GAME 14 - NO. 4 NEBRASKA OMAHA AT BEMIDJI STATE

Sanford Center • Bemidji, Minn. • December 4, 2010 • 7:07 p.m.

Bemidji State notables:

► Bemidji State's 3-0 shutout victory over No. 4 Nebraska Omaha last night gives the Beavers their first win on a Friday night in seven chances this season (1-6-0). They improved to 4-8-1 overall and 3-7-1 in WCHA play.

► BSU is 1-5-1 versus the nationally-ranked this season and is 7-42-3 since 1999-2000 versus the top 15.

► The Mavericks continue to cling to a 5-2-0 lead all-time in the all-time series, but after splitting last year's two-game set, 3-1 and 2-3, (Feb. 26-27), BSU has won two of the last three meetings.

► Holding Nebraska Omaha without a goal last night, BSU has now blanked its last two opponents. The last time the Beavers conceded a goal was in the third period of the Nov. 26 game versus Northern Michigan--a streak spanning 121:31.

► The last time BSU posted back-to-back shutouts was Jan. 2-3 2010, when BSU tied, 0-0, and defeated, 3-0, Western Michigan.

► Riding a 25-save effort last night, **Dan Bakala** posted his second consecutive and fifth career shutout. He has now held opponents scoreless in his last 124:40 in net reaching back to a Nov. 12 contest. The junior also posted back-to-back shutouts Jan. 2-3, 2010 at Western Michigan. The longest shutout streak of his career came between Dec. 11, 2009 and Jan. 15, 2010--a streak of 152:29 minutes.

► BSU looks for a win tonight to complete its first series sweep of the season and first in WCHA play. The last time BSU swept an opponent came Feb. 19-20--BSU's last regular-season series in the John S. Glas Fieldhouse.

► Senior **Emil Billberg** netted his fourth goal of the season in the third period of last night's contest. BSU is 3-0-1 when Billberg scores a goal in 2010-11 and is 4-1-1 when he postes at least one point.

► Freshman **Sam Rendle** leads all BSU blueliners in goal scoring and tops the BSU rookies scoring list with 3-1=4 points. **Jordan George** (5-9=14) leads all Beavers in scoring with 14 points.

► **Matt Read** comes into tonight's game with UNO without a point in his last three games. He has been held scoreless for three or more games just four times during his career at BSU and has been held without a point in four straight just two times. The last time, a stretch between Jan. 29, 2010 and Feb. 13, 2010, was directly followed by a five-game scoring streak during which the junior posted five goals and three assists for eight points.

► With 0-10=10 points this season, **Brad Hunt** ranks 14th in the nation among blueliners averaging 0.77 points per game.

► With 120 points (50-70=120) **Matt Read** sits just one point from matching BSU great Luke Erickson (2003-07) atop BSU's Division I scoring list (52-69=121). In addition, he is tied with Bruce Falk (1967-71) on BSU career scoring list.

► The Beavers' defense contributed 1-1=2 points last night marking the 10th game this season BSU blueline has posted at least a point. The BSU's defense has posted 5-18-23 points (1.77 ppg) in 2010-11.

► After being out shot in seven of their first 10 games, BSU has not been out shot in its last three contests. BSU is 2-1-0 in those games, but continues to be out shot 339-318 this season. However, BSU has out shot its opponents 234-233 at home in 2010-11 and has out shot its opponent in each of its last five home games by a total difference of 150-106. BSU is just 1-6-0 when being out shot.

► Three seems to be a magical thresh hold for BSU opponents in 2010-11. BSU is 0-8-0 when its opponents have scored three or more goals in a game. BSU is 4-0-1, including a 3-0 shutout of UNO last night, when holding its opponents to two or fewer goals this season.

► Sophomore Jake Areshenko (1-4=5) netted his first collegiate goal in last night's game versus UNO. Fellow veterans **Matt Carlson** (0-1=1) and **Drew Fisher** (0-4=4) continue to seek their first collegiate goals, while rookies **Kyle Brodie**, **Jeff Jubinville**, **Anton Racklin** and **Garrett Ladd** are all still in search of their first collegiate points.

► BSU's penalty-kill unit has allowed 13 power-play goals on 68 opponent chances to sit 37th in the nation (.809), but the unit has been lights out as of late. Since Nov. 6, BSU has snuffed out 35 of its opponents' last 37 power-play opportunities (.946), which includes holding the opposition scoreless on the man advantage in six of its last eight games.

► BSU's penalty-kill has not allowed an opponent power-play goal in 30:19--a streak spanning 12 opportunities and reaches back to BSU's Nov. 20 game at University of Denver.

► **Brad Hunt** continues to be a force on the Beavers power-play. He leads the team in power-play point production posting seven of his 10 assists on the man advantage.

► **Matt Read** will make his 123 consecutive appearance for the Beavers tonight. Read has not missed a game since he stepped on campus at BSU in the fall of 2007. He remains 20 games behind Matt Pope and John Haider for the BSU Division I-era record for games played (143).

► The Beavers posted a record of 10-6-3 a year ago when playing on Saturday and are 3-2-1 in 2010-11.

► BSU has compiled an all-time record of 970-476-87 (.662) in 1,533 games.
