### PLAYER TO WATCH



Sophomore **Jordan George** is coming into this weekend's series with UAA as BSU's leader in goals (4), assists (5) and points (9). A week ago versus St. Cloud State, George had a hand in every one of the Beavers' goals recording a goal and five assists in the series. The reigning Red Baron WCHA Co-Offensive Player of the Week posted a career-high three assists in Saturday's 3-2 overtime victory.

## THE MATCH UP

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team returns home this weekend for its first ever meeting with the University of Alaska Anchorage. The Western Collegiate Hockey Association series is set for a 7:37 p.m. start Friday, followed by a 7:07 p.m. opening face off Saturday. Prior to Friday night's contest the City of Bemidji and Bemidji State will recognize the naming rights agreement with Sanford Health and officially rename the building Sanford Center.

The Beavers open the series toting a 1-4-1 record, with all games coming in WCHA play. BSU is coming off a WCHA series split at St. Cloud State University, dropping game one, 6-3, before earning its first victory of the season--a 3-2 overtime thriller. Despite playing four games (0-3-1) on its home ice this season, BSU begins play against the Seawolves seeking its first victory at Sanford Center.

Alaska Anchorage makes its first trip to Bemidji, Minn. this weekend owning a 1-5-2 overall record, while it is in search of its first WCHA victory (0-3-1). The Seawolves, who currently sit 12th in the league standings, should be well-rested and prepared for BSU since they had last weekend off.

Just six weeks into the season, BSU and UAA already share two common opponents. The Seawolves tied University of North Dakota, 5-5, Oct. 8 and dropped a 3-2 overtime contest to the University of Minnesota Duluth before falling, 6-0, in the series finale Oct. 23.

## THE RIVALRY

This weekend when Bemidji State and Alaska Anchorage take to the ice, it marks the beginning of a new rivalry.

Dating back to the program's inception in 1947, Bemidji State has played just three games versus teams hailing from "The Last Frontier," but all three have come against the University of Alaska Fairbanks and BSU has never made a trip to the 49th state. The Beavers defeated the Nanooks 12-0 Jan. 3, 1982 and swept UAF, 9-6 and 4-2, Mar. 10-11, 1984 en route to a perfect 31-0-0 season and the NCAA Division II national championship.

After Friday's contest, BSU can mark another Division I opponent off its list of teams played. Of the 58 current teams competing at the major college hockey level, BSU has now faced 30.

## THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2010-11 season represents the 12th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 55th year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sport.

- ▶ BSU owns 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- ▶ The Beavers have captured 21 conference titles in 54 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- ▶ In 2009, BSU became the first No. 16 seed to ever earn a spot in the Frozen Four. In just its 10th year at the NCAA Division I level, only one team, the 1958 Denver Pioneers, found its way to college hockey's grandest stage faster.
- ▶ BSU has developed six NHL players, six Olympians and 82 All-America honorees.
- ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 967-472-87 (.663) in 1,526 games.

## GENERAL NOTES

### THE COACHES

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State '86) is in his 10th season as an overall record of 164-132-34 (.548) as BSU's head coach. In addition to directing the Beavers to seven consecutive seasons of at least .500 hockey, Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular-season championships five times since 2003-04 and made trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2010, with a 2009 appearance in the Frozen Four. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year recipient and was *Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year Runner-up* in 2009.

► Now in his sixth season at Alaska Anchorage, **Dave Shiyak** has led the Seawolves to a 52-114-23 overall record. Prior to claiming his post at UAA, Shiyak was an assistant at his Alma mater, Northern Michigan University, for 10 seasons. At NMU, Shiyak helped the Wildcats to seven 20-win seasons, six CCHA tournament berths and an NCAA tournament appearance. A co-captain on NMU's 1991 NCAA Championship team, Shiyak also claimed two WCHA Tournament titles (1989 and 1991) and one WCHA regular-season title (1991).

Assisting Shiyak is a familiar face to BSU hockey faithful. **Ryan McKelvie** is in his first season as an assistant for the Seawolves. McKelvie, older brother of BSU's 2009-10 captain Chris, served under Tom Serratore as the Beavers' graduate assistant coach from 2006-08 and helped direct Bemidji State to 2007-08 CHA Regular-Season Championship.

### THE WCHA PREDICTIONS ARE IN...

Entering its inaugural season in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA), the Beavers garnered 46 points to finish ninth in the 40th Annual Grand Forks Herald Coaches' Poll. League coaches forecast University of North Dakota as the preseason favorite casting 10 first-place votes for the Fighting Sioux (120), which held a 15-point edge over St. Cloud State University (105), despite the Huskies collecting two first-place votes. University of Minnesota Duluth rounded out the top three with 100 points.

### ALL-AMERICA BOOKENDS

**Matt Read** became Bemidji State's 82nd All-America selection in the history of the program and second since the team made the move to the NCAA Division I ranks 12 years ago, when he was named RBK Second-Team All-America by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, following a junior season in which he scored 19-22=41 points. This season, BSU again gained national attention when defender **Brad Hunt** was selected to the USCHO.com Preseason All-America Second Team.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Matt Read** (Ilderton, Ontario) captains the Beavers during the 2010-11 campaign. Senior defenseman **Ryan Adams** (Brandon, Manitoba) and senior forward **Ian Lowe** (Bradwardine, Manitoba) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as alternate captains.

### LOOKING FOR NO. 1

The 2010-11 season marks the Beavers' first in their new home--Sanford Center. With any new building, there is a first time for everything. Junior forward **Jamie MacQueen** potted the first goal 1:52 into the Beavers' Oct. 15 games versus North Dakota. Senior **Ryan Cramer** recorded the first assist and was the first to sent to penalty box (at the 6:29 mark of the same game), but BSU enters its third home series in search of the most important first--its first win in its new hockey facility.

### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

BSU's 2010-11 move to the WCHA marks the fourth league home for the program. The Beavers entered 2010-11 with a perfect 3-0-0 mark in their league debuts, but dropped their WCHA opener, 5-2, North Dakota. As charter members of the ICHA, the Beavers defeated Lake Superior State, 3-1, Dec. 3, 1966. In its first season in the NCHA, BSU topped Wisconsin-Superior, 9-3, Dec. 10, 1980 and when the team moved to the CHA in 1999, BSU was victorious over Army Oct. 15, 5-2. The Beavers finished each of their previous inaugural league campaigns with a record of at least .500.

### PLAYING CLOSE TO HOME

Six of the 27 players on the Beavers' 2010-11 roster hail from the state of Minnesota. **Ryan Cramer** and **Drew Fisher** call International Falls their hometown, **Shea Walters** is from Hibbing and **Ben Kinne**, from St. Paul, and **Matt Hartmann**, who calls Hugo home, are from the Twin Cities-metro area. Newcomer **Sam Rendle** played his high school hockey just 90 miles down Highway 2 in Grand Rapids.

### CONSISTENT SCORERS

Four BSU players have recorded at least four points this season, while 13 Beavers have worked their way into the scoring column. Sophomore **Jordan George** paces the group with 4-5=9 points after posting 1-5=6 points versus St. Cloud State last weekend.

### FAMILIAR LOOK

**Tom Serratore** returns 22 letterwinners from a year ago including 2010 RBK Second-Team All-America pick **Matt Read**. BSU returners enter 2010-11 seasoned after carrying the bulk of the scoring load a year ago. Led by Read, **Jordan George**, **Brad Hunt** and **Ian Lowe**, who finished as Bemidji State's top four scorers, BSU returns 86 percent of its goals (110-of-118), 82 percent of its assists (156-of-191) and 83 percent of its scoring (266-of-319 points).

### TOP-OF-THE-LINE

Last season, the line of **Jordan George**, **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe** solidified itself as the Beavers' most potent line producing one-third of BSU total point production accounting for 53 goals and 53 assists for 106 points. The Beavers' top line of **Jordan George**, **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe** have combined for 61 percent of BSU's total scoring (22 pts),

## GENERAL NOTES

10 of 13 goals (77%) and 12 of 23 assists (52%). Last weekend the trio teamed up for all five goals and seven assists.

### THE WCHA LOWE-DOWN

No BSU player has experienced more success versus teams hailing from the WCHA than senior forward **Ian Lowe**. Since the beginning of the 2008-09 season, Lowe has accumulated 8-10=18 points in 20 games. Last season alone, Lowe posted 4-3=7 points in six games versus WCHA squads. He finished those games with a +6 plus/minus rating.

### BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 967 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 987 victories. Sixteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2010-11 BSU foe Minnesota which leads Division I with 1,620 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,600 or more all-time wins, while Michigan is second with 1,508 victories.

### KEEP 'EM UNDER TWO

In 2009-10 when BSU allowed its opponents two-or-fewer goals, it was 19-1-2. BSU finished the 37-game season, ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing a meager 2.35 goals per game, while giving up 2.22 in 18 CHA contests. This season, BSU is unbeaten (1-0-1) when holding its opponent to two goals or fewer.

### THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In 2009-10, three goals was a threshold for Bemidji State. BSU was 20-2-2 when posting at least three goals and 4-9-2 when allowing its rivals three or more. Already this season, the Beavers are 0-4-0 when allowing more than two goals and is 1-1-0 when scoring at least three.

### THE EARLY GOAL GETS THE WIN

Of the Beavers' 37 contests during the 2009-10 campaign, the team to score first won 27 times. BSU's opponents won 6-of-9 (6-2-1) of the games they were first to light the lamp while BSU was unbeaten in 23-of-27 (21-4-2) occasions it was first on the scoreboard. In 2010-11, BSU is 1-2-0 and are 0-2-1 when allowing their opponents to the scoreboard first.

### CLIMBING BSU'S DIVISION I ASSISTS LIST

**Brad Hunt** has accumulated 53 assists during his first 80 games, or just over two seasons, as a Beaver. Last weekend he helped on a goal to match the trio of Riley Riddell (2001-04), Rob Sirriani (2003-07) and Marty Goulet (1999-03) for sixth on the BSU Division I assists list. He needs a total of 62 to climb into fifth place on the list with Ryan Huddy (2002-06).

### BSU VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

In 2010-11 the Beavers have already faced two of the nation's top three teams. Oct. 15-16, BSU faced No. 2 North Dakota before BSU hosted No. 3 Minnesota Duluth Oct. 29-30. Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 7-40-3 (.173) versus teams in the top-15. BSU had four meetings with nationally-ranked opponents in 2009-10. Nov. 27, 2009 the Beavers knocked off then-No. 1 Miami (Ohio) 3-2. BSU then swept a home-and-home series with No. 4 Minnesota Duluth Jan. 22-23 before falling to No. 11 Michigan in the NCAA Midwest Regional Semifinal.

### READ MAKES IT BETTER

There is really no way to get around it, the Bemidji State men's hockey team is better when senior forward **Matt Read** is on the ice. Since stepping on campus in the fall of 2007 Read has a plus/minus rating of +52 and the Beavers are 31-10-2 when he scores a goal, but ironically, BSU is 0-3-0 when he scores in 2010-11.

### OFFENSIVE DEFENSEMAN

Junior defenseman **Brad Hunt** has been a big factor for BSU on both ends of the ice since becoming a Beaver in 2008-09. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has been a true offensive threat—especially on the power play. As a freshman, he was third on the team scoring 9-23=32 points with a team-leading 7-16=23 coming on the man advantage. Last winter he had seven goals and a team-leading 26 assist to pace all BSU defenders, while ranking sixth among the nation's top blueliners, with 33 points (0.89 ppg). His 17 points (5-12=17) on the power play again paced the team. This season, he has four helpers and all four came on the man advantage.

### SEE YOU IN THE POLL

This week Bemidji State was absent from both the USAToday/USA Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com weekly polls. That fact snapped a 32-week string of the Beavers garnering a minimum of a vote in at least one of the polls dating back to Mar. 9, 2009.

### BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

Buoyed by career scoring numbers from **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe**, the 2009-10 junior class led the team posting 55 goals and 52 assists for 107 points. That class, now seniors, again leads the points race with eight goals and 10 helpers. The sophomore class ranks second with 4-7=11 points followed by the juniors (1-6=7). The new freshman class enters this weekend with just one point to its credit (0-1=1).

### PUT IT IN THE BOOKS AFTER TWO

In 2009-10, BSU was 19-0-1 when it took a lead into the third period. Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 140-9-12 when leading after two periods of play.

### READ ALL ABOUT BSU'S SCORING LEADERS

In 118 games and three seasons in a green and white uniform, senior **Matt Read** has piled up 114 points (46-68=114). Sitting alone in third place on the BSU Division I-era scoring list, he is second in assists (68) and tied for sixth in goals scored (46). Read is one point behind Andrew Murray (2001-05), who recorded 46-69=115 points before going on to play in the NHL. Read is tied with Barry Dillon (1966-70) for 32nd place on BSU's all-time scoring list.

### 100

January 19, 2010, **Matt Read** became the second-fastest player in BSU's Division I history to reach the 100-point plateau (102 games).

### THE HUNT FOR POWER-PLAY GOALS

In two seasons, defenseman **Brad Hunt** has piled up 12 power-play goals, including seven in 2008-09, which matched a BSU Division I-era record for power-play goals by a defender. Hunt currently sits just two goals on the man advantage from tying Clay Simmons (1999-02) for the career power-play goals mark at BSU.

### BY GEORGE HE'S ON THE LIST

In 2009-10, **Jordan George** assembled one of the finest freshman seasons since the Beavers moved to NCAA Division I in 1999-00. He settled into the top line and finished second on the team with 34 points (13g-21a). His point total placed him seventh among the NCAA's top rookies and solidified him as BSU's top freshman point producer of its Division I-era.

### SAVE A SPOT FOR BAKALA ON THE LIST

Junior goaltender **Dan Bakala** has piled up 890 saves during his short collegiate career, placing him fourth on Bemidji State's Division I-era saves list.

### SHORT-HANDED? NO PROBLEM.

**Matt Read** piled up three short-handed goals in 2009-10 for a career total of six short-ies in the green and white. He currently ranks second to only Brendan Cook (9) in the BSU Division-era record book for career short-handed markers.

### ALWAYS WILLING TO LEND A HELPING HAND

In 2009-10 **Brad Hunt** recorded a career-high 26 assists. His total not only shattered his own previous BSU Division I-era mark for assists by a defender of 23, it also stands second to only Luke Erickson's 2004-05 single-season assists total of 27 since the Beavers moved to NCAA Division I prior to the 1999-2000 campaign.

### WHAT'S YOUR 20?

The Beavers completed the 2009-10 season with 23 wins marking the fifth time under head coach **Tom Serratore**, and the 29th time in program history, that BSU has accumulated 20 wins in a season. The team's 23 victories matched a BSU Division I-era record for wins in a season set in 2004-05 (23-13-1). With an overall record of 23-10-4, BSU gained its first at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament—its fourth appearance in the last six seasons.

### GEORGE RANKED AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

With 4-5=9 points in six games this season, sophomore forward **Jordan George** ranks 13th in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey averaging 1.50 points per game. In 42 games in the green and white, George has recorded 17-26=43 points for an average of 1.02 points per game.

### PENALTY KILLERS...

After giving up 10 power-play goals in its first five games (10-for-30), including seven of the last 10 goals it allowed, the Bemidji State penalty-kill unit stood strong Nov. 6 holding St. Cloud State scoreless in all eight of its man advantage opportunities (0-for-8). The unit has now climbed to .737 (28-for-38) in penalty-kill chances.

### COME FOURTH TO SCORE

The Bemidji State line up has generated scoring from its top three lines and all three defensive pairs. Tom Serratore has tried five different trios on his fourth line, but through six games the line has yet to yield any points.

## 2009-10 RECAP NOTES

### 40-40 VISION

Junior **Matt Read** had 19-22=41 points in 2009-10 making him the first BSU player to post back-to-back 40-point seasons during a Division I career and the first since Bernie Adlyns accomplished the feat 1994-95 and 1995-96.

### WCHA HONORS...

**Jordan George** became the first Beaver to garner Western Collegiate Hockey Association's (WCHA) player of the week award Tuesday when he was named *Red Baron WCHA Co-Offensive Player of the Week* after posting a goal and five assists versus St. Cloud State Nov. 5-6. He shares the honor with Colorado College's Stephen Schultz who also recorded six points on the weekend.

### THEN THERE WERE SIX

**Matt Climie**, a 2008 graduate of Bemidji State and the Beavers' goaltender in the 2005 and 2006 National Tournament runs, was called up to join the Dallas Stars Friday April 4, 2009 and got his first NHL start the next evening. His 24 saves led the Stars to a 5-4 overtime victory over St. Louis.

Climie's trip to the NHL makes six products of the Beaver Hockey program to skate in the NHL ranks. He joins former BSU teammate **Andrew Murray** (2001-05) as the only other former Beavers currently in the NHL.

### I'LL DO IT ON MY OWN, THANK YOU

In 37 games during the 2009-10 season, the Beavers posted 17 unassisted goals to set a new BSU Division I-era record, surpassing its 2001-02 mark of 11. **Matt Read** led the team with four unassisted markers. Read's nine career unassisted goals ranks atop the category in the BSU's Division I-era record books.

### THE HAT TRICK HUNT-ER

Nov. 21, 2010, **Brad Hunt** led the Beavers to a 6-3 victory over Ala.-Huntsville posting his first collegiate hat trick. The feat was the first BSU blueliner since Mar. 13, 2004 (John Haider), while it was the 10th hat trick for BSU at the NCAA Division I level and just the sixth for a D-man in the history of the program. Only Brendan Cook had posted two hat tricks for BSU at the D-I level and only Gary Sargent (2) has more hat tricks from the BSU blue line.

### OUR SHARE OF OT

Extending their March 13, 2010 CHA Tournament game versus Robert Morris to overtime, the Beavers played eight overtime games during the 2009-10 season, marking its most since playing in eight in 2004-05.

In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division I, they have escaped overtime with at least a tie in 76.0-percent (58) of the 76 games that have needed extra time to decide the outcome.

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 9-3-13 in games extended to sudden death, including a 3-1-4 mark in extra-time games in 2009-10 and a 1-1-1 record in extra time in 2010-11.

### FALLING BEHIND

Saturday's come-from-behind victory is nothing new for the Beavers of 2010-11. In 370:41 of play to this point in the season, BSU has been tied with or trailed its opponents 337:04 for minutes--that's nearly 90 percent of the time its been on the ice.

### SEASONED FISHER-MAN

Only one player on the BSU roster has previous experience facing Alaska Anchorage. **Drew Fisher**, a junior transfer, faced UAA five times while he was a member of the University of Minnesota hockey team (2007-09). He didn't record any points, but he carried a +2 plus/minus rating and his squad posted a 3-1-2 record versus the Seawolves.

### GUN SHY

Bemidji State has been out shot 200-131 this season and has yet to post more shots than its opponent in any of its first six games.

### YOU CAN PUT IT ON THE BOARD...YES

Freshman **Sam Rendle** became the first BSU rookie to find his way to the scoring column Nov. 5 when he was credited with an assist on the Beavers' third goal of the evening.

### POWER-PLAY PERFORMANCE

The Beavers' power-play unit has scored a goal in four of its last five games and has become a factor as of late. The crew is 5-of-27 (.185) on the season.

### NEW HOME...NEW NAME

Before Friday evening's series-opener, the City of Bemidji, Bemidji State and Sanford Health will have a short ceremony officially renaming the new facility Sanford Center. Sanford Health and the City of Bemidji have agreed upon a \$2 million deal for naming rights of the building for the next 10 years. The deal has been in the works for weeks, but Nov. 12 was the date set to recognize the agreement and make the name official.

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

As Bemidji State has made inroads in its development as a Division I program, its progress in the classroom has been remarkable.

In its ninth year under head coach Tom Serratore, the BSU program has become an academic juggernaut, annually dominating the Academic All-College Hockey America honor roll. In addition, BSU has had 12 College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District V selections over the last seven years and has passed the NCAA's first four Academic Progress Rate performance checks with flying colors.

Overall, the BSU men's ice hockey team carries a cumulative GPA of over 3.5.

### NCAA Academic Progress Rate

Bemidji State men's hockey received a score of 970 in the May 2009 release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score. BSU helped the sport of men's ice hockey achieve an aggregate score of 970, the third-highest of any men's sport in the Division.

The NCAA has established an APR cut rate of 925, which equates to a graduation rate of approximately 50 percent, for all NCAA Division I sports. Programs which fail to meet the cut rate when 2006-07 numbers are added to the 2005-06 and 2004-03 data risk reductions in scholarships.

### Academic All-CHA

BSU has led College Hockey America in Academic All-CHA honorees each of the last eight years. BSU placed 18 skaters on the 2008 all-academic team, surpassing its own league record set in 2003 and matched in 2004 and 2006.

BSU's 17-member group for 2010 continued its recent domination of the Academic All-CHA Team. BSU has an all-time total of 140 Academic All-CHA picks and its 132 honorees in nine years under head coach Tom Serratore leads CHA by a significant margin.

### CHA Student-Athlete of the Year

Kyle Hardwick was named 2010 CHA Student-Athlete of the year at the league's 2010 awards banquet. The honor is the second to be garnered by a member of the BSU hockey team since the league's inception. Andrew Murray became the first player in CHA history to be named Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year, picking up the historic sweep at the 2005 CHA awards banquet. Murray, a unanimous First-Team All-CHA pick, became the first BSU skater to be named CHA Student-Athlete of the Year.

### Academic All-District V

Over the last seven years, 13 Beavers have been honored on the CoSIDA Academic All-District V At-Large Team. In 2005, Peter Jonsson became just the second BSU men's hockey player to be named Academic All-America. He was the only men's hockey player in the nation to earn First-Team laurels in 2005. He was a two-time Academic All-District V selection, so honored in 2004 and 2005.

BSU's other Academic All-District picks include Riley Weselowski (2006-07-08), Andrew Murray (2005), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Bill Methven (2003) Travis Winter (2008-09), Cody Bostock (2009) and Kyle Hardwick (2009-10).

## BEMIDJI STATE HEAD COACH TOM SERRATORE

### Bemidji State '87 / 10th season at BSU

- ▶ Five-Time CHA Coach of the Year (2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010)
- ▶ Five-Time Spencer Penrose Award Finalist (2002, 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010)

Conventional sports wisdom has long contended it is never wise to follow a legend. However, sporting a remarkable laundry-list of achievements after nearly nine years as head coach at Bemidji State, it appears Tom Serratore is more than comfortable in the role.

The legacy Serratore was asked to continue upon accepting the role as Bemidji State's seventh head coach in 2001 is one of the finest in all of collegiate athletics. Serratore walks by the trophy case on his way to practice each day, in full view of the 13 small-college national championship trophies enshrined therein, trophies won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters.

Serratore not only had the challenge of inheriting one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, he also was called to oversee its growth into a Division I program.

While Serratore will be the first to admit he'll not be able to replicate Peters' achievements, there can be little doubt the program is in the right hands.

BSU finished 4-26-4 in 2000-01, the year before Serratore took control of the program. He led BSU to a 12-18-5 record during his rookie campaign and increased BSU's win total each of the four years that followed. BSU finished 23-13-1 in 2004-05, giving the Beavers a school-record for wins in a Division I season and back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time as a Division I program. In 2008-09 Serratore led the Beavers through the regular season to post their fourth CHA championship in six years before their third CHA Tournament championship, the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament victory and a chance represent the university and the CHA in the Frozen Four for the first time. The 2009-10 campaign served as the Beaver's last as a member of College Hockey America and Serratore's BSU squad went out with a bang. The team posted a 23-10-4 overall record with a 14-3-1 mark in CHA play en route to the team's third consecutive league regular-season championship and fifth in nine seasons as members of the league. Bemidji State capped the season by earning its first at-large bid and its fourth appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Under Serratore's guidance, 28 BSU skaters have earned All-CHA honors, including two-time First-Team All-CHA picks Marty Goulet (2002-03), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Matt Climie (2006-07), Travis Winter (2006-07), Cody Bostock (2007-08), Brad Hunt (2009-2010) and Matt Read (2009-2010) with four Beavers earning CHA Rookie of the Year laurels. BSU has had multiple skaters named First-Team All-CHA seven of the last eight seasons, including a school-record three first-teamers in 2003.

Academic excellence has been a staple of the BSU program under Serratore. The Beavers had a CHA-record 18 skaters named Academic All-CHA in 2008, and under Serratore's guidance have a league-high 132 Academic All-CHA picks over the last nine years. Niagara is second with 103 selections in the same span. In addition, BSU has had nine CoSIDA Academic All-District V selections under Serratore, including 2005 First-Team Academic All-America selection Peter Jonsson.

Serratore's achievements have not gone unnoticed. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year, winning the honor in 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2010 in 10 years as a collegiate head coach he has been named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the American Hockey Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year, five times, including a runner-up finish in 2009.

**BEMIDJI, Minn.** -- (Bemidji Regional Event Center) -- The outcome was not quite as planned, but for the capacity crowd of 4,373 at the Bemidji Regional Event Center, Oct. 15, 2010 will go down as a dream come true. Friday the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey opened its new hockey home on the south shore of Lake Bemidji after years of dreaming, planning and building.

No. 2 University of North Dakota may have gained a 5-2 victory over the Beavers in the teams' Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) 2010-11 opener, but the true stars of show were the state-of-the-art building and the celebration of the tradition-rich program it houses, leaving those in attendance buzzing with excitement.

More than 300 alumni traveled back to Bemidji from all corners of the earth to help BSU and the City of Bemidji initiate the building. After a brief introduction of many of the players who served as building blocks during the first five decades of the program, a torch passing ceremony, and ceremonial puck drop dedicating the Robert H. Peters Rink, the teams took the ice and the puck dropped on a new era in Beaver Hockey.

**Jamie MacQueen** (Jr., St. Thomas, Ontario) christened the building just 1:52 into the game, becoming the first male to net a goal in the new facility. **Ryan Cramer** (Sr., International Falls, Minn.), owner of the final goal in the John S. Glas Fieldhouse, BSU hockey home from 1967-2010, etched his name in the annals of BSU hockey yet again assisting on the historic marker.

However, the lead would last just over 17 minutes, when Matt Frattin would score in the final seconds of UND's third power play of the evening, sending the teams into the first intermission looked in a 1-1 tie.

The second period was all North Dakota. Jason Gregoire sparked a string a three goals in a span of 9:29 when he potted an even-strength goal 5:06 into the stanza. Frattin added his second power-play marker of the evening 5:05 later (10:11) and Gregoire gave the Fighting Sioux a three-goal cushion heading into the third period at the 14:37 mark.

Midway through the third period, the Beavers seemed to get a second wind.

Sophomore **Jordan George** (F, Madison, Wis.) was the benefactor of a hard-nosed play by **Jake Areshenko** (So., D. Port Coquitlam, British Columbia), who wrestled the puck from a UND player on the corner. **Matt Read** (Sr., F. Ilderton, Ontario) fed the puck up the ice to the speedy **Ian Lowe** (Sr., F. Bradwardine, Manitoba), who then hit George on the doorstep for a nifty backhand over the shoulder of the North Dakota goaltender Brad Eidsness.

But the Fighting Sioux slammed the door on any comeback attempt and reclaimed their three-goal lead when Frattin completed a hat trick at the 18:13 mark. The empty-net goal came with help from Even Trupp.

In addition to out shooting the Beavers 38-14 on the evening, UND also held an edge on special teams. The Sioux were 2-of-5 on the power-play, while holding Bemidji State scoreless on four man-advantage opportunities.

Despite allowing UND to light the scoreboard first, Bemidji State posted a pair of power-play goals to erase a deficit and build a 2-1 lead early in the second period. However, UND caught the Beavers on their heels late in the period to skate into the third owning a 3-2 lead.

A pair of empty-net goals late in the game stretched the UND advantage to three goals, cementing the victory for the Sioux.

North Dakota got its power-play unit clicking early. Chay Genoway scored his first goal of the season 8:43 into the game, capitalizing on UND's second man advantage opportunity.

BSU would answer, tying the score at 1-1 before the end of the period as **Jordan George** (So., F. Madison, Wis.) netted his second goal in as many games with help from **Ian Lowe** (Sr., F. Bradwardine, Manitoba) and **Brad Hunt** (Jr., D. Ridge Meadows, British Columbia).

Just 5:46 into the second frame, Read posted the Beavers' second power-play goal of the evening to put BSU up 2-1, but the advantage would be short-lived. UND got and got goals from Derek Rodwell and Evan Trupp, to take the lead for good.

"Nobody likes to lose so if you go in the locker room right now, the guys are disappointed," said Bemidji State Head Coach **Tom Serratore**. "They are competitive and wanted to win a hockey game. They feel they can win a hockey game. I don't think they look at moral victories, but as a coach I want to make sure we are getting better."

"We are a better hockey team right now than we were last night at this time and that is one thing I am happy with right now."

"Last night we had no jump, no energy and we didn't take care of the puck very well. I think our guys recognized that. Serratore added, "We had a lot of energy tonight, we fore checked well and we moved the puck around on the power-play so our special teams were a factor."

The Beavers finished the game 2-for-6 on the power-play, while holding a potent Fighting Sioux unit to a goal on six opportunities.

Crediting a good morning video session and the opportunity to get on the ice and compete in live game situations Friday, Serratore displayed a sense of satisfaction in the way his team performed in the back end of its inaugural Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) series.

"I am never happy with a loss, but I am happy with the progress we made." Another bright spot for the Beavers was the play of Read.

"This was the best game Matt Read has played for us," said Serratore. "I thought tonight Matt was the best player on the ice tonight. He had great depth to his game and played great defensively. The first goal we got, he won a huge face off. The goal he got was a big time goal. He played well on both ends of the ice and he was great on face offs," added the coach. "All that came against the best team in the country."

**BEMIDJI, Minn.** (Bemidji Regional Event Center) -- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team battled nationally-ranked University of Minnesota Duluth to overtime and after several legitimate opportunities to earn their first victory at the Bemidji Regional Event Center, seemed poised to escape with at least its first Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) point, but the No. 3 Bulldogs got a goal to steal the game in the waning moments of overtime.

"I was very proud of the resiliency our team showed," commented BSU head coach **Tom Serratore**. "I thought the first 10 minutes was an extremely one-sided affair. We rebounded, got a couple goals to tie it up and the momentum came back. I thought it was a good toe-to-toe in second period and in the third period I thought we actually carried play."

"Good players make good play and Oleksuk had a heck of a nice tip there from Olson on that third goal."

The Beavers were sluggish out of the gates, stymied by a penalty to **Jake Areshenko** (So., D. Port Coquitlam, British Columbia) just 27 seconds after the drop of the puck. That's all that one of the nation's most potent line ups would need to get on the scoreboard. Mike Connolly scored his seventh goal of the season just 19 seconds later to put UMD up 1-0.

For the next eight to nine minutes, the Bulldogs had their way with the Beavers, opening a 14-3 lead in shots on goal and dominating all aspects of play.

A **Shea Walters** (Jr., F. Hibbing, Minn.) five-minute major penalty for contact to the head, opened the door for Minnesota Duluth to build a 2-0 lead. J.T. Brown scored the Bulldogs' second power-play goal of the night at the 10:03 mark, but until Oleksuk found the back of the net in overtime, the goal would serve as the high point of the game for UMD.

Momentum began to build for the Beavers as they killed off the rest of the major. Less than two minutes later (15:19) senior captain **Matt Read** (F, Ilderton, Ontario) cleaned up a rebound off the power-play shot of **Ian Lowe** (Sr., F. Bradwardine, Manitoba) cut the deficit in half, 2-1. **Jordan George** (So., F. Madison, Wis.) knotted the game at 2-2 at the 16:59 mark on a nifty pass from Lowe to the right post.

An evenly played second period was followed by a third period that featured inspired, aggressive play by the Beavers in which they posted a 11-4 edge in shots on goal. Despite multiple legitimate scoring opportunities, the Beavers were unable to convert before the end of the stanza forcing the first overtime period of 2010-11 for either team.

BSU again came out as the aggressor in overtime, but when the Bulldog attack breached the BSU defense, **Brad Hunt** (Jr., D. Ridge Meadows, British Columbia) was forced to make a play from behind to prevent a clean break away attempt. The junior was whistled for tripping on the play, forcing the Beavers to play a man short for the remainder of the game. Although BSU successfully killed 1:51 of the penalty, Oleksuk redirected a shot from Dylan Olson into the net with just 7.9 seconds remaining in extra time to keep the Bulldogs unbeaten (6-0-1; 3-0 WCHA).

Aaron Crandall won the goaltender showdown posting 26 saves, while allowing two goals in the win. BSU's **Dan Bakala** (Jr., G. Calgary, Alberta) was tagged with the loss despite turning away a season-high 31 shots.

The win gives the Bulldogs a 19-9-0 advantage in the all-time series, while it stands as the first over BSU on the Beavers' home ice since Feb. 26, 2005.

**BEMIDJI, Minn.** -- (Bemidji Regional Event Center) -- No. 3 University of Minnesota Duluth and its goaltender Kenny Reiter kept the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team scoreless for over 58 minutes Saturday, but a late goal from **Emil Billberg** (Sr., F, Stockholm, Sweden) was all it would take to push the game to overtime and garner the Beavers' first point as a member of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association.

"To me, tonight was a very good tie," commented Bemidji State head coach **Tom Serratore**. "I thought our guys had a gutty, three-minute span from about the seven-minute mark to about the four-minute mark of the third period where we finally applied some sustained pressure and Emil popped that one. So I am very proud of the resiliency of our guys."

Billberg's goal came at the 58:29 mark of the third period when **Drew Fisher** (Jr., F, International Falls, Minn.) won a battle on the boards and chipped the puck out to **Dan MacIntyre** (Sr., D, Fort Frances, Ontario) who found the native of Sweden streaking towards the net.

The Beavers and Bulldogs went toe to toe in a first period that saw UMD post a 10-9 edge in shots on goal, but each goaltender rose to the occasion stopping shot after shot, setting the stage for the remainder of the evening.

The Bulldogs caught the first break of the game at the 6:08 mark of the second period when Bemidji State's Fisher and **Brady Wacker** (So., D, Jensen, Saskatchewan), who was also issued a 10-minute unsportsmanlike conduct penalty, were each set to the penalty box after being whistled for cross-checking, setting a full two-minute 5-on-3 opportunity for the visitors.

Not only did the BSU penalty-kill unit successfully snuff out the UMD power-play opportunity, it also held the Bulldogs without a single shot on net during the span.

After 40 minutes of scoreless, well-played hockey, it was the felling of the BSU coaching staff that one goal was all it would take to win the game. So when Justin Faulk scored on the power play to put UMD up 1-0 just 3:51 mark of the third period, the Beavers could have thrown in the towel, but instead, the tally served as a wake up call. The Beavers turned up the intensity and began to generate offense by tightening their defensive pressure. Ultimately, BSU's hard-nosed play resulted in a change of possession and Billberg gave the Beavers the break they needed beating Reiter high on a one-timer from the right faceoff dot.

In overtime, BSU went on the power-play just 43 second in, but it was UMD that recorded the best scoring opportunities putting two shots on net. Just as in regulation, **Mathieu Dugas** (So., G, L'Assomption, Quebec) was steady between the pipes for Bemidji State, and would turn away both chances and the teams would settle for the tie.

In his first start of the season, Dugas piled up 28 saves, including 10 stops in both the first and the second period, allowing just the third-period power-play goal in 65:00 minutes of play. He moves to 4-2-2 in his career. His counterpart, Reiter, turned away 19 BSU shots and moves to 3-0-2 on the season.

Despite climbing to within a goal of the hosting Huskies midway through the third period, 4-3, SCSU added two goals late to separate itself from the Beavers and claim a 6-3 Western Collegiate Hockey Association victory Friday at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, Minn.

**ST. CLOUD, Minn.** -- (National Hockey Center) Held winless through the first five games of the 2010-11 season (0-4-1), a team with the proud history and tradition of Bemidji State University was due for a victory. Saturday at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, Minn., it may have taken extra time, but the Beavers got it done earning their first victory as a member of the WCHA, 3-2, over St. Cloud State University.

The victory came in typical Beaver Hockey fashion: Hard-nosed play, a stellar effort by the penalty-kill unit and an opportunistic offensive attack.

"I told the guys in the locker room this was the best regular-season win in the history of this program," commented BSU Head Coach **Tom Serratore** after the game. "It was the way we did it. We flat out earned this victory. Period."

It was the Beavers' top line of **Jordan George**, **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe** that willed the Beavers a win following a trend established through the first six games of the season. After Lowe netted the game-tying goal with less than three minutes to play in regulation, the trio again combined to generate the game-winner just 46 seconds into overtime.

For the second consecutive night, George, led the team with three points. Saturday, he had a hand in each of the Beavers' goals posting three assists. The Madison, Wis. native finished the weekend leading the team with 4-5-9 points. Two of his assists came on goals scored by Lowe, which included the game-winner. Read was also credited with a helper on the game's final goal.

For the third time this season, Bemidji State was the first to light the scoreboard and Saturday it took just 44 seconds. With Chris Hepp headed to the penalty box for tripping, BSU senior **Emil Billberg** recorded his second tally of the season on the delayed penalty. But the lead would be snatched away as quickly as it was initially grabbed. Twenty-nine seconds into the Beavers' first power play of the evening (1:11), St. Cloud State's Nick Jensen netted a short-handed goal with help from Aaron Marvin and Travis Novak.

After seeing a goal scored for each team during the first 71 seconds of play, the teams played the remainder of the period without a goal and skated into the first intermission tied at 1-1.

The Huskies jumped out to a quick 2-1 lead 1:18 into the second period on a goal from Aaron Marvin. The even-strength marker would stand as the only goal of the second period putting the Huskies 20 minutes from what looked like a series sweep.

Midway through the third period, BSU was whistled for a pair of minor penalties followed 31 seconds later by another setting the stage for a two-minute 5-on-3 opportunity for SCSU. But the BSU penalty-kill unit played water-tight defense for the first 50 minutes and would stand tall again killing the penalties and setting the tone for the remainder of the game.

At the 15:32 mark, the Beavers got the break they needed. SCSU's was whistled for a minor penalty putting the Beavers on the power-play. Forty-seven seconds later, Lowe scored the equalizer with 3:41 left on the clock to set up Bemidji State's third overtime game of the season.

Just 46 seconds after the puck was dropped in extra time, Lowe put a shot past the SCSU goaltender to give BSU the victory.

BSU won the special teams battle Saturday and earned the victory because of it. The Beavers were just 1-of-5 on the power-play, but got the goal they needed when it mattered. On the flip side, the Bemidji State penalty-kill was lights out, backstopped by junior goaltender Dan Bakala. The unit stymied all eight SCSU power-play opportunities, including four in the third period alone.

Bakala totaled 19 saves in the 60:43 victory allowing two St. Cloud State goals. He improved to 1-3-1 on the season.
