### PLAYER TO WATCH



**Jordan George** has played a pivotal role in the Beavers' current five-game unbeaten streak. The sophomore has recorded at least a point in five of BSU's last six games (5-2=7), which includes a pair of game-winning goals and a game-tying marker. George leads BSU in scoring with 14 goals and a team-high 17 assists. In two career games versus UND, George has 2-0=2 points.

## THE MATCH UP

Four months after the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team opened Western Collegiate Hockey Association play versus the University of North Dakota (Oct. 15-16), the Beavers hit the road this weekend to face the same Fighting Sioux squad for the team's final road trip of its inaugural season in the league. The rare Saturday-Sunday series is set to get underway Saturday at 3:37 p.m. with a 3:37 p.m. matinee Sunday to wrap up the series at Ralph Engelstad Arena.

Bemidji State (12-14-4; 8-12-4 WCHA) sets out to extend its current five-game unbeaten streak (3-0-2) this weekend. Currently in ninth place in the WCHA standings, the series will undoubtedly play a big role in shaping the first round of the WCHA Playoffs for BSU.

The Beavers are coming off a three-point weekend versus Colorado College. BSU trailed on four different occasions Friday, but managed to salvage a 5-5 tie with the Tigers. Saturday, the Beavers' special teams play was the difference, posting a pair of power-play goals to earn a 2-1 victory.

The Fighting Sioux enter the weekend toting the nation's No. 1 ranking in both major polls. UND is 22-8-3 overall, 17-6-1 in WCHA play and is also unbeaten in its last five games (4-0-1). The team is coming out of a three-point weekend at St. Cloud State University during which it played to a 3-3 tie Friday before gaining a 3-2 victory over the Huskies to wrap up the two-game league set Saturday.

Senior forward Matt Frattin leads the WCHA's most potent scoring attack (3.54 gpg) with 24-14=38 points, while ranking fifth in the nation in goal scoring (24). UND also boasts the league's best scoring defense allowing just 56 goals in 24 WCHA games for an average of 2.33 goals per game. Sophomore goaltender Aaron Dell has played a big part in the that. At 21-6-2 on the season, he leads the WCHA in goals against average (2.08) and victories (16).

## THE RIVALRY

The 2010-11 season marks a continuation of a Bemidji State-North Dakota series that has roots extending back to the early 1970s. Since the first meeting between the teams Feb. 6, 1970, UND has built a 19-1-1 advantage, including a perfect 12-1-1 mark when facing BSU in Grand Forks, N.D. Earning their only win versus UND Feb. 7, 1970 (7-5), the Beavers enter the weekend in search of their first victory over the Sioux since making the jump to the major college hockey level (1999-2000)--a stretch during which BSU is 0-16-1.

Despite UND's dominance in the series, eight of the last 13 contests have resulted in games decided by a single goal.

## THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

- The 2010-11 season represents the 12th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 55th year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sport.
- ▶ BSU owns 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- ▶ The Beavers have captured 21 conference titles in 54 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- ▶ In 2009, BSU became the first No. 16 seed to ever earn a spot in the Frozen Four. In just its 10th year at the NCAA Division I level, only one team, the 1958 Denver Pioneers, found its way to college hockey's grandest stage faster.
- ▶ BSU has developed six NHL players, six Olympians and 82 All-America honorees.
- ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 978-482-90 (.660) in 1,550 games.

## GENERAL NOTES

### THE COACHES

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State '86) is in his 10th season has an overall record of 166-138-34 (.545) as BSU's head coach. In addition to directing the Beavers to seven consecutive seasons of at least .500 hockey, Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular-season championships five times since 2003-04 and made trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2010, with a 2009 appearance in the Frozen Four. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year recipient and was *Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year Runner-up* in 2009.

► In his seventh season as head coach at North Dakota, **Dave Hakstol** has led the UND to an overall record of 177-92-27 (.644) and six consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament, which includes three Frozen Four appearances. Hakstol, a player for the Sioux from 1989-92, was an assistant at UND for four years prior to taking the reigns of the program. In 11 years since arriving at UND, Hakstol has helped the Sioux to nine NCAA Tournament berths and three WCHA titles.

### THE WCHA PREDICTIONS ARE IN...

Entering its inaugural season in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA), the Beavers garnered 46 points to finish ninth in the 40th Annual Grand Forks Herald Coaches' Poll. League coaches forecast University of North Dakota as the preseason favorite casting 10 first-place votes for the Fighting Sioux (120), which held a 15-point edge over St. Cloud State University (105), despite the Huskies collecting two first-place votes. University of Minnesota Duluth rounded out the top three with 100 points.

### ALL-AMERICA BOOKENDS

**Matt Read** became Bemidji State's 82nd All-America selection in the history of the program and second since the team made the move to the NCAA Division I ranks 12 years ago, when he was named RBK Second-Team All-America by the American Hockey Coaches' Association, following a junior season in which he scored 19-22=41 points. This season, BSU again gained national attention when defender **Brad Hunt** was selected to the USCHO.com Preseason All-America Second Team.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Matt Read** (Ilderton, Ontario) captains the Beavers during the 2010-11 campaign. Senior defenseman **Ryan Adams** (Brandon, Manitoba) and senior forward **Ian Lowe** (Bradwardine, Manitoba) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as alternate captains.

### LOOKING FOR NO. 1

The 2010-11 season marks the Beavers' first in their new home--Sanford Center. With any new building, there is a first time for everything. Junior forward **Jamie MacQueen** potted the first goal 1:52 into the Beavers' Oct. 15 games versus North Dakota. Senior **Ryan Cramer** recorded the first assist and was the first to sent to penalty box (at the 6:29 mark of the same game), and the Beavers garnered the first victory and shutout in their new facility Nov. 13, 2010 in a decisive 4-0 blanking of the University of Alaska Anchorage. The Beavers first series sweep in their new digs came over then-No. 4 Nebraska Omaha Dec. 3-4.

### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

BSU's 2010-11 move to the WCHA marks the fourth league home for the program. The Beavers entered 2010-11 with a perfect 3-0-0 mark in their league debuts, but dropped their WCHA opener, 5-2, North Dakota. As charter members of the ICHA, the Beavers defeated Lake Superior State, 3-1, Dec. 3, 1966. In its first season in the NCHA, BSU topped Wisconsin-Superior, 9-3, Dec. 10, 1980 and when the team moved to the CHA in 1999, BSU was victorious over Army Oct. 15, 5-2. The Beavers finished each of their previous inaugural league campaigns with a record of at least .500.

### PLAYING CLOSE TO HOME

Six of the 27 players on the Beavers' 2010-11 roster hail from the state of Minnesota. **Ryan Cramer** and **Drew Fisher** call International Falls their hometown, **Shea Walters** is from Hibbing and **Ben Kinne**, from St. Paul, and **Matt Hartmann**, who calls Hugo home, are from the Twin Cities-metro area. Newcomer **Sam Rendle** played his high school hockey just 90 miles down Highway 2 in Grand Rapids.

### SCORING CONTRIBUTION

Eleven BSU players have recorded at least five points this season and 22 of the Beavers' 26 rostered players have worked their way into the scoring column. Sophomore **Jordan George** leads a group of seven BSU players with at least 10 points owning 14-17=31 in the Beavers' first 30 games.

### FAMILIAR LOOK

**Tom Serratore** returns 22 letter winners from a year ago including 2010 RBK Second-Team All-America pick **Matt Read**. BSU returners enter 2010-11 season after carrying the bulk of the scoring load a year ago. Led by Read, **Jordan George**, **Brad Hunt** and **Ian Lowe**, who finished as Bemidji State's top four scorers, BSU returns 86 percent of its goals (110-of-118), 82 percent of its assists (156-of-191) and 83 percent of its scoring (266-of-319 points).

### ROAD SURGE

The Beavers have struggled to generate wins this season. BSU is 5-7-2 when playing as the visiting team in 2010-11 and is 4-6-2 in WCHA games away from Sanford Center. However, the Beavers have done quite well on the road as of late posting a 3-1-2 mark since Jan. 14 collecting eight of 12 points in the WCHA standings during that stretch.

### THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In 2010-11, three goals have been a threshold for Bemidji State. The Beavers are

0-11-1 when allowing more than two goals and are 10-3-1 when scoring at least three. BSU has won just one game this season when scoring fewer than three times--a Feb. 12 1-0 victory at Michigan Tech and have garnered one point when allowing more than two goals--a 5-5 tie with Colorado College Feb. 18.

### BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 978 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 1,000 victories. Seventeen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2010-11 BSU foe Minnesota which leads Division I with 1,628 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,600 or more all-time wins, while Michigan is second with 1,524 victories.

### KEEP 'EM UNDER TWO

In 2009-10 when BSU allowed its opponents two-or-fewer goals, it was 19-1-2. BSU finished the 37-game season, ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing a meager 2.35 goals per game, while giving up 2.22 in 18 CHA contests. This season, BSU is 12-3-2 when holding it opponent to two goals or fewer.

### THE EARLY GOAL GETS THE WIN

Of the Beavers' first 30 contests, the team to light their side of the scoreboard first has won 16 games. BSU has been first to strike in 16 contests posting a 7-5-2 (.571), while their opponents have lost just five times posting a 9-5-2 (.686) mark when scoring first.

### QUICK TO STRIKE

Scoring first in 16 of their first 30 contests of 2010-11 the Beavers have lit the lamp during the first minute of play three times in 2010-11. Even more, the Beavers have found the back of the net on their first shot on goal in six games this season.

### CLIMBING BSU'S DIVISION I ASSISTS LIST

**Brad Hunt** has accumulated 65 assists during his first 104 games, or just over two seasons, as a Beaver to settle into fourth on the BSU Division I assists list. His two assists versus Colorado College Feb. 18-19 helped him to climb past former teammate Tyler Scofield (2006-09) alone into fourth place (65). He remains four helpers shy of Andrew Murray (2001-2005) and Luke Erickson (2003-07) and a tie for second place on the list.

### BSU VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

In 2010-11 the Beavers have already played 11 games against teams holding down one of the nation's top 15 rankings, which includes three of the top four teams according to USAToday and USA Hockey Magazine. BSU is 4-5-2 versus the nation's top 15 this season. After going 0-5-1 versus nationally-ranked competition during the first two months of 2010-11, the Beavers are 4-0-1 versus the top 15 since Dec. 3.

Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 11-42-4 (.228) versus teams in the top-15. With that said, BSU is now 9-7-2 (.526) versus the top 15 since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign.

### READ MAKES IT BETTER

There is really no way to get around it, the Bemidji State men's hockey team is better when senior forward **Matt Read** is on the ice. Since stepping on campus in the fall of 2007 Read has a plus/minus rating of +58 and the Beavers are 35-13-3 when he scores a goal, but ironically, BSU is just 4-6-1 when he scores in 2010-11.

### OFFENSIVE DEFENSEMAN

Junior defenseman **Brad Hunt** has been a big factor for BSU on both ends of the ice since becoming a Beaver in 2008-09. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has been a true offensive threat--especially on the power play. As a freshman, he was third on the team scoring 9-23=32 points with a team-leading 7-16=23 coming on the man advantage. Last winter he had seven goals and a team-leading 26 assist to pace all BSU defenders, while ranking sixth among the nation's top blueliners (0.89 ppg). His 17 points (5-12=17) on the power play again paced the team. This season, he has a goal and 16 helpers and nine points (1-8=9) have come on the man advantage. He is fourth on the team in power-play scoring.

### 175 IN THE BOOKS

In his 10th season as a collegiate head coach, BSU's bench boss **Tom Serratore** recently achieved another milestone--his 175th victory as a head coach. He is 175-142-37 (.546) since inheriting the Beaver hockey program from legendary R.H. "Bob" Peters prior to the 2001-02 season. Serratore is second at the school in victories by a head coach behind Peters who posted 702 wins at BSU from 1966-2001.

## GENERAL NOTES

### READ ALL ABOUT BSU'S SCORING LEADERS

In 140 games and three-plus seasons in a green and white uniform, senior **Matt Read** has piled up 136 points (59-77=136). With an assist Dec. 10, Read surpassed Luke Erickson (2003-07) to become BSU Division I-era (since 1999-00) scoring leader. In addition, he owns the top spot in assists (77) and has surpassed Brendan Cook (2001-05) for the top spot in goals scored (59). Read is 20th on BSU's all-time scoring list.

### BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

Buoyed by career scoring numbers from **Matt Read** and **Ian Lowe**, the 2009-10 junior class led the team posting 55 goals and 52 assists for 107 points. That class, now seniors, again leads the points race with 34 goals and 43 helpers. The sophomores (17-31=48) and juniors (10-38=48) are tied for second, while the freshman class, which has 16 points (8-8=16) to its credit, rounds out the group.

### PUT IT IN THE BOOKS AFTER TWO

Since making the jump to NCAA Division I in 1999-2000, the Beavers are 151-9-12 when leading after two periods of play, which includes a perfect 8-0-0 mark in 2010-11. BSU has not lost a game when taking a lead into the third period since Jan. 18, 2008 at Colorado College--a streak spanning 48 games (46-0-2). Quinnipiac dropped a 3-2 overtime contest versus Union Feb. 5 to end its NCAA Division I-leading streak at 59 games (54-0-5) leaving BSU with the nation's longest current streak of wins without blowing a lead after two periods.

### 100

January 19, 2010, **Matt Read** became the second-fastest player in BSU's Division I history to reach the 100-point plateau (102 games).

### THE HUNT FOR POWER-PLAY GOALS

In his third season, defenseman **Brad Hunt** has piled up 13 power-play goals, including seven in 2008-09, which matched a BSU Division I-era record for power-play goals by a defender. Hunt, who potted his first power-play goal of the season Feb. 5, currently sits just one goal on the man advantage from matching Clay Simmons (1999-02) for BSU's Division I-era mark for power-play goals by a defenseman.

### SHORT-HANDED? NO PROBLEM.

**Matt Read** has BSU's only two short-handed goal in 2010-11 for a career total of eight shorties in the green and white. He currently ranks second to only Brendan Cook (9) in the BSU Division-era record book for career short-handed markers.

### DON'T CALL IT A SHUTOUT

Held scoreless in a Dec. 11 game at Wisconsin, BSU has now been shutout twice in 2010-11. The last time the Beavers were blanked three times in a season was 2000-01.

### PENALTY KILLERS...

The BSU penalty-kill has recovered from allowing three power-play goals in a 4-3 loss Saturday Jan. 8. The unit has allowed just five power-play goals in its last 10 games (39-44/.886) and has held opponents scoreless on the man advantage in 13 of its last 21 games. The unit is now at .826 (114-for-138) in penalty-kill chances this season and ranks eighth in league play at .829.

### FREAKY FRIDAY

Although Bemidji State has been victorious on Friday twice since the start of the new year, in 2010-11 BSU is a meager 3-9-3 in the first game of the weekend, while the team has experience much greater success on Saturdays posting a 9-5-1 record in the final game of a series. Despite earning a 5-5 tie versus Colorado College last weekend, the Beavers have been out scored 45-34 on Fridays this season, which includes a 38-28 deficit in 12 Friday contests in league play.

### MAN ADVANTAGE

Bemidji State is coming off a weekend versus Colorado College during which it went 3-for-6 on the power play (.500). The BSU power-play currently ranks as the league's most efficient unit scoring on over 22 percent of its opportunities (19-of-85/.224). With that said, BSU ranks 12th in the league in penalties taken with only 85 power-play opportunities in league play this season.

### BSU VS. NO. 1

Bemidji State is 1-4-0 versus the nation's top team since making the jump to the NCAA's Division I ranks prior to the 1999-2000 season. The last, and only time, the Beavers have dethroned a top-ranked team came in the form of a 3-2 win over Miami (Ohio) Nov. 27, 2009 at Ralph Engelstad Arena as a part of the Subway Holiday Classic.

### READ ON THE MAN ADVANTAGE

**Matt Read** now has 15 power-play goals during his career surpassing Clay Simmons (1999-2002) for ninth on BSU's Division I-era power-play goals scored list last weekend only to tie teammate **Ian Lowe** for eighth on the list. His next power-play goal will slide him into a tie with former teammate **Travis Winter** (16) for seventh place on the list. His six power-play goals and 7-6=13 points in the man advantage in 2010-11 leads the team.

### SHOOT THE PUCK

The Beavers out shot Colorado College in one game of last weekend's series. Friday's 27-21 advantage in shots marked just the 12th time this season the Beavers registered more shots than their opponents. BSU has been out shot 18 times in 2010-11 and has been out shot 862-757 overall and 709-577 in league play this season.

## 2009-10 RECAP NOTES

### 40-40 VISION

Junior **Matt Read** had 19-22=41 points in 2009-10 making him the first BSU player to post back-to-back 40-point seasons during a Division I career and the first since Bernie Adlyns accomplished the feat 1994-95 and 1995-96. With another 40-point season in 2010-11, Read will become the first BSU player to top 40 points in three consecutive seasons since Jamie Erb, who is tied for seventh on BSU all-time scoring list (86-94=180), posted 46, 50 and 53 between 1990-93.

### THEN THERE WERE SIX

**Matt Climie**, a 2008 graduate of Bemidji State and the Beavers' goaltender in the 2005 and 2006 National Tournament runs, was called up to join the Dallas Stars Friday April 4, 2009 and got his first NHL start the next evening. More recently, Climie was called up and saw time with the Phoenix Coyotes Dec. 20 and was recalled to meet the team in Denver Jan. 6.

Climie's trip to the NHL makes six products of the Beaver Hockey program to skate in the NHL ranks. He joins former BSU teammate **Andrew Murray** (2001-05) as the only other former Beavers currently in the NHL.

### THE KEY TO A WIN IS BILLBERG

Senior forward **Emil Billberg** has potted a career-high five goals in the first 26 games of his senior season. BSU is at 3-1-1 when Billberg scores a goal this season and is 6-3-2 when he posts a point.

### OUR SHARE OF OT

Extending their Feb. 18 game versus Colorado College to overtime, the Beavers have now played in nine overtime games during the 2010-11 season, marking its most since playing in a school-record 15 in 2002-03.

In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division I, they have escaped overtime with at least a tie in 75.6 percent (62) of the 82 games that have needed extra time to decide the outcome.

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 10-5-16 in games extended to sudden death, including a 2-3-4 record in extra time in 2010-11.

### DIRECTIONS TO THE SCORING COLUMN

Freshman forward **Jeff Jubinville** logged his first collegiate point Feb. 19, scoring in 14th collegiate appearance. The goal left fellow rookie **Garrett Ladd** and sophomore **Matt Hartmann** (0-0=0) as the only BSU skaters without a point to their name.

### SCORING FROM THE BLUE LINE

The BSU defensive corps have been offensive as of late. The blueliners have posted 9-39=48 points, have contributed to the scoring in 22 of the Beavers' 30 games and are now averaging 1.60 points per game. All eight defensemen that have seen the ice this season have logged at least one point. In addition, goaltender **Dan Bakala** has even recorded a pair of assist in 2010-11.

### ASSISTANCE FROM THE CREASE

January 7, BSU's blueliners produced a goal and three assist including a helper from goaltender **Dan Bakala**. The assist was the third of his career and first to come from between the pipes for the Beavers since Bakala contributed to a goal versus Nov. 12. He needs just one more in the Beavers' remaining 14 games to match Matt Dalton for BSU's Division I-era record for assists by a goaltender in a single season. With three in his career, he is just two behind Jim Scanlan who registered five during his career.

### WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?

In his last 16 appearances, **Dan Bakala** has posted a 9-5-2 record with a trio of shutouts. During that stretch, he has a goals against average of 1.64 and has turned aside 447-of-473 shots for a .945 save percentage. In seven of the 16 games, Bakala has conceded one goal or less.

### GOALS DOWN THE STRETCH

**Jordan George** has scored five of the Beavers' last eight goals, which included a pair of game-winning goals, and has at least a point in three of BSU's last four games. He leads the Beavers with 13-16=29 points leaving the sophomore one point shy of breaking the 30-point plateau for the second in his career. He had 13=21=34 points as a freshman in 2009-10.

### ONE-GOAL WINS...

BSU's victory at MTU Feb. 12 stands as just the sixth 1-0 in the history of the program and is the first since scoring the only goal of the game Dec. 1, 2006 to defeat Wayne State University. Since making the jump to NCAA Division I for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 2-54-7 when scoring only one goal.

### CAREER MARKS

**Jordan George** recorded his 14th goal of the season Feb. 18 establishing a new career-high for the sophomore. Lead the Beavers with 14-17=31 points this season, the Madison, Wis. native is just three points from matching his rookie total of 34 points (13-21=34). He follows teammate **Brad Hunt** as the only players of BSU's Division I-era to post at least 30 points in each of their first two collegiate seasons.

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

As Bemidji State has made inroads in its development as a Division I program, its progress in the classroom has been remarkable.

In its ninth year under head coach Tom Serratore, the BSU program has become an academic juggernaut, annually dominating the Academic All-College Hockey America honor roll. In addition, BSU has had 12 College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District V selections over the last seven years and has passed the NCAA's first four Academic Progress Rate performance checks with flying colors.

Overall, the BSU men's ice hockey team carries a cumulative GPA of over 3.5.

### NCAA Academic Progress Rate

Bemidji State men's hockey received a score of 970 in the May 2009 release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score. BSU helped the sport of men's ice hockey achieve an aggregate score of 970, the third-highest of any men's sport in the Division.

The NCAA has established an APR cut rate of 925, which equates to a graduation rate of approximately 50 percent, for all NCAA Division I sports. Programs which fail to meet the cut rate when 2006-07 numbers are added to the 2005-06 and 2004-03 data risk reductions in scholarships.

### Academic All-CHA

BSU has led College Hockey America in Academic All-CHA honorees each of the last eight years. BSU placed 18 skaters on the 2008 all-academic team, surpassing its own league record set in 2003 and matched in 2004 and 2006.

BSU's 17-member group for 2010 continued its recent domination of the Academic All-CHA Team. BSU has an all-time total of 140 Academic All-CHA picks and its 132 honorees in nine years under head coach Tom Serratore leads CHA by a significant margin.

### CHA Student-Athlete of the Year

Kyle Hardwick was named 2010 CHA Student-Athlete of the year at the league's 2010 awards banquet. The honor is the second to be garnered by a member of the BSU hockey team since the league's inception. Andrew Murray became the first player in CHA history to be named Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year, picking up the historic sweep at the 2005 CHA awards banquet. Murray, a unanimous First-Team All-CHA pick, became the first BSU skater to be named CHA Student-Athlete of the Year.

### Academic All-District V

Over the last seven years, 13 Beavers have been honored on the CoSIDA Academic All-District V At-Large Team. In 2005, Peter Jonsson became just the second BSU men's hockey player to be named Academic All-America. He was the only men's hockey player in the nation to earn First-Team laurels in 2005. He was a two-time Academic All-District V selection, so honored in 2004 and 2005.

BSU's other Academic All-District picks include Riley Weselowski (2006-07-08), Andrew Murray (2005), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Bill Methven (2003) Travis Winter (2008-09), Cody Bostock (2009) and Kyle Hardwick (2009-10).
