FINAL FACE-OFF Preview

- Bemidji State will make its first-ever appearance in a WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF after knocking off the third seeded St. Cloud State Huskies two games to one in a best-of-three playoff series the weekend of Feb. 26-28.
- Previously the Beavers never tasted playoff success posting a 0-13 postseason record when they headed down to St. Cloud for the first-round playoffs. They extended that record to 0-14 after dropping Friday's contest 3-0. However, BSU bounced back winning the next two games to earn a trip to the FINAL FACE-OFF.
- BSU is one of four teams still alive in the hunt for the WCHA tournament championship along with an automatic bid to the NCAA Division 1 Women's Ice Hockey National Championship.
- Bemidji State will play Minnesota Duluth in the semifinals on Saturday March 6 at 12:07 p.m. at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis. The winner will advance on to the championship game, Sunday March 7 at 12:07 p.m., playing the winner of the Minnesota vs. Ohio State game.
- For the first time, the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF will feature two teams that finished lower than fourth place in the final conference standings, No. 5 Ohio State and No. 6 Bemidji State.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his fourth season at Bemidji State. In his first season Sertich led the Beavers to an 11-20-5 overall record and a 9-15-4 record in Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) play, good for a sixth-place finish. The 22 points he garnered during that first year was the most points Bemidji State has earned in conference play in its nine-year Division I era. He also led the Beavers to

its second win over the University of Minnesota in school history with a 2-0 shutout that was televised on Fox Sports Net North. Bemidji State compiled a six-game unbeaten streak, the longest unbeaten streak for the Beavers since the 2001-02 season.

Last year, coach Sertich compiled a 4-29-3 record and a 1-25-2 mark in the WCHA. The team recorded another shutout over a powerhouse, when the Beavers tied the then No. 2-ranked University of Wisconsin Badgers. This was the highest-ranked opponent to ever be shut out by a BSU squad.

Sertich came to Bemidji State University after spending 13 years as the head varsity coach at Roseville Area High School. He coached the Roseville boys' team from 1993-2003, leading it to a 156-71-11 record and two Minnesota State tournament appearances. Under Sertich's guidance, Roseville finished third in the 2002 tournament and second in 2003. He led Roseville to Suburban East Conference Championships in 2002 and 2003. Sertich earned four Coach of the Year honors, as he was named Section 3AA boys' Coach of the Year in 1999, Section 2AA Boys' Coach of the Year in both 2002 and 2003, and Class AA Coach of the Year in 2003.

In 2003, Sertich moved to head coach of the Roseville girls' varsity team and in three seasons led the program to a record of 62-21-2. The Roseville girls finished fourth in the 2006 state tournament and captured Suburban East Conference titles in both '04 and '05. Sertich was named the 2004 Section 2AA Girls' Coach of the Year. Sertich began his coaching career in 1976 as the head boys' varsity coach at Northfield (Minn.) High School, and over the next 20 years he would hold a variety of head and assistant coaching positions at the high school, college and national levels.

Sertich began his playing career with the Colorado College Tigers in 1970 and assembled a standout four-year career.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75, and played on a team which trained in Bemidji. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Looking at the teams

MINNESOTA DULUTH

- No. 2 UMD, unbeaten in 16 of its last 17 games, swept North Dakota last weekend to advance to the WCHA's FINAL FACE-OFF.
- The Bulldogs, who have advanced to the second round of the WCHA tournament every season since the best-of-three series format was introduced in 2006, defeated North Dakota on Friday 6-2 in the Heritage Center, energized by four goals from senior forward and Patty Kazmaier Top-10 candidate Emmanuelle Blais. In all, nine players picked up a point Friday, including three assists from blueliner Jaime Rasmussen and two assists for both senior defenseman Sarah Murray and rookie forward Jessica Wong. Senior forward Saara Tuominen netted a goal and an assist just 24 hours after helping Team Finland capture its first bronze medal since 1998.
- Blais is now No. 7 in points per game in the NCAA with a 1.47 average with 53 points in 36 skates. She ranks sixth in goals (26), 12th in assists (27), fourth in power-play goals (9), and No. 2 in game-winning goals with (8).
- Goaltender Jennifer Harss owns the fifth-best winning percentage with a .733 and has made a Bulldog-record 1002 saves in 34 skates.
- UMD has the fourth-highest scoring offense, averaging 3.33 goals a game.
- The Bulldogs will face Bemidji State, a team they were 3-0-1 in four games this season and have never faced in the semifinals of the WCHA playoffs.
- The Beavers are the only team in the league that UMD remains unbeaten against all-time, with an overall record of 46-0-2.

MINNESOTA

- The No. 3 Gophers will compete at the 2010 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF Championships, this weekend at Ridder Arena. The No. 2 seed Golden Gophers (24- 7-5) will play No. 5 Ohio State at 3 p.m., Saturday while the first game will have No. 1 seed Minnesota Duluth and the No. 6 seed Bemidji State at noon. The winner of each semifinal game will advance to the WCHA championship game on Sunday at noon.
- Minnesota and Minnesota State competed in its longest game in school history on Saturday when the teams were on the ice for 101:16 as the game was decided in three hours and 47 minutes. The game started at 4:07 p.m. and ended at 7:54 p.m. Emily West scored the game-winning goal at 1:16 in the third overtime to send the Gophers to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF this weekend.
- During the first round of the WCHA playoffs, Minnesota had 15 players earn a point. Anne Schleper led the Gophers with six assists, while Becky Kortum and Laura May each had three points.
- Noora Raty also tallied a point in the win to become the leader in points by a goaltender in a season (3).
- Minnesota will look to add its fourth playoff championship in school history this weekend. The Golden Gophers won their first in 2002, defeating Wisconsin by a score of 3-2. The Gophers added their second and third title in back-to-back years in 2004 and 2005. Since the Gophers have hosted the conference championships, Minnesota has finished as the champion or runner-up in the previous five years.
- The Gophers hold an 8-2-2 record against Minnesota Duluth, Ohio State and Bemidji State this season.

OHIO STATE

- It took two overtimes, but fifth-seed Ohio State swept fourth-seed Wisconsin in the WCHA First Round Playoffs, Feb. 26-27 at the Eagle's Nest Arena in Verona, Wis. The Buckeyes won 3-2 the first game and 4-3 the second game.
- The fifth-seeded Buckeyes became just the second team to upset a higher-seeded team in the five-year history of the WCHA hosting the best-of-three playoff series. Bemidji State then pulled the third upset Sunday with a victory over St. Cloud State to win the series, 2-1.
- Ohio State advances to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF semifinal game for the first time since 2007.

- OSU only had three goal-scorers in the series, with sophomore Natalie Spooner scoring all three goals for the hat trick Friday and freshman Hokey Langan tallying a hat trick in regulation last Saturday. Senior co-captain Raelyn LaRocque scored the OT winner in game two.
- Rookie goaltender Chelsea Knapp had a stellar performance in net last Friday with 31 saves, then come up with some big stops in a 20-save game Saturday.
- Freshman forward Minttu Tuominen traveled from Vancouver, where she won a bronze medal while playing for Team Finland.
- The Buckeyes played in their ninth and 10th overtime games of the season, tying their record for OT games set twice before. They are 3-2-5 in extra session games this year. Five of Ohio State's 10 overtime games were played in February.
- OSU defeated the Badgers four times this season (4-2-0). The team had just three total wins over UW in the previous 10 seasons.
- The Buckeyes are 9-5-4 on the road this season.
- The hat tricks were the second in the careers of both Spooner and Langan. Their first hat tricks both came in four-goal games – Spooner in December 2008 and Langan in January 2010. Langan upped her point total of 51, the second-highest season point total in Buckeye history. She trails only Ohio State's all-time leading scorer Jana Harrigan, who had 54 in the 2004-05 season.
- The Buckeyes next face Minnesota at 3 p.m. Saturday in the second semifinal game of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF. Ohio State was 0-4-0 against the Gophers this season. Spooner led the team with four points (1g, 3a) and Kelly Wild was the only Buckeye with multiple goals against them with two.

Last Time Out

- Last time out BSU won its first-ever playoff series, beating St. Cloud State two games to one in a best-of-three series.
- Bemidji State dropped the first contest on Friday night 3-0 to the Huskies.
- On Saturday BSU won its first-ever playoff victory overcoming a 1-0 deficit with a second period goal from right winger **Annie Bauerfeld** and a third period game-winner from right winger **Jamie Hatheway** to gain a 2-1 win. The Huskies took a 1-0 lead late in the first period when left winger Felicia Nelson scored at 19:44 before Bauerfeld tied it for the Beavers with her late second period tally at 19:24. Hatheway's winner came at 5:46 of period three. In nets, **Zuzana Tomcikova** had 20 stops for BSU and the win while Ashley Nixon had 30 saves for the Huskies.
- BSU became the fourth team to qualify for the championship on Sunday, Feb. 28, night when they defeated SCSU, 4-1, to claim the first round, best-of-three WCHA playoff series two games to one. The Beavers received a goal and assist each from **Annie Bauerfeld, Erin Cody** and **Erin Johnson** along with 27 saves from goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova**.

Lamp Lighter

- **Erin Cody** has been averaging just under 1.00 goal/game and 1.00 points/game in her last 21 games. In those games she has netted 15 goals and tallied seven helpers.
- She has tallied two-thirds of her season goals in the past 21 games.
- In those past 21 games she has recorded 21 points. (2 goals at North Dakota on Dec. 5; 2 goals vs. North Dakota on Dec. 6; 1 goal at Minnesota Duluth on Dec. 12; 1 goal and 1 assist at Minnesota Duluth on Dec. 13; 1 assist vs Minnesota State on Jan. 9; 1 goal vs Minnesota State on Jan. 8; 1 goal vs Minnesota on Jan. 16; 2 goals at Ohio State on Jan. 22; 1 assist at Ohio State on Jan. 23; 1 goal and 1 assist at St. Cloud State on Jan. 29; 1 goal at St. Cloud State on Jan. 30; 1 goal at Wisconsin on Feb. 7; 1 goal and 1 assist on Feb. 19 vs Minnesota Duluth; 1 goal and 1 assist on Feb. 28 at St. Cloud State).

Slovakian Sensation

- After a stellar freshman campaign Beaver goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** has made an even better sophomore debut this season gathering 781 saves on 829 shots. She currently has a .942 save percentage on the season while recording a 1.90 goals against average.
- Tomcikova returned from the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver where she played in all five games for the Slovakian National Women's Ice Hockey Team. In those five games she faced 235 shots on goal, more than any other goaltender, male or female, in the 2010 Winter Games.
- She has also been nominated for the 2010 Patty Kazmaier Award. An award of The USA Hockey Foundation that recognizes the accomplishments of the most outstanding player in NCAA Division I women's ice hockey each season.
- She recorded her eighth-career shutout on Jan. 23 at Ohio State stopping 38 shots.
- In her seventh-career shutout Tomcikova made 37 saves, 30 of which came in the first two periods against Minnesota State at home on Jan. 9, 2009.
- Posting her sixth-career shutout, Tomcikova turned away 26 shots, including eight on the PK, to help lift the Beavers 3-0 over North Dakota.
- Stopping 28 shots on Nov. 13, 2009 against St. Cloud State at home, Tomcikova earned her fifth-career shutout and her second on the year.
- In the second shoot out of the season for the Beavers, Tomcikova stopped 11 of 13 shooters to help BSU claim the extra point from the shootout win against Minnesota State on Nov. 6, 2009.
- Her shutout against Wisconsin on Oct. 10, 2009 was the second time Bemidji State has recorded a shutout against the Badgers.
- She was named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the week of Oct.14-20. She now has a total of four defensive player of the week awards after garnering three in a row last year.

- Her success on the ice last year didn't go unnoticed as she was the first player in WCHA history to be honored with Defensive Player of the Week three times in a row (Dec. 10 - Jan. 7).
- She was also named to the 2008-09 All-WCHA Rookie Team and 2008-09 All-WCHA Second Team, which was the highest individual award won by a BSU women's hockey player.

Tremendous Trio

- **Erin Cody** (19G, 13A), **Erin Johnson** (11G, 7A), and **Annie Bauerfeld** (9G, 18A) have accounted for 46 percent of the offensive production so far this season for the Beavers.
- Six of Johnson's goals have come on the power play.
- Six of the ten game-winning goals have come from the trio, four from Johnson (Oct. 30 vs. Wayne State, Nov. 7 vs. Minnesota State, Dec. 5 vs. North Dakota, & Jan. 9 vs. Minnesota State), one from Bauerfeld (Oct. 16 vs. Wisconsin), and one from Cody (Dec. 6 vs. North Dakota).

- Sacrificing their bodies, the BSU defense has blocked 753 shots so far this season; including 51 blocked shots in the weekend against Minnesota Duluth (Dec. 12-13), 50 blocked shots in the Jan. 15-16 weekend against Minnesota and 49 blocked shots in the playoff-weekend against St. Cloud State (Feb. 26-28).
- Sisters and defensive linemates **Erika Wheelhouse** and **Marlee Wheelhouse** recorded a total of 32 blocks over the weekends against Wisconsin and Ohio State. Including a total of 15 blocked shots in the 1-0 shutout against the Badgers.
- Erika was recognized by the WCHA for her efforts in the Jan. 8-9 weekend against Minnesota State being named Rookie of the Week. Wheelhouse contributed two assists, blocked nine shots and helped Bemidji State blank the Mavericks on all nine of their power-play chances in the two-game series.

Freshmen Contributions

- **Erika Wheelhouse** is leading all freshmen at BSU in scoring with 13 points (0G, 13A).
- In second place among freshmen with nine points is **Sadie Lundquist** (2G, 8A). **MacKenzie Thurston** has two goals while **Keirstin Visser** has three goals and an assist on the season.
- **Jamie Hatheway** recorded her first goal on Feb. 6 at the outdoor game against the Badgers in Madison, Wis. Her second goal was the game winner at St. Cloud State to help give BSU its first-ever playoff victory.

Clutch in Overtime

- Bemidji State is currently unbeaten in games that enter into overtime (1-0-7).

Shootout Veterans

- BSU has won three of the six shootouts that it has entered in the 2009-10 campaign lending to the success in the standings that the Beavers have experienced this season.
- Bemidji State is first in the league for having competed in the most rounds of a shootout with 36. Minnesota State has the second-most with 27.

Sharing the Wealth

- The Beavers have 17 players who have recorded points so far this season.
- The 17 players have combined to score 167 points for BSU.

Squeaky clean

- While playing in every game so far this season, senior captain **Franny Dorr** has only earned five trips to the penalty box.
- Dorr is fourth on the team in scoring, with fourth goals and ten assists.
- In 133 games, she has only compiled 36 penalties for 73 PIMs, roughly averaging one penalty in every four games.

Empty Box

- The Nov. 13, 2009 game against St. Cloud State was the first game BSU has ever gone 60 minutes without being called for a penalty.
- There was only one penalty called during the game and technically no player on the ice was assessed. The lone infraction was on St. Cloud State for too many players on the ice.

- **Alana McElhinney** became the fourth goalie in BSU women's hockey history to record a point when notching an assist on Jan. 29 at St. Cloud State. Past tenders on the score sheet include Jill Luebke (2A), Janet Hicks (1A) and Bre Dedrickson (1A).

Breakin' Records

- Bemidji State took part in the Culver's Camp Randall Hockey Class outdoor game against the Wisconsin Badgers on Feb. 6, 2010. The game broke the single-game attendance record for a NCAA women's hockey game, drawing 8,263 fans. The previous record was set at 6,889 on Jan. 8, 2010 between Northeastern University and the University of New Hampshire in an outdoor game at Fenway Park in Boston, Mass.
