE SCOREBOARDS

Bemidji State's defensive corps recorded a goal and four assists in its two Midwest Regional games, giving BSU defensive players at least one point in 57 of the last 66 games. Averaging 2.19 points per game, the 2008-09 blueline corps is on pace for its most productive season since the 2003-04 defense pitched in 2.31 points per game.

During the 2007-08 campaign, BSU defensemen combined for 16- 48=63 points (1.75 ppg). BSU's blue liners accounted for five goals and 13 assists in the team's final 10 games.

READ MAKES IT BETTER

There is really no way to get around it, the Bemidji State men's hockey team is better when junior forward **Matt Read** is on the ice. Since stepping on campus in the fall of 2007 Read has a plus/minus rating of +31 and the Beavers are 18-5-1 when he scores a goal, which includes a 12-2-0 mark during the 2008-09 campaign.

KEEP 'EM UNDER TWO

The stingy Bemidji State defense finished the 2008-09 season allowing 2.58 goals per game. The Beavers led the CHA giving up 2.11 goals per game in league play. In 2008-09 when BSU allowed its opponents two-or-fewer goals per game, it was a perfect 15-0-0 and its already 1-0-0 this season.

BSU VERSUS THE NATIONALLY RANKED

Four of Bemidji State's 2009-08 opponents were ranked in the top 15 in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll, but the Beavers have yet to play a nationally-ranked team this fall.

Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 4-36-2 versus teams in the top-15.

GENERAL NOTES

WE'RE GOIN' STREAKIN'

Matt Read enters this weekend riding an nine-game scoring streak, reaching back to Mar. 6, 2009 and the CHA Tournament, and has assembled six multi-point efforts and 9-9=18 points during that span. He set a new college game high in the Beavers' last outing (Oct. 10) netting a pair of goals and two assists. for four points.

THEN THERE WERE SIX

Matt Climie, a 2008 graduate of Bemidji State and the Beavers' goaltender in the 2005 and 2006 National Tournament runs, was called up to join the Dallas Stars Friday April 4 and got his first NHL start Saturday. His 24 saves led the Stars to a 5-4 overtime victory over St. Louis.

Climie's trip to the NHL makes six products of the Beaver Hockey program to skate in the NHL ranks. He joins former BSU teammate **Andrew Murray** (2001-05) as the only former Beavers currently in the NHL.

PENALTY-KILL POWER

Successfully killing 168-of-198 (.848) opponent power-play opportunities during the 2007-08 season, the Beavers' penalty-kill unit was just a fraction of a percentage point from setting a new BSU Division I era mark for efficiency. The current mark of .868 was by the 2004-05 squad when it squashed 192-of-221 opponent opportunities. In 2008-09, BSU again chased the school mark killing 178-of-209 opponent power-play opportunities (.852), but negated 91-percent of its opponents power-plays in the team's final 13 contests (70-of-77) which included holding its Midwest Regional foes Cornell and Notre Dame scoreless on nine opportunities.

PUT IT IN THE BOOKS AFTER TWO

In 2008-09, when BSU took a lead into the third period, it was a perfect 14-0-0. The Team in 2-0 this season. Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 122-9-12 when leading after two periods of play.

TRIPLE 30s

BSU had three players with at least 30 points in Matt Read, Tyler Scofield and Brad Hunt for the first time since Andrew Murray, Brendan Cook and Luke Erickson in 2004-05. Read and Hunt are both back for the 2009-10 campaign and could shoulder a good portion of the scoring for the Beavers.

HUNT ASCENDS ROOKIE SCORING CHART

With 32 points in 2008-09, **Brad Hunt** surpassed Andrew Murray to move into a tie for the top spot on BSU's Division I era freshman scoring list. He sits atop the list with Riley Riddell (2001) and Luke Erickson (2003) who each had with 32 points as a rookie.

READ 2ND ON SOPHOMORE SCORING LIST

With 40 points **Matt Read** surpassed Luke Erickson (2003-07) for the top spot on BSU's sophomore scoring chart Erickson's former mark of 38 was set in 2003-04. Read's 40 points also matched Brendan Cook's BSU Division I-era scoring mark set in 2005.

HUNT SETS BSU "D" ASSIST STANDARD

With an assist in the Midwest Region Semifinal Mar. 28, **Brad Hunt** improved his BSU Division I-era record for single-season assists by a defenseman to 23.

BEMIDJI STATE HEAD COACH TOM SERRATORE

Bemidji State '87 / eighth season at BSU

- ▶ **Four-Time CHA Coach of the Year (2004, 2005, 2008, 2009)**

Conventional sports wisdom has long contended it is never wise to follow a legend. However, sporting a remarkable laundry-list of achievements after eight years as head coach at Bemidji State, it appears Tom Serratore is more than comfortable in the role.

The legacy Serratore was asked to continue upon accepting the role as Bemidji State's seventh head coach in 2001 is one of the finest in all of collegiate athletics. Serratore walks by the trophy case running the length of the John Glas Fieldhouse concourse on his way to practice each day, in full view of the 13 small-college national championship trophies enshrined therein, trophies won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters.

Serratore not only had the challenge of inheriting one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, he also was called to oversee its growth into a Division I program.

While Serratore will be the first to admit he'll not be able to replicate Peters' achievements, there can be little doubt the program is in the right hands.

BSU finished 4-26-4 in 2000-01, the year before Serratore took control of the program. He led BSU to a 12-18-5 record during his rookie campaign, and has increased BSU's win total each of the four years that followed. BSU finished 23-13-1 in 2004-05, giving the Beavers a school-record for wins in a Division I season and back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time as a Division I program. In 2008-09 Serratore led the Beavers through the regular season to post their fourth CHA championship in six years before their third CHA Tournament championship, the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament victory and a chance represent the university and the CHA in the Frozen Four for the first time.

Under Serratore's guidance, 23 BSU skaters have earned All-CHA honors, including two-time First-Team All-CHA picks Marty Goulet (2002-03), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Matt Climie (2006-07), Travis Winter (2006-07) and Cody Bostock (2007-08) with three Beavers earning CHA Rookie of the Year laurels. BSU has had multiple skaters named First-Team All-CHA six of the last seven seasons, including a school-record three first-teamers in 2003.

Academic excellence has been a staple of the BSU program under Serratore. The Beavers had a CHA-record 18 skaters named Academic All-CHA in 2008, and under Serratore's guidance have a league-high 116 Academic All-CHA picks over the last eight years. Niagara is second with 90 selections in the same span. In addition, BSU has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-District V selections under Serratore, including 2005 First-Team Academic All-America selection Peter Jonsson.

Serratore's achievements have not gone unnoticed. He is a four-time CHA Coach of the Year, winning the honor in 2004, 2005, 2008 and 2009 and in eight years as a collegiate head coach he has been named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the American Hockey Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year, five times including a runner-up finish in 2009.

Serratore took over the reigns as the seventh head coach at Bemidji State in 2001 after having spent the previous three seasons as the associate head coach for Peters.

BEMIDJI, Minn. -- Dan Bakala (So., G. Calgary, Alberta) turned away 20 shots and **Ian Lowe** (Jr., F. Bradwardine, Manitoba) scored the first game-winning goal of his collegiate career Friday as the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team opened the 2009-10 season with a 3-1 victory over the United State Air Force Academy at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse.

In a continuation of a series that has traditionally been all Bemidji State, the Beavers rebounded from a rare pair of road losses at the hands of the Falcons a year ago, with a commanding performance versus Air Force tonight. The Beavers held a 22-10 advantage in shots on goal through two periods and a 28-21 edge in the game as BSU improved to 24-8-2 all-time versus the Falcons and 15-1-2 versus USAFA at the Glas.

BSU dominated play, especially early, winning battles in the corners, earning face off victories and beating USAFA to loose pucks. Senior captain **Chris McKelvie** (New Brighton, Minn.) was the first to see the fruits of that steady hustle when he opened the scoring midway through the first period, one-timing a pass from **Jamie MacQueen** (So., F. St. Thomas, Ontario) into the back of the net. Linemate **Tyler Lehrke** (Sr., F. Park Rapids, Minn) was credited with his first assist of the season after starting the play with a pass out of a scrum on the boards.

Taking a 1-0 lead into the second period, the Beavers would stretch their lead to 2-0 as the 9:47 mark of the frame when newcomer **Jordan George** (Fr., F. Verona, Wis.) found Lowe streaking down the slot for a one-timer over the left shoulder of the Air Force goaltender Andrew Volkening. **Matt Read** (Jr., G. Ilderton, Ontario), BSU's leading-scorer in 2008-09, extended his scoring streak to seven games with an assist on the play.

Ryan Cramer (Jr., F. International Falls, Minn.) put the Beavers up 3-0 with just over five minutes to play netting his first goal since Feb. 15, 2009 to close out the BSU scoring effort.

Eric Artman would snap a wrist shot from between the circles past Bakala to get the Falcons on the board with 1:49 to play. The goal would spoil Bakala's run at a shutout, but it was too little, too late for Air Force as the Beavers protected their home ice and sent the electric following of 2,148 in attendance home with smiles on their faces and a win in their pocket.

The subplot of the Beavers-Falcons series is the sibling rivalry of the teams' head coaches. Younger brother **Tom Serratore** got the best of his older brother Frank, a 1982 graduate of Bemidji State and former goaltender for the Beavers, for the 19th time in 24 career meetings (19-3-1) and for the first time since USAFA left College Hockey America for Atlantic Hockey following the 2006-07 campaign.

BEMIDJI, Minn. -- Matt Read (Jr., F. Ilderton, Ontario) recorded a career-high four points as the Bemidji State men's ice hockey team completed the series sweep over the United State Air Force Academy, 7-3.

The Beavers jumped out to a 4-1 lead after just 12:24 in the fast-paced, heated battle between the former College Hockey America foes, and would hold the pedal to the floor to post seven goals for the first time since a 7-5 triumph over Wayne State Feb. 29, 2008.

A smorgasbord of goal scoring, the match up featured even-strength, power-play, short-handed and unassisted goals. In all 10 Beavers got in on the scoring. In addition to Read's career night, **Aaron McLeod** (Fr., F. Ottawa, Ontario), **Brady Wacker** (Fr., D. Jansen, Saskatchewan) and **Jordan George** (Fr., F. Verona, Wis.) each registered their first collegiate goal in the victory.

Ryan Cramer (Jr., F. International Falls, Minn.) got the scoring started 4:13 into the game on passes from **Shea Walters** (So., F. Hibbing, Minn.) and **Ben Kinne** (So., F. St. Paul, Minn.). The goal, already the second of the junior's season, matched his total from the 2008-09 campaign. But the BSU lead would be short-lived. Just 21-seconds later, AFA's Jacques Lamoureux evened the score at 1-1.

Twenty-four hours removed from a contest during which the BSU defensive pairings were held without a single point, a pair of blueliners put the Beavers in front for good. Wacker netted his first lamplighter in the green and white at the seven-minute-mark on a seeing-eye bullet from the point with help from **Tyler Lehrke** (Sr., F. Park Rapids, Minn.) and **Chris Peluso** (Sr., Wadena, Minn.). **Brad Hunt** (So., D. Ridge Meadows, British Columbia) recorded his first point in the waning moments of the Beavers' second power-play opportunity, marking BSU's first special teams goal of the season. Read picked up his first assist of the night on the play.

The first goal of Read's junior campaign came 1:06 later when the Falcons' goaltender, Andrew Volkening, misplayed the puck and left the Beavers' leading scorer with an open net for his fourth career short-handed goal.

Air Force was the first to strike in the second stanza. Jeff Hajner took advantage of a five-minute major penalty that sent Walters to the showers early, for his first marker of the season just 46 seconds in to the power-play opportunity, effectively cutting the Beavers lead in half, 4-2.

It was Read again who stretched the BSU advantage to three goals midway through the period. The junior benefited from a battle in front of the AFA bench won by Cramer. The International Falls, Minn. native swept the puck up the boards into the neutral zone, where Read picked it up, skated it into the zone and beat Volkening for the second time of the night.

The BSU lead would swell to four goals, 6-2, at the 12-minute mark when George, who was positioned on the left post, stuffed a Hunt rebound past the Falcon goaltender on the power play, ending Volkening's night after 32:12 of play.

AFA would add a third goal in the opening minute of the final frame, but McLeod, in just his second collegiate game, would pick off an errant pass on the Falcons' blue line and register an unassisted goal to seal the Beavers' non-conference win.

Dan Bakala (So., G. Calgary, Alberta) turned away 21 AFA shots and allowed three goals en route to his second collegiate win in as many nights.
