### PLAYER TO WATCH



Sophomore forward **Jordan George** enters the series with Michigan Tech having scored in four of the Beavers' last five games. Since Jan. 15, he has 3-3=6 points. Last weekend the Madison, Wis. native recorded BSU's only goal Friday before matching a career-high two goals, including the game winner, in the series finale. He leads the team with 12-15=27 points.

## THE MATCH UP

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team wraps up a four-game road swing this weekend as it travels to Michigan's Upper Peninsula for its first Western Collegiate Hockey Association meeting with Michigan Technological University. The series, which is a centerpiece of the Huskies' annual Winter Carnival--the nation's premier collegiate winter festival, gets underway Friday at 6:07 (CST) from the John MacInnes Student Ice Arena. Saturday's series finale is scheduled as a rare Saturday matinee beginning at 4:07 p.m.

Bemidji State (10-14-2; 6-12-2 WCHA), looks to build upon a series split at Minnesota State University, Mankato Feb. 4-5. After a heartbreaking 2-1 overtime loss Friday, the team shuffled its lines and bounced back with a 4-1 victory Saturday. **Matt Read** and **Jordan George** each collected three points in the series while **Dan Bakala** stopped 81 of 84 shots and finished the weekend 1-1-0.

Michigan Tech is 2-22-3 overall and 1-18-1 in WCHA play after being swept at University of Alaska Anchorage last weekend, 4-1, and 4-2. The pair of losses only compounds the Huskies' winless streak that reaches back 24 games to Oct. 16 (0-22-2). MTU was unbeaten in its first two games at MacInnes Arena this season posting a 4-4 tie with Northern Michigan Oct. 12 before winning its series opener versus Minnesota State, 5-2, Oct. 15. Since then, the Huskies have dropped 11 consecutive home games.

Freshman forward Milos Gordic currently leads the team in scoring with 12 goals and six assists for 18 points. A pair of blueliners, Deron Cousens and Steven Seigo, are tied for second in scoring with 17 points apiece, and Cousens leads all Huskies with 15 assists. It has been goaltender by committee this season for an MTU defense allowing over four goals per game (4.35) in WCHA play. Kevin Genoe has started each of the last three games for the Huskies and made appearances in the last four. He is 2-12-1 overall with a .885 save percentage and 3.90 goals against average.

## THE RIVALRY

It seems ironic for two teams that have histories dating back to 1919 and 1947, respectively, and have logged a combined total of 4,033 games have met just four times prior to this weekend's series between the Huskies and the Beavers, but the first meeting between the teams didn't take place Jan. 12, 2007.

Each team currently owns a pair of wins in the series (2-2-0), with each winning the games played on their home ice. MTU swept a series Jan. 12-13, 2007 with wins of 4-1 and 3-2. In 2008, the Beavers returned the favor posting back-to-back victories at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse, 3-0 and 2-1.

## THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2010-11 season represents the 12th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 55th year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sport.

- ▶ BSU owns 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- ▶ The Beavers have captured 21 conference titles in 54 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- ▶ In 2009, BSU became the first No. 16 seed to ever earn a spot in the Frozen Four. In just its 10th year at the NCAA Division I level, only one team, the 1958 Denver Pioneers, found its way to college hockey's grandest stage faster.
- ▶ BSU has developed six NHL players, six Olympians and 82 All-America honorees.
- ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 976-482-88 (.660) in 1,546 games.

## GENERAL NOTES

### THE COACHES

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State '86) is in his 10th season has an overall record of 166-138-34 (.545) as BSU's head coach. In addition to directing the Beavers to seven consecutive seasons of at least .500 hockey, Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular-season championships five times since 2003-04 and made trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2010, with a 2009 appearance in the Frozen Four. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year recipient and was *Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year Runner-up* in 2009. ► In his eighth season as Michigan Tech's head coach, **Jamie Russell** is currently second all-time only to legendary head coach John MacInnes at MTU for career wins with 69. A native of Kamloops, B.C. and 1989 graduate of Michigan Tech, Russell was a two-year letter winner and assistant captain for the Huskies playing defense from 1987-89. After a brief professional hockey career overseas, Russell spent four seasons helping to build the Cornell University men's hockey program before taking the reigns of the Huskies.

### THE WCHA PREDICTIONS ARE IN...

Entering its inaugural season in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA), the Beavers garnered 46 points to finish ninth in the 40th Annual Grand Forks Herald Coaches' Poll. League coaches forecast University of North Dakota as the preseason favorite casting 10 first-place votes for the Fighting Sioux (120), which held a 15-point edge over St. Cloud State University (105), despite the Huskies collecting two first-place votes. University of Minnesota Duluth rounded out the top three with 100 points.

### ALL-AMERICA BOOKENDS

**Matt Read** became Bemidji State's 82nd All-America selection in the history of the program and second since the team made the move to the NCAA Division I ranks 12 years ago, when he was named RBK Second-Team All-America by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, following a junior season in which he scored 19-22=41 points. This season, BSU again gained national attention when defender **Brad Hunt** was selected to the USCHO.com Preseason All-America Second Team.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Matt Read** (Ilderton, Ontario) captains the Beavers during the 2010-11 campaign. Senior defenseman **Ryan Adams** (Brandon, Manitoba) and senior forward **Ian Lowe** (Bradwardine, Manitoba) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as alternate captains.

### LOOKING FOR NO. 1

The 2010-11 season marks the Beavers' first in their new home--Sanford Center. With any new building, there is a first time for everything. Junior forward **Jamie MacQueen** potted the first goal 1:52 into the Beavers' Oct. 15 games versus North Dakota. Senior **Ryan Cramer** recorded the first assist and was the first to sent to penalty box (at the 6:29 mark of the same game), and the Beavers garnered the first victory and shutout in their new facility Nov. 13, 2010 in a decisive 4-0 blanking of the University of Alaska Anchorage. The Beavers first series sweep in their new digs came over then-No. 4 Nebraska Omaha Dec. 3-4.

### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

BSU's 2010-11 move to the WCHA marks the fourth league home for the program. The Beavers entered 2010-11 with a perfect 3-0-0 mark in their league debuts, but dropped their WCHA opener, 5-2, North Dakota. As charter members of the ICHA, the Beavers defeated Lake Superior State, 3-1, Dec. 3, 1966. In its first season in the NCHA, BSU topped Wisconsin-Superior, 9-3, Dec. 10, 1980 and when the team moved to the CHA in 1999, BSU was victorious over Army Oct. 15, 5-2. The Beavers finished each of their previous inaugural league campaigns with a record of at least .500.

### PLAYING CLOSE TO HOME

Six of the 27 players on the Beavers' 2010-11 roster hail from the state of Minnesota. **Ryan Cramer** and **Drew Fisher** call International Falls their hometown, **Shea Walters** is from Hibbing and **Ben Kinne**, from St. Paul, and **Matt Hartmann**, who calls Hugo home, are from the Twin Cities-metro area. Newcomer **Sam Rendle** played his high school hockey just 90 miles down Highway 2 in Grand Rapids.

### SCORING CONTRIBUTION

Ten BSU players have recorded at least five points this season and 21 of the Beavers' 26 rostered players have worked their way into the scoring column. Sophomore **Jordan George** leads a group of six BSU players with at least 10 points owning 12-15=27 in the Beavers' first 26 games.

### FAMILIAR LOOK

**Tom Serratore** returns 22 letter winners from a year ago including 2010 RBK Second-Team All-America pick **Matt Read**. BSU returners enter 2010-11 seasoned after carrying the bulk of the scoring load a year ago. Led by Read, **Jordan George**, **Brad Hunt** and **Ian Lowe**, who finished as Bemidji State's top four scorers, BSU returns 86 percent of its goals (110-of-118), 82 percent of its assists (156-of-191) and 83 percent of its scoring (266-of-319 points).

### ROCKY ROAD

The Beavers have struggled to generate wins this season and that struggle is no different on the road. BSU is 4-7-1 when playing as the visitor and are 3-6-1 in WCHA road contests despite posting a 2-1-1 mark in league road games since the first of the year.

### THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In 2010-11, three goals have been a threshold for Bemidji State. The Beavers are 0-11-0 when allowing more than two goals and are 10-3-0 when scoring at least three. BSU has not won a single game this season when scoring fewer than three times.

## GENERAL NOTES

### BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 976 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 998 victories. Sixteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2010-11 BSU foe Minnesota which leads Division I with 1,626 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,600 or more all-time wins, while Michigan is second with 1,520 victories.

### KEEP 'EM UNDER TWO

In 2009-10 when BSU allowed its opponents two-or-fewer goals, it was 19-1-2. BSU finished the 37-game season, ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing a meager 2.35 goals per game, while giving up 2.22 in 18 CHA contests. This season, BSU is 9-3-2 when holding it opponent to two goals or fewer.

### THE EARLY GOAL GETS THE WIN

Of the Beavers' first 26 contests, the team to light their side of the scoreboard first has won 15 games. BSU has been first to strike in 14 contests posting a 6-5-1 (.542), while their opponents have lost just four times posting a 9-4-1 (.679) mark when scoring first.

### QUICK TO STRIKE

Scoring first in 14 of their first 26 contests of 2010-11 the Beavers have lit the lamp during the first minute of play three times in 2010-11. Even more, the Beavers have found the back of the net on their first shot on goal in six games this season.

### CLIMBING BSU'S DIVISION I ASSISTS LIST

**Brad Hunt** has accumulated 63 assists during his first 100 games, or just over two seasons, as a Beaver to settle into sixth on the BSU Division I assists list. His helper in Omaha, Neb. Jan. 21 helped him to climb into a tie with former teammate Tyler Scofield (2006-09) for fourth place (63). He remains six helpers shy of Andrew Murray (2001-2005) and Luke Erickson (2003-07) and a tie for second place on the list.

### BSU VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

In 2010-11 the Beavers have already played 11 games against teams holding down one of the nation's top 15 rankings, which includes three of the top four teams according to USA Today and USA Hockey Magazine. BSU is 4-5-2 versus the nation's top 15 this season. After going 0-5-1 versus nationally-ranked competition during the first two months of 2010-11, the Beavers are 4-0-1 versus the top 15 since Dec. 3.

Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 11-42-4 (228) versus teams in the top-15. With that said, BSU is now 9-7-2 (.526) versus the top 15 since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign.

### READ MAKES IT BETTER

There is really no way to get around it, the Bemidji State men's hockey team is better when senior forward **Matt Read** is on the ice. Since stepping on campus in the fall of 2007 Read has a plus/minus rating of +57 and the Beavers are 35-13-2 when he scores a goal, but ironically, BSU is just 4-6-0 when he scores in 2010-11.

### OFFENSIVE DEFENSEMAN

Junior defenseman **Brad Hunt** has been a big factor for BSU on both ends of the ice since becoming a Beaver in 2008-09. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has been a true offensive threat--especially on the power play. As a freshman, he was third on the team scoring 9-23-32 points with a team-leading 7-16-23 coming on the man advantage. Last winter he had seven goals and a team-leading 26 assists to pace all BSU defenders, while ranking sixth among the nation's top blueliners (0.89 ppg). His 17 points (5-12=17) on the power play again paced the team. This season, he has 14 helpers and eight have come on the man advantage. He is tied for third on the team in power-play scoring.

### LOOKING FOR 175

In his 10th season as a collegiate head coach, BSU's bench boss **Tom Serratore** is just three wins from another milestone--his 175th victory as a head coach. He is 172-142-35 (.543) since inheriting the Beaver hockey program from legendary R.H. "Bob" Peters prior to the 2001-02 season. Serratore is second at the school in victories by a head coach behind Peters who posted 702 wins at BSU from 1966-2001.

### READ ALL ABOUT BSU'S SCORING LEADERS

In 136 games and three-plus seasons in a green and white uniform, senior **Matt Read** has piled up 134 points (58-76=134). With an assist Dec. 10, Read surpassed Luke Erickson (2003-07) to become BSU Division I-era (since 1999-00) scoring leader. In addition, he owns the top spot in assists (76) and has surpassed Brendan Cook (2001-05) for the top spot in goals scored (58). Read is 20th on BSU's all-time scoring list.

### BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

Buoyed by career scoring numbers from **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe**, the 2009-10 junior class led the team posting 55 goals and 52 assists for 107 points. That class, now seniors, again leads the points race with 31 goals and 37 helpers. The sophomores (14-27=41) are in second, while the junior (8-32=40) and are just one point back in third. The freshman class, which has 14 points (7-7=14) to its credit, rounds out the group.

### PUT IT IN THE BOOKS AFTER TWO

Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 150-9-12 when leading after two periods of play, which includes a perfect 7-0-0 mark in 2010-11. BSU has not lost a game when taking a lead into the third period since Jan. 18, 2008 at Colorado College--a streak spanning 47 games (45-0-2). Quinnipiac dropped a 3-2 overtime contest versus Union Feb. 5 to end its NCAA Division I-leading streak at 59 games (54-0-5) leaving BSU with the nation's longest current streak of wins without blowing a lead after two periods.

### 100

January 19, 2010, **Matt Read** became the second-fastest player in BSU's Division I history to reach the 100-point plateau (102 games).

### THE HUNT FOR POWER-PLAY GOALS

In his third season, defenseman **Brad Hunt** has piled up 13 power-play goals, including seven in 2008-09, which matched a BSU Division I-era record for power-play goals by a defender. Hunt, who potted his first power-play goal of the season Feb. 5, currently sits just one goal on the man advantage from matching Clay Simmons (1999-02) for BSU's Division I-era mark for power-play goals by a defenseman.

### BY GEORGE HE'S ON THE LIST

In 2009-10, **Jordan George** assembled one of the finest freshman seasons since the Beavers moved to NCAA Division I in 1999-00. He settled into the top line and finished second on the team with 34 points (13g-21a). His point total placed him seventh among the NCAA's top rookies and solidified him as BSU's top freshman point producer of its Division I-era.

### SHORT-HANDED? NO PROBLEM.

**Matt Read** has BSU's only two short-handed goal in 2010-11 for a career total of eight shorties in the green and white. He currently ranks second to only Brendan Cook (9) in the BSU Division-era record book for career short-handed markers.

### DON'T CALL IT A SHUTOUT

Held scoreless in a Dec. 11 game at Wisconsin, BSU has now been shutout twice in 2010-11. The last time the Beavers were blanked three times in a season was 2000-01.

### PENALTY KILLERS...

The BSU penalty-kill unit seems to have recovered from allowing three power-play goals in a 4-3 loss Saturday Jan. 8. The unit has allowed just three power-play goals in its last six games (26-29/.897). The unit has still held opponents scoreless on the man advantage in 11 of its last 17 games. The unit is now at .821 (101-for-123) in penalty-kill chances this season.

### FREAKY FRIDAY

Although Bemidji State has been victorious on Friday twice since the start of the new year, in 2010-11 BSU is a meager 3-9-1 in the first game of the weekend, while the team has experience much greater success on Saturdays posting a 7-5-1 record in the final game of a series. Including a 2-1 loss at Minnesota State last weekend, the Beavers have been out scored 38-27 on Fridays this season, which includes a 31-21 deficit in 10 Friday contests in league play.

### POWERFUL RUN

Bemidji State is 18 of 91 for .197 on the man advantage this year, which includes a pair of power-play markers in the Beavers' last outing. BSU has recorded power-play goals in four of its last five games and the unit is clicking at .263 (5-19) during that stretch.

### TOP UNIT IN THE WCHA

Scoring on 21.6 percent of its power-play chances in WCHA play (16 of 74), the Bemidji State power-play currently ranks as the leagues most efficient unit. With that said, only this week's opponent Michigan Tech has had fewer man advantage opportunities than BSU (73).

### READ ON THE MAN ADVANTAGE

**Matt Read** now has 14 power-play goals during his career to match Clay Simmons (1999-2002) for ninth on BSU's Division I-era power-play goals scored list. His next power-play goal will slide him into a tie with linemate **Ian Lowe** (15) for eight place on the list. His six power-play goals and 6-6=12 points in the man advantage in 2010-11 lead the team.

### SHOOT THE PUCK

Despite getting out shot 84-39 in the series, BSU out scored the Mavericks 5-3. BSU has been out shot 17 times this season, which included its last six games. BSU has been out shot 754-647 on the season.

### K9 LOVER

**Brad Hunt** has had more success versus Michigan Tech than any other current BSU player. In just two career games, the junior blueliner has three assists, which includes a helper on the game-winner the last time the teams met.

## 2009-10 RECAP NOTES

### 40-40 VISION

Junior **Matt Read** had 19-22=41 points in 2009-10 making him the first BSU player to post back-to-back 40-point seasons during a Division I career and the first since Bernie Adlyns accomplished the feat 1994-95 and 1995-96. With another 40-point season in 2010-11, Read will become the first BSU player to top 40 points in three consecutive seasons since Jamie Erb, who is tied for seventh on BSU all-time scoring list (86-94=180), posted 46, 50 and 53 between 1990-93.

### THEN THERE WERE SIX

**Matt Climie**, a 2008 graduate of Bemidji State and the Beavers' goaltender in the 2005 and 2006 National Tournament runs, was called up to join the Dallas Stars Friday April 4, 2009 and got his first NHL start the next evening. More recently, Climie was called up and saw time with the Phoenix Coyotes Dec. 20 and was recalled to meet the team in Denver Jan. 6.

Climie's trip to the NHL makes six products of the Beaver Hockey program to skate in the NHL ranks. He joins former BSU teammate **Andrew Murray** (2001-05) as the only other former Beavers currently in the NHL.

### THE KEY TO A WIN IS BILLBERG

Senior forward **Emil Billberg** has potted a career-high five goals in the first 26 games of his senior season. BSU is at 3-1-1 when Billberg scores a goal this season and is 6-3-2 when he posts a point.

### OUR SHARE OF OT

Extending their March 13, 2010 CHA Tournament game versus Robert Morris to overtime, the Beavers played eight overtime games during the 2009-10 season, marking its most since playing in eight in 2004-05.

In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division I, they have escaped overtime with at least a tie in 75.0 percent (60) of the 80 games that have needed extra time to decide the outcome.

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 10-5-14 in games extended to sudden death, including a 2-3-2 record in extra time in 2010-11.

### DIRECTIONS TO THE SCORING COLUMN

Freshman defenseman **Kyle Brodie** logged his first collegiate point Jan. 7, scoring in just his second collegiate start. Rookie **Jeff Jubinville**, **Anton Racklin** and **Garrett Ladd** are all still in search of their first collegiate points. Veterans **Matt Carlson** (1-1=2) and **Drew Fisher** (1-4=5) each potted their first collegiate goals Dec. 31 leaving only **Matt Hartmann** (0-0=0) as the only upperclassmen without a goal to his name.

### SCORING FROM THE BLUE LINE

The BSU defensive corps have been offensive as of late. The blueliners have posted 9-32=41 points, have contributed to the scoring in 20 of the Beavers' 26 games and are now averaging 1.57 points per game. All eight defensemen that have seen the ice this season have logged at least one point. In addition, goaltender **Dan Bakala** has even recorded a pair of assist in 2010-11.

### ASSISTANCE FROM THE CREASE

January 7, BSU's blueliners produced a goal and three assist including a helper from goaltender **Dan Bakala**. The assist was the third of his career and first to come from between the pipes for the Beavers since Bakala contributed to a goal versus Nov. 12. He needs just one more in the Beavers' remaining 14 games to match Matt Dalton for BSU's Division I-era record for assists by a goaltender in a single season. With three in his career, he is just two behind Jim Scanlan who registered five during his career.

### WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?

In his last 14 appearances, **Dan Bakala** has posted a 9-5-1 record with a pair of shutouts. During that stretch, he has a goals against average of 1.74 and has turned aside 343-of-360 shots for a .943 save percentage. In six of the 14 games, Bakala has conceded one goal or less.

### POINTS O' PLENTY

**Matt Read** posted his eighth multi-point game of the season Feb. 5 and has recorded 8-4=12 points in the Beavers' last nine games, which includes two short-handed goals, an unassisted marker, two power-play goals, a game-winner and a three assist night. He is currently second on the team in scoring with a team-high 15 goals to go with 11 assists for 26 points.

### MORE HONORS FOR BAKALA

For the third time this season, BSU goaltender **Dan Bakala** has been named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week. The award follows a series in which the junior stopped 81-of-84 shots on goal to post a .964 save percentage and a 1.47 goals against average. He is one of just three WCHA players to earn the league honor on three occasion joining Sam Brittain (DU) and John Falkner (UNO).

BSU's top offensive line will again feature **Jordan George**, **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe** this week-end after being split for the last 15 games. The trio accounted for 40 percent of BSU's goals (52) and 33 percent of its total scoring (106 pts) in 2009-10 and posted 15-18=33 in the first 11 games of this season.

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

As Bemidji State has made inroads in its development as a Division I program, its progress in the classroom has been remarkable.

In its ninth year under head coach Tom Serratore, the BSU program has become an academic juggernaut, annually dominating the Academic All-College Hockey America honor roll. In addition, BSU has had 12 College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District V selections over the last seven years and has passed the NCAA's first four Academic Progress Rate performance checks with flying colors.

Overall, the BSU men's ice hockey team carries a cumulative GPA of over 3.5.

### NCAA Academic Progress Rate

Bemidji State men's hockey received a score of 970 in the May 2009 release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score. BSU helped the sport of men's ice hockey achieve an aggregate score of 970, the third-highest of any men's sport in the Division.

The NCAA has established an APR cut rate of 925, which equates to a graduation rate of approximately 50 percent, for all NCAA Division I sports. Programs which fail to meet the cut rate when 2006-07 numbers are added to the 2005-06 and 2004-03 data risk reductions in scholarships.

### Academic All-CHA

BSU has led College Hockey America in Academic All-CHA honorees each of the last eight years. BSU placed 18 skaters on the 2008 all-academic team, surpassing its own league record set in 2003 and matched in 2004 and 2006.

BSU's 17-member group for 2010 continued its recent domination of the Academic All-CHA Team. BSU has an all-time total of 140 Academic All-CHA picks and its 132 honorees in nine years under head coach Tom Serratore leads CHA by a significant margin.

### CHA Student-Athlete of the Year

Kyle Hardwick was named 2010 CHA Student-Athlete of the year at the league's 2010 awards banquet. The honor is the second to be garnered by a member of the BSU hockey team since the leagues inception. Andrew Murray became the first player in CHA history to be named Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year, picking up the historic sweep at the 2005 CHA awards banquet. Murray, a unanimous First-Team All-CHA pick, became the first BSU skater to be named CHA Student-Athlete of the Year.

### Academic All-District V

Over the last seven years, 13 Beavers have been honored on the CoSIDA Academic All-District V At-Large Team. In 2005, Peter Jonsson became just the second BSU men's hockey player to be named Academic All-America. He was the only men's hockey player in the nation to earn First-Team laurels in 2005. He was a two-time Academic All-District V selection, so honored in 2004 and 2005.

BSU's other Academic All-District picks include Riley Weselowski (2006-07-08), Andrew Murray (2005), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Bill Methven (2003) Travis Winter (2008-09), Cody Bostock (2009) and Kyle Hardwick (2009-10).
