Weekend preview

- The Beavers will travel down to Minneapolis this weekend for a pair of games against the No. 2 Minnesota Golden Gophers.
- This will be the second time this season the Beavers will play a team ranked second in the nation, the first time being then No. 2 Mercyhurst on Oct. 2-3.
- Looking to close out November with a winning record, Bemidji State will need to at least split the weekend with Minnesota.
- After the weekend BSU will take some time off for Thanksgiving break, before returning to the ice on Dec. 5, against the University of North Dakota.
- Last weekend out BSU split against St. Cloud State at home picking up its fourth win of the season on Friday night 1-0, while dropping Saturday's game 5-2.
- The defense shined on Friday as BSU sophomore tender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Bratislava, Slovakia) turned away 28 shots to post her fifth-career shutout. BSU was unselfish blocking 22 shots to help keep the shutout.
- On Saturday the Huskies would spoil the Beavers' chance for a weekend sweep scoring two power play-goals and two short-handed goals to win 5-2.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his fourth season at Bemidji State. In his first season Sertich led the Beavers to an 11-20-5 overall record and a 9-15-4 record in Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) play, good for a sixth-place finish. The 22 points he garnered during that first year was the most points Bemidji State has earned in conference play in its nine-year Division I era. He also led the Beavers to

its second win over the University of Minnesota in school history with a 2-0 shutout that was televised on Fox Sports Net North. Bemidji State compiled a six-game unbeaten streak, the longest unbeaten streak for the Beavers since the 2001-02 season.

Last year, coach Sertich compiled a 4-29-3 record and a 1-25-2 mark in the WCHA. The team recorded another shutout over a powerhouse, when the Beavers tied the then No. 2-ranked University of Wisconsin Badgers. This was the highest-ranked opponent to ever be shut out by a BSU squad.

Sertich came to Bemidji State University after spending 13 years as the head varsity coach at Roseville Area High School. He coached the Roseville boys' team from 1993-2003, leading it to a 156-71-11 record and two Minnesota State tournament appearances. Under Sertich's guidance, Roseville finished third in the 2002 tournament and second in 2003. He led Roseville to Suburban East Conference Championships in 2002 and 2003. Sertich earned four Coach of the Year honors, as he was named Section 3AA boys' Coach of the Year in 1999, Section 2AA Boys' Coach of the Year in both 2002 and 2003, and Class AA Coach of the Year in 2003.

In 2003, Sertich moved to head coach of the Roseville girls' varsity team and in three seasons led the program to a record of 62-21-2. The Roseville girls finished fourth in the 2006 state tournament and captured Suburban East Conference titles in both '04 and '05. Sertich was named the 2004 Section 2AA Girls' Coach of the Year. Sertich began his coaching career in 1976 as the head boys' varsity coach at Northfield (Minn.) High School, and over the next 20 years he would hold a variety of head and assistant coaching positions at the high school, college and national levels.

Sertich began his playing career with the Colorado College Tigers in 1970 and assembled a standout four-year career.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75, and played on a team which trained in Bemidji. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Scouting Minnesota

- After a week off from competition, No. 2 Minnesota earned four points at Minnesota State in the conference standings, winning 4-1 last Friday and followed with a come-from-behind tie and a shootout win Saturday. Minnesota holds a two-point lead with 16 points over Minnesota Duluth, who is second with 14 points.
- Minnesota scored three goals in the second and one in the third for a 4-1 win last Friday (Nov. 13). Minnesota received goals from four different players – Kelli Blankenship, Anne Schleper, Emily West and Sarah Erickson. Noora Rätty had 29 saves in the game for her sixth win this season. In all, seven players tallied a point in the win. Minnesota was 2-for-8 on the power-play and had 37 shots. Brittany Francis tallied two assists. Her first assist marked her 100th career point. She is the 16th Golden Gopher to earn 100 points.
- In last Saturday's game, Schleper and Rätty led the Gophers to a 1-1 tie over MSU and a shootout win. Schleper was the only Gopher to find the back of the net when she scored a power-play, game-tying goal at 11:31 in the third. After tying the game and forcing it into overtime, Schleper scored the only goal of the shootout in the fourth round. It was her first attempt in a shootout for the Maroon and Gold. Rätty allowed one goal, which came on a breakaway at 5:09 in the first and did not allow a goal for the remainder of the game. She also held the Mavericks scoreless in the shootout, which went to four rounds.
- Leading the Gophers in scoring so far this season is West, who has 17 points, followed by linemate Erickson with 14 and Schleper and Chelsey Jones with 10 points.

Series against Minnesota

- Minnesota has been one of the most successful teams against Bemidji State, going 41-2-3 against the Beavers.
- The two wins the Beavers have over Minnesota came on Feb. 9, 2007 (2-0) and on Jan. 7, 2006 (2-1). Both wins came at Ridder Arena.
- In the last 12 games the Gophers have held the Beavers to 1 goal or less.

Tremendous Trio

- **Erin Cody** (For., Roseville, Minn.) (3G, 5A), **Erin Johnson** (For., Farmington, Minn.) (7G, 3A), and **Annie Bauerfeld** (For., Woodbury, Minn.) (2G, 6A) have accounted for 43 percent of the offensive production so far this season for the Beavers.
- Five of Johnson's goals have come on the power play.
- Three game-winning goals have come from the trio, two from Johnson (vs. Mercyhurst, Oct. 30 & vs. Minnesota State, Nov. 7) and one from Bauerfeld (vs Wisconsin, Oct. 16).

Slovakian Sensation

- After a stellar freshman campaign Beaver goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (So, Bratislava, Slovakia) has made an even better sophomore debut this season gathering 295 saves on 317 shots. She currently has a .931 save percentage on the season while recording a 2.20 goals against average.
- Stopping 28 shots on Nov. 13, 2009 against St. Cloud State at home, Tomcikova earned her fifth-career shutout and her second on the year.
- In the second shootout of the season for the Beavers, Tomcikova stopped 11 of 13 shooters to help BSU claim the extra point from the shootout win against Minnesota State on Nov. 6, 2009.
- Her shutout against Wisconsin on Oct. 10, 2009 was the second time Bemidji State has recorded a shutout against the Badgers.
- She was named *WCHA Defensive Player of the Week* for the week of Oct.14-20. She now has a total of four defensive player of the week awards after garnering three in a

- Tomcikova will be playing for the Slovakian National Women's Hockey Team in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver.
- Her success on the ice last year didn't go unnoticed as she was the first player in WCHA history to be honored with Defensive Player of the Week three times in a row (Dec. 10 - Jan. 7).
- She was also named to the 2008-09 All-WCHA Rookie Team and 2008-09 All-WCHA Second Team, which was the highest individual award won by a BSU women's hockey player.

D-Line Express

- **Jackie Robertson** (Def., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) returns for her senior season as one of the team captains. Robertson anchors the blue line this season as the oldest and most experienced member of the D-line.
- Robertson's physical game makes it tough for opposing players to beat her on the rush. Her intimidating style of play helps bog down opposing breakouts and creates turnovers for the Beavers.
- Sacrificing their bodies, the BSU defense has blocked 233 shots so far this season.
- Sisters and defensive linemates **Erika Wheelhouse** (Fr., Crookston, Minn.) and **Marlee Wheelhouse** (So., Crookston, Minn.) recorded a total of 32 blocks over the weekends against Wisconsin and Ohio State. Including a total of 15 blocked shots in the 1-0 shutout against the Badgers.
- Erika Wheelhouse has also notched five assists so far this season, which leads all defenders.

Sharing the Wealth

- The Beavers have 14 players who have recorded points so far this season.
- The 14 players have combined to score 60 points for BSU.

Squeaky clean

- While playing in every game so far this season, senior captain **Franny Dorr** (Roseville, Minn.) has yet to earn a trip to the penalty box.
- Dorr is fifth on the team in scoring, with three goals and two assists.
- In 115 games, she has only compiled 29 penalties for 58 PIMs, roughly averaging one penalty for every four.

Empty Box

- The Nov. 13, 2009 game against St. Cloud State was the first game BSU has ever gone 60 minutes without being called for a penalty.
- There was only one penalty called during the game and technically no player on the ice was assessed. The lone infraction was on St. Cloud State for too many players on the ice.
