### PLAYER TO WATCH



Senior forward **Ian Lowe** has had a tremendous amount of success against the WCHA during his career, in particular versus the Bulldogs. In 16 games against WCHA competition since the beginning of the 2008-09 season, Lowe has piled up 5-8=13 points with four goals and three assists (4-3=7) coming in four games versus Minnesota Duluth.

## THE MATCH UP

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team returns to action this weekend as it hosts No. 3 University of Minnesota Duluth in a Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) two-game series at the Sanford Center.

The Beavers, 0-2-0 overall and 0-2-0 versus the WCHA, open the series with long-time regional rival Minnesota Duluth in search of their inaugural victory as members of the WCHA and win number one in their new digs. After being swept by then-No. 2 University of North Dakota, 5-2 and 5-2, to open the 2010-11 campaign (Oct. 15-16), the Beavers have now lost three straight, reaching back to 2009-10, and are winless in their last six outings (0-4-2). Under Serratore, BSU has been held without a win in seven straight games just once—a streak of 14 games stretching from Feb. 9, 2002 to Nov. 2, 2002 (0-8-6).

Minnesota Duluth comes into the weekend series as the hottest team in the country. Owners of a 5-0-1 record and a 2-0-0 mark to share a lead in the WCHA standings, no NCAA Division I team has more wins. The Bulldogs' unblemished record through six games stands as its best start to a season since a 2003-04 campaign which ended in a trip to the Frozen Four.

## THE RIVALRY

One of the Beavers' most consistent Division-I opponents, the 2010-11 season marks the 12th consecutive campaign BSU has clashed with Minnesota Duluth—playing the Bulldogs in each season since making the jump to the major college hockey (1999-2000). Although UMD holds a 18-9-0 record in the all-time series, BSU is 7-3-0 in the last 10 meetings, has won the last three contests in Bemidji and swept the series last winter.

The teams first met Feb. 8, 1948—in just the 13th game of the BSU hockey program's existence. The Bulldogs pulled out a 4-3 win in Duluth that day and would go on to gain victories in the next 10 meetings. Dec. 6, 2002, Bemidji State put an end to the Bulldogs' 54-year streak in the series with a 3-2 overtime triumph at the DECC.

In 2003, the regional foes added a new wrinkle to the rivalry. A traveling trophy resembling Babe the Blue Ox was introduced and awarded to the winner of the second game of the series. The traveling trophy is back on the line this weekend as the Beavers attempt to retain control after a 5-4 overtime victory Jan. 23, 2010.

## THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2010-11 season represents the 12th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 55th year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sport.

- ▶ BSU owns 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- ▶ The Beavers have captured 21 conference titles in 54 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- ▶ In 2009, BSU became the first No. 16 seed to ever earn a spot in the Frozen Four. In just its 10th year at the NCAA Division I level, only one team, the 1958 Denver Pioneers, found its way to college hockey's grandest stage faster.
- ▶ BSU has developed six NHL players, six Olympians and 82 All-America honorees.
- ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 966-470-86 (.663) in 1,522 games.

## GENERAL NOTES

### THE COACHES

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State '86) is in his 10th season as an overall record of 163-130-33 (.554) as BSU's head coach. In addition to directing the Beavers to seven consecutive seasons of at least .500 hockey, Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular-season championships five times since 2003-04 and made trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2010, with a 2009 appearance in the Frozen Four. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year recipient and was *Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year Runner-up* in 2009.

► Now in his 10th season, **Scott Sandelin** has led the Bulldogs to a 172-190-47 overall record. The Hibbing, Minn. native has thrust UMD into a position of conference and national prominence directing the Bulldogs to appearances in four of the last eight WCHA Final Five Tournaments, a trip to the 2004 NCAA Frozen Four and within a game of repeating in 2009. Sandelin previously served as an assistant at University of North Dakota where he helped lead the Fighting Sioux to a pair of NCAA titles (1997 and 2000) and three WCHA crowns (1997-2000). Prior to joining the coaching ranks, he posted a four-year playing career at North Dakota before embarking on a seven-year professional career.

### THE WCHA PREDICTIONS ARE IN...

Entering its inaugural season in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA), the Beavers garnered 46 points to finish ninth in the 40th Annual Grand Forks Herald Coaches' Poll. League coaches forecast University of North Dakota as the preseason favorite casting 10 first-place votes for the Fighting Sioux (120), which held a 15-point edge over St. Cloud State University (105), despite the Huskies collecting two first-place votes. University of Minnesota Duluth rounded out the top three with 100 points.

### ALL-AMERICA BOOKENDS

**Matt Read** became Bemidji State's 82nd All-America selection in the history of the program and second since the team made the move to the NCAA Division I ranks 12 years ago, when he was named RBK Second-Team All-America by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, following a junior season in which he scored 19-22=41 points. This season, BSU again gained national attention when defender **Brad Hunt** was selected to the USCHO.com Preseason All-America Second Team.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Matt Read** (Ilderton, Ontario) captains the Beavers during the 2010-11 campaign. Senior defenseman **Ryan Adams** (Brandon, Manitoba) and senior forward **Ian Lowe** (Bradwardine, Manitoba) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as alternate captains.

### LOOKING FOR NO. 1

The 2010-11 season marks the Beavers' first in their new home--Sanford Center. With any new building, there is a first time for everything. Junior forward **Jamie MacQueen** potted the first goal 1:52 into the Beavers' Oct. 15 games versus North Dakota. Senior **Ryan Cramer** recorded the first assist and was the first to sent to penalty box (at the 6:29 mark of the same game), but BSU enters its second home series in search of the most important first--its first win in its new hockey facility.

### SPENDING EXTRA TIME WITH THE BULLDOGS

In the 27 games the Beavers and Bulldogs have met since the series got its start Feb. 8, 1948, three have needed an overtime period to decide the victor. In each of the previous three overtime games, Bemidji State has eared a victory in the extra period, which includes a 5-4 overtime thriller the last time these teams met, Jan. 23, 2010.

### LAST TIME...

The Last time these teams met dates back to Jan. 22 and 23 of last season. The Beavers opened the home-and-home series with a 4-1 victory at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse. **Ian Lowe** led the team posting a pair of goals, while adding an assist on the game-winner. The Beavers added a come-from-behind victory Saturday to complete the sweep over UMD. BSU recorded three third period goals at the DECC including one from **Ben Kinne** to tie the game (4-4) with just :02 left on the clock. **Jordan George** added the game-winning goal :36 into the overtime period.

### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

BSU's 2010-11 move to the WCHA marks the fourth league home for the program. The Beavers entered 2010-11 with a perfect 3-0-0 mark in their league debuts, but dropped its WCHA opener, 5-2, North Dakota. As charter members of the ICHA, the Beavers defeated Lake Superior State, 3-1, Dec. 3, 1966. In its first season in the NCHA, BSU topped Wisconsin-Superior, 9-3, Dec. 10, 1980 and when the team moved to the CHA in 1999, BSU was victorious over Army Oct. 15, 5-2. The Beavers finished each of their previous inaugural league campaigns with a record of at least .500.

### PLAYING CLOSE TO HOME

Six of the 27 players on the Beavers' 2010-11 roster hail from the state of Minnesota. **Ryan Cramer** and **Drew Fisher** call International Falls their hometown, **Shea Walters** is from Hibbing and **Ben Kinne**, from St. Paul, and **Matt Hartmann**, who calls Hugo home, are from the Twin Cities-metro area. Newcomer Sam Rendle played his high school hockey just 90 miles down Highway 2 in Grand Rapids.

### CONSISTENT SCORERS

Five BSU players are averaging a point per game this season, while four have posted at least a point in each game of the 2010-11 campaign. Sophomore **Jordan George** paces the group after posting a goal in each game of the season-opening series versus North Dakota.

## GENERAL NOTES

### FAMILIAR LOOK

**Tom Serratore** returns 22 letterwinners from a year ago including 2010 RBK Second-Team All-America pick **Matt Read**. BSU returners enter 2010-11 seasoned after carrying the bulk of the scoring load a year ago. Led by Read, **Jordan George**, **Brad Hunt** and **Ian Lowe**, who finished as Bemidji State's top four scorers, BSU returns 86 percent of its goals (110-of-118), 82 percent of its assists (156-of-191) and 83 percent of its scoring (266-of-319 points).

### TOP-OF-THE-LINE

Last season, the line of **Jordan George**, **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe** solidified itself as the Beavers' most potent line producing one-third of BSU total point production accounting for 53 goals and 53 assists for 106 points. Through two games, 2010-11 looks to be no different. George leads the team with two goals, while Read and Lowe are tied with the sophomore for the team's scoring lead (two points).

### THE WCHA LOWE-DOWN

No BSU player has experienced more success versus teams hailing from the WCHA than senior forward **Ian Lowe**. Since the beginning of the 2008-09 season, Lowe has accumulated 5-8=13 points in 16 games. Last season alone, Lowe posted 4-3=7 points in six games versus WCHA squads. He finished those games with a +6 plus/minus rating.

### BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 966 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 984 victories. Sixteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2010-11 BSU foe Minnesota which leads Division I with 1,577 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,500 or more all-time wins, while Boston College is second with 1,406 victories.

### KEEP 'EM UNDER TWO

In 2009-10 when BSU allowed its opponents two-or-fewer goals, it was 19-1-2. BSU finished the 37-game season, ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing a meager 2.35 goals per game, while giving up 2.22 in 18 CHA contests.

### THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In 2009-10, three goals was a threshold for Bemidji State. BSU was 20-2-2 when posting at least three goals and 4-9-2 when allowing its rivals three or more. Already this season, The Beavers are 0-2-0 when allowing more than two goals.

### THE EARLY GOAL GETS THE WIN

Of the Beavers' 37 contests during the 2009-10 campaign, the team to score first won 27 times. BSU's opponents won 6-of-9 (6-2-1) of the games they were first to light the lamp while BSU was unbeaten in 23-of-27 (21-4-2) occasions it was first on the scoreboard. In 2010-11, BSU is 0-1-0 when scoring first and its opponents are 1-0-0.

### CLIMBING BSU'S DIVISION I ASSISTS LIST

**Brad Hunt** has accumulated 51 assists during his first 76 games or two seasons as a Beaver. He currently sits tied with Jeff McGill for ninth on BSU's Division I-era assists list. He enters this weekend needing two assists to match the trio of Riley Riddell (2001-04), Rob Sirriani (2003-07) and Marty Goulet (1999-03) for sixth on the list.

### BSU VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

This weekend's opponent, Minnesota Duluth, comes in ranked No. 3, according to the most recent USAToday/USA Hockey Magazine poll marking, the second consecutive series in which the Beavers have faced one of the nation's top three teams. Oct. 15-16, BSU faced No. 2 North Dakota. Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 7-39-2 (.174) versus teams in the top-15. BSU had four meetings with nationally-ranked opponents in 2009-10. Nov. 27, 2009 the Beavers knocked off then-No. 1 Miami (Ohio) 3-2. BSU then swept a home-and-home series with No. 4 Minnesota Duluth Jan. 22-23 before falling to No. 11 Michigan in the NCAA Midwest Regional Semifinal.

### SO WHAT IF THEY ARE RANKED?

Of the Beavers' seven victories versus teams ranked in the top-15 when faced, three wins have come at the expense of this weekend's opponent Minnesota Duluth, which happens to hold the No. 3 spot in the most recent poll. Last season the Beavers swept the then-No. 4 Bulldogs in a home-and-home series.

## GENERAL NOTES

### READ MAKES IT BETTER

There is really no way to get around it, the Bemidji State men's hockey team is better when senior forward **Matt Read** is on the ice. Since stepping on campus in the fall of 2007 Read has a plus/minus rating of +50 and the Beavers are 31-8-2 when he scores a goal, which includes 14-2-1 mark in 2009-10.

### OFFENSIVE DEFENSEMAN

Junior defenseman **Brad Hunt** has been a big factor for BSU on both ends of the ice since becoming a Beaver in 2008-09. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has been a true offensive threat--especially on the power play. As a freshman, he led all BSU blueliners and was third in scoring 9-23=32 points with a team-leading 7-16=23 coming on the man advantage. Last winter he had seven goals and a team-leading 26 assist to pace all BSU defenders, while ranking sixth among the nation's top blueliners, with 33 points (0.89 ppg). His 17 points (5-12=17) on the power play again paced the team. This season, he has two helpers after one weekend of play and both came on the man advantage.

### BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

Buoyed by career scoring numbers from **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe**, the 2009-10 junior class led the team posting 55 goals and 52 assists for 107 points. That class, now seniors, again leads the points race with a goal and five helpers. The juniors are in second with 1-2=3, while the sophomore class may have just two points, but leads all classes with two goals.

The new freshman class enters this weekend looking to register its first points of the season.

### PUT IT IN THE BOOKS AFTER TWO

In 2009-10, BSU was 19-0-1 when it took a lead into the third period. Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 140-9-12 when leading after two periods of play.

### READ ALL ABOUT BSU'S SCORING LEADERS

In 112 games and three seasons in a green and white uniform, senior **Matt Read** has piled up 110 points (44-66=110). Sitting alone in fourth on the BSU Division I-era scoring list, he is second in assists (66) and seventh in goals scored (44). He enters the series just one point from tying former linemate Tyler Scofield (2006-09) for third place (48-63-111) and five points behind Andrew Murray (2001-05), who recorded 46-69=115 points before going on to play in the NHL. Read is also tied with Jeff Sobb (1993-97) for 36th place on BSU's all-time scoring list.

### 100

January 19, 2010, **Matt Read** became the second-fastest player in BSU's Division I history to reach the 100-point plateau (102 games).

### THE HUNT FOR POWER-PLAY GOALS

In two seasons, defenseman **Brad Hunt** has piled up 12 power-play goals, including seven in 2008-09, which matched a BSU Division I-era record for power-play goals by a defender. Hunt currently sits just two goals on the man advantage from tying Clay Simmons for the career power-play goals mark at BSU.

### BY GEORGE HE'S ON THE LIST

In 2009-10, **Jordan George** assembled one of the finest freshman seasons since the Beavers moved to NCAA Division I in 1999-00. He settled into the top line and finished second on the team with 34 points (13g-21a). His point total placed him seventh among the NCAA's top rookies and solidified him as BSU's top freshman point producer of its Division I-era.

### SAVE A SPOT FOR BAKALA ON THE LIST

Junior goaltender **Dan Bakala** has piled up 840 saves during his short collegiate career, leaving him just 24 stops from matching former teammate Matt Dalton, who posted 864 saves from 2007-09, for fourth on Bemidji State's Division I-era saves list.

### SHORT-HANDED? NO PROBLEM.

**Matt Read** totaled three short-handed goals in 2009-10 for a career total of six shorties in the green and white. He currently ranks second to only Brendan Cook (9) in the BSU Division-era record book for career short-handed markers.

### ALWAYS WILLING TO LEND A HELPING HAND

In 2009-10 **Brad Hunt** recorded a career-high 26 assists. His total not only shattered his own previous BSU Division I-era mark for assists by a defender of 23, it also stands second to only Luke Erickson's 2004-05 single-season assists total of 27 since the Beavers moved to NCAA Division I prior to the 1999-2000 campaign.

### WHAT'S YOUR 20?

The Beavers completed the 2009-10 season with 23 wins marking the fifth time under head coach **Tom Serratore**, and the 29th time in program history, that BSU has accumulated 20 wins in a season. The team's 23 victories matched a BSU Division I-era record for wins in a season set in 2004-05 (23-13-1). With an overall record of 23-10-4, BSU gained its first at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament--its fourth appearance in the last six seasons.

## 2009-10 RECAP NOTES

### 40-40 VISION

Junior **Matt Read** had 19-22=41 points in 2009-10 making him the first BSU player to post back-to-back 40-point seasons during a Division I career and the first since Bernie Adlyns did it in 1994-95 and 1995-96.

### AND THE AWARD GOES TO...

An embarrassment of riches was the best way to describe Bemidji State's trip to the 2010 CHA Awards banquet. The Beavers swept the four major awards categories as **Matt Read** was picked Player of the Year, **Jordan George** won the league's Rookie of the Year award, **Kyle Hardwick** was named as the CHA Student Athlete of the Year and head coach **Tom Serratore** garnered his fifth CHA Coach of the Year laurel. In addition to cleaning up the four major awards, BSU placed four players on the All-CHA squads, had three players on the all-rookie team and had 17 players recognized for academic achievement.

### NICE JOB ROOK

**Jake Areshenko**, **Mathieu Dugas** and **Jordan George** were each selected to the 2010 CHA All-Rookie Team. The selections marked the third straight year the Beavers placed at least one player on the rookie team, but their three picks stood as the most for BSU in a single season since 2002 when Andrew Murray, Anders Olsson and Riley Riddell found spots on the team.

### COACH OF THE YEAR

**Tom Serratore** was named CHA 2010 Coach of the Year following the 2010-11. The accolade marked the third consecutive season he's received laurel and the fifth time his colleagues have selected him for the award. Serratore guided the Beavers to a 14-3-1 CHA record to corral the program's third straight CHA regular-season title.

### ALL-CHA

**Dan Bakala**, **Brad Hunt**, **Ian Lowe** and **Matt Read** were announced as members of the 2010 College Hockey America All-League Teams. League coaches voted Bakala, Hunt and Read to the first team while Lowe was selected Second-Team All-CHA. The quartet marked the ninth consecutive season that BSU has placed multiple student-athletes on the all-conference teams. In addition, three first-team picks in 2010 marked the first time since 2006 that BSU has grabbed a trio of First-Team honors.

### THEN THERE WERE SIX

**Matt Climie**, a 2008 graduate of Bemidji State and the Beavers' goaltender in the 2005 and 2006 National Tournament runs, was called up to join the Dallas Stars Friday April 4, 2009 and got his first NHL start Saturday. His 24 saves led the Stars to a 5-4 overtime victory over St. Louis.

Climie's trip to the NHL makes six products of the Beaver Hockey program to skate in the NHL ranks. He joins former BSU teammate **Andrew Murray** (2001-05) as the only other former Beavers currently in the NHL.

### BAK-STOPPING THE BEAVERS

**Dan Bakala** completed the 2009-10, tied for sixth in the nation with 19 wins, posted a goals allowed average of 2.33 to rank 12th and ranked 15th among all goaltenders with a .917 save percentage, while backstopping a team that ranked seventh in scoring defense allowing 2.35 goals per game.

### I'LL DO IT ON MY OWN, THANK YOU

In 37 games during the 2009-10 season, the Beavers posted 17 unassisted goals to set a new BSU Division I-era record, surpassing its 2001-02 mark of 11. **Matt Read** led the team with four unassisted markers. Read's nine career unassisted goals ranks atop the category in the BSU's Division I-era record books.

### THE HAT TRICK HUNT-ER

Nov. 21, 2010, **Brad Hunt** led the Beavers to a 6-3 victory over Ala.-Huntsville posting his first collegiate hat trick. The feat was the first BSU blueliner since Mar. 13, 2004 (John Haider), while it was the 10th hat trick for BSU at the NCAA Division I level and just the sixth for a D-man in the history of the program. Only Brendan Cook had posted two hat tricks for BSU at the D-I level and only Gary Sargent (2) has more hat tricks from the BSU blue line.

### OUR SHARE OF OT

Extending their March 13, 2010 CHA Tournament game versus Robert Morris to overtime, the Beavers played eight overtime games during the 2009-10 season, marking its most since playing in eight in 2004-05.

In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division I, they have escaped overtime with at least a tie in 76.7-percent (56) of the 73 games that have needed extra time to decide the outcome.

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 8-2-12 in games extended to sudden death, including a 3-1-4 mark in extra-time games in 2009-10.

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

As Bemidji State has made inroads in its development as a Division I program, its progress in the classroom has been remarkable.

In its ninth year under head coach Tom Serratore, the BSU program has become an academic juggernaut, annually dominating the Academic All-College Hockey America honor roll. In addition, BSU has had 12 College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District V selections over the last seven years and has passed the NCAA's first four Academic Progress Rate performance checks with flying colors.

Overall, the BSU men's ice hockey team carries a cumulative GPA of over 3.5.

### NCAA Academic Progress Rate

Bemidji State men's hockey received a score of 970 in the May 2009 release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score. BSU helped the sport of men's ice hockey achieve an aggregate score of 970, the third-highest of any men's sport in the Division.

The NCAA has established an APR cut rate of 925, which equates to a graduation rate of approximately 50 percent, for all NCAA Division I sports. Programs which fail to meet the cut rate when 2006-07 numbers are added to the 2005-06 and 2004-03 data risk reductions in scholarships.

### Academic All-CHA

BSU has led College Hockey America in Academic All-CHA honorees each of the last eight years. BSU placed 18 skaters on the 2008 all-academic team, surpassing its own league record set in 2003 and matched in 2004 and 2006.

BSU's 17-member group for 2010 continued its recent domination of the Academic All-CHA Team. BSU has an all-time total of 140 Academic All-CHA picks and its 132 honorees in nine years under head coach Tom Serratore leads CHA by a significant margin.

### CHA Student-Athlete of the Year

Kyle Hardwick was named 2010 CHA Student-Athlete of the year at the league's 2010 awards banquet. The honor is the second to be garnered by a member of the BSU hockey team since the league's inception. Andrew Murray became the first player in CHA history to be named Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year, picking up the historic sweep at the 2005 CHA awards banquet. Murray, a unanimous First-Team All-CHA pick, became the first BSU skater to be named CHA Student-Athlete of the Year.

### Academic All-District V

Over the last seven years, 13 Beavers have been honored on the CoSIDA Academic All-District V At-Large Team. In 2005, Peter Jonsson became just the second BSU men's hockey player to be named Academic All-America. He was the only men's hockey player in the nation to earn First-Team laurels in 2005. He was a two-time Academic All-District V selection, so honored in 2004 and 2005.

BSU's other Academic All-District picks include Riley Weselowski (2006-07-08), Andrew Murray (2005), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Bill Methven (2003) Travis Winter (2008-09), Cody Bostock (2009) and Kyle Hardwick (2009-10).

## BEMIDJI STATE HEAD COACH TOM SERRATORE

### Bemidji State '87 / 10th season at BSU

- ▶ Five-Time CHA Coach of the Year (2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010)
- ▶ Five-Time Spencer Penrose Award Finalist (2002, 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010)

Conventional sports wisdom has long contended it is never wise to follow a legend. However, sporting a remarkable laundry-list of achievements after nearly nine years as head coach at Bemidji State, it appears Tom Serratore is more than comfortable in the role.

The legacy Serratore was asked to continue upon accepting the role as Bemidji State's seventh head coach in 2001 is one of the finest in all of collegiate athletics. Serratore walks by the trophy case on his way to practice each day, in full view of the 13 small-college national championship trophies enshrined therein, trophies won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters.

Serratore not only had the challenge of inheriting one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, he also was called to oversee its growth into a Division I program.

While Serratore will be the first to admit he'll not be able to replicate Peters' achievements, there can be little doubt the program is in the right hands.

BSU finished 4-26-4 in 2000-01, the year before Serratore took control of the program. He led BSU to a 12-18-5 record during his rookie campaign and increased BSU's win total each of the four years that followed. BSU finished 23-13-1 in 2004-05, giving the Beavers a school-record for wins in a Division I season and back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time as a Division I program. In 2008-09 Serratore led the Beavers through the regular season to post their fourth CHA championship in six years before their third CHA Tournament championship, the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament victory and a chance represent the university and the CHA in the Frozen Four for the first time. The 2009-10 campaign served as the Beaver's last as a member of College Hockey America and Serratore's BSU squad went out with a bang. The team posted a 23-10-4 overall record with a 14-3-1 mark in CHA play en route to the team's third consecutive league regular-season championship and fifth in nine seasons as members of the league. Bemidji State capped the season by earning its first at-large bid and its fourth appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Under Serratore's guidance, 28 BSU skaters have earned All-CHA honors, including two-time First-Team All-CHA picks Marty Goulet (2002-03), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Matt Climie (2006-07), Travis Winter (2006-07), Cody Bostock (2007-08), Brad Hunt (2009-2010) and Matt Read (2009-2010) with four Beavers earning CHA Rookie of the Year laurels. BSU has had multiple skaters named First-Team All-CHA seven of the last eight seasons, including a school-record three first-teamers in 2003.

Academic excellence has been a staple of the BSU program under Serratore. The Beavers had a CHA-record 18 skaters named Academic All-CHA in 2008, and under Serratore's guidance have a league-high 132 Academic All-CHA picks over the last nine years. Niagara is second with 103 selections in the same span. In addition, BSU has had nine CoSIDA Academic All-District V selections under Serratore, including 2005 First-Team Academic All-America selection Peter Jonsson.

Serratore's achievements have not gone unnoticed. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year, winning the honor in 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2010 in 10 years as a collegiate head coach he has been named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the American Hockey Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year, five times, including a runner-up finish in 2009.

**BEMIDJI, Minn.** -- (Bemidji Regional Event Center) -- The outcome was not quite as planned, but for the capacity crowd of 4,373 at the Bemidji Regional Event Center, Oct. 15, 2010 will go down as a dream come true. Friday the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey opened its new hockey home on the south shore of Lake Bemidji after years of dreaming, planning and building.

No. 2 University of North Dakota may have gained a 5-2 victory over the Beavers in the teams' Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) 2010-11 opener, but the true stars of show were the state-of-the-art building and the celebration of the tradition-rich program it houses, leaving those in attendance buzzing with excitement.

More than 300 alumni traveled back to Bemidji from all corners of the earth to help BSU and the City of Bemidji initiate the building. After a brief introduction of many of the players who served as building blocks during the first five decades of the program, a torch passing ceremony, and ceremonial puck drop dedicating the Robert H. Peters Rink, the teams took the ice and the puck dropped on a new era in Beaver Hockey.

**Jamie MacQueen** (Jr., St. Thomas, Ontario) christened the building just 1:52 into the game, becoming the first male to net a goal in the new facility. **Ryan Cramer** (Sr., International Falls, Minn.), owner of the final goal in the John S. Glas Fieldhouse, BSU hockey home from 1967-2010, etched his name in the annals of BSU hockey yet again assisting on the historic marker.

However, the lead would last just over 17 minutes, when **Matt Frattin** would score in the final seconds of UND's third power play of the evening, sending the teams into the first intermission looked in a 1-1 tie.

The second period was all North Dakota. Jason Gregoire sparked a string of three goals in a span of 9:29 when he potted an even-strength goal 5:06 into the stanza. Frattin added his second power-play marker of the evening 5:05 later (10:11) and Gregoire gave the Fighting Sioux a three-goal cushion heading into the third period at the 14:37 mark.

Midway through the third period, the Beavers seemed to get a second wind.

Sophomore **Jordan George** (F, Madison, Wis.) was the benefactor of a hard-nosed play by **Jake Areshenko** (So., D. Port Coquitlam, British Columbia), who wrestled the puck from a UND player on the corner. **Matt Read** (Sr., F. Ilderton, Ontario) fed the puck up the ice to the speedy **Ian Lowe** (Sr., F. Bradwardine, Manitoba), who then hit George on the doorstep for a nifty backhand over the shoulder of the North Dakota goaltender Brad Eidsness.

But the Fighting Sioux slammed the door on any comeback attempt and reclaimed their three-goal lead when Frattin completed a hat trick at the 18:13 mark. The empty-net goal came with help from Even Trupp.

In addition to out shooting the Beavers 38-14 on the evening, UND also held an edge on special teams. The Sioux were 2-of-5 on the power-play, while holding Bemidji State scoreless on four man-advantage opportunities.

**BEMIDJI, Minn.** -- (Bemidji Regional Event Center) -- **Matt Read** (Sr., Ilderton, Ontario) and the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team gave No. 2 University of North Dakota all it could handle in front of a capacity crowd Saturday at the Bemidji Regional Event Center, but the battle tested Fighting Sioux outlasted the Beavers to gain a 5-2 victory and complete the series sweep.

Despite allowing UND to light the scoreboard first, Bemidji State posted a pair of power-play goals to erase a deficit and build a 2-1 lead early in the second period. However, UND caught the Beavers on their heels late in the period to skate into the third owning a 3-2 lead.

A pair of empty-net goals late in the game stretched the UND advantage to three goals, cementing the victory for the Sioux.

North Dakota got its power-play unit clicking early. Chay Genoway scored his first goal of the season 8:43 into the game, capitalizing on UND's second man advantage opportunity.

BSU would answer, tying the score at 1-1 before the end of the period as **Jordan George** (So., F. Madison, Wis.) netted his second goal in as many games with help from **Ian Lowe** (Sr., F. Bradwardine, Manitoba) and **Brad Hunt** (Jr., D. Ridge Meadows, British Columbia).

Just 5:46 into the second frame, Read posted the Beavers' second power-play goal of the evening to put BSU up 2-1, but the advantage would be short-lived. UND got and got goals from Derek Rodwell and Evan Trupp, to take the lead for good.

"Nobody likes to lose so if you go in the locker room right now, the guys are disappointed," said Bemidji State Head Coach **Tom Serratore**. "They are competitive and wanted to win a hockey game. They feel they can win a hockey game. I don't think they look at moral victories, but as a coach I want to make sure we are getting better."

"We are a better hockey team right now than we were last night at this time and that is one thing I am happy with right now."

"[Last night] we had no jump, no energy and we didn't take care of the puck very well. I think our guys recognized that. Serratore added, "We had a lot of energy tonight, we fore checked well and we moved the puck around on the power-play so our special teams were a factor."

The Beavers finished the game 2-for-6 on the power-play, while holding a potent Fighting Sioux unit to a goal on six opportunities.

Crediting a good morning video session and the opportunity to get on the ice and compete in live game situations Friday, Serratore displayed a sense of satisfaction in the way his team performed in the back end of its inaugural Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) series.

"I am never happy with a loss, but I am happy with the progress we made."

"Another bright spot for the Beavers was the play of Read."

"This was the best game Matt Read has played for us," said Serratore. "I thought tonight Matt was the best player on the ice tonight. He had great depth to his game and played great defensively. The first goal we got, he won a huge face off. The goal he got was a big time goal. He played well on both ends of the ice and he was great on face offs," added the coach. "All that came against the best team in the country."

On the wrong end of back-to-back 5-2 contests, North Dakota swept the Beavers league series for the first time since Feb. 9-10, 2007 when former College Hockey America (CHA) rival downed the Beavers in consecutive games.
