Beavers travel to Crookston in nonconference tilt **Soccer Notebook**

- The Beavers will face-off against Minnesota, Crookston on Tuesday afternoon in a nonconference match up before going on an 10-day break.
- Bemidji State played its first two games of the season this past weekend facing North Dakota on Friday and hosting Viterbo on Sunday. In Friday's match BSU picked up its second-ever win over UND, winning 3-1. On Sunday, the Beavers defeated Viterbo University 4-2 at the BSU Soccer Field.
- BSU will be looking to improve upon the following season after finishing sixth in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. After failing to make the playoffs in 2008, BSU returned to post-season play, but ended-up dropping the first-round playoff game to St. Cloud State in penalty kicks.
- The Beavers compiled an 11-6-2 record in 2009, marking the fifth season with 10 or more wins for head coach Jim Stone.
- Offensively, it was one of the best seasons for BSU. Scoring 46 goals scored, it was the second best effort in school history just missing the record of 53. The Beavers also tallied 46 assists, which is tied for third all-time. Last year's mark of 50 assists set the record for most in a season. Additionally, Bemidji State's 264 attempted shots marks the fifth best in school history.
- On defense the BSU soccer team really shined, setting new records in goals allowed (17) and goals against average (0.86). The 17 goals against beats the old records of 19 set in 2006 and 2008. The 0.86 goals against average mark eclipses the previous 0.89 goals against average set in 2005.
- The 2009 season saw many positives for the Beavers, especially in the record setting department. **Ashlee Ellefsen** (Sr., For., Hugo, Minn.) had a standout year, breaking the school records for most career points (80), most career goals (32), and game-winning goals (11). She also tied the school record for most assists in a season (7).
- The Beavers haven't had a losing season since 2004 and they have had nine or more wins each of the last six years.

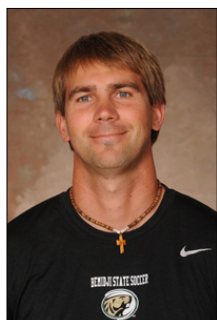

Head Coach Jim Stone



Entering his ninth year as head coach, Jim Stone is the winningest coach in Bemidji State University soccer history. Prior to his arrival in 2002, BSU had an overall record of 13-80-3. Shortly after taking the

helm, Stone created a competitive program that claimed an 11-12-0 record in 2004. Since the 2005 the soccer team has had an overall record of 52-32-19 and maintained a winning percentage of .500 or better each season.

Stone has the highest win percentage in BSU history (.516), along with the most wins (74). He is the only coach in BSU soccer history with a record higher than .500 in conference play (.506).

Under Stone's guidance BSU has garnered multiple all-region including: Kari Torgerson, Katie Meinhardt, Tegan Moehn, Ashlee Ellefsen and Alysha Domiano. BSU garnered its first-ever All-American with former goalkeeper Kari Torgerson and its second with Ashlee Ellefsen.

While Stone has been head coach his student-athletes have also excelled in the classroom with multiple athletes have been named to CoSIDA Academic All-District squads. Those include Brianna Duff, Erin Foss, Megan Wallner, Alysha Domiano, and Cristina Egnell who was also named CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Scouting North Dakota (0-3-0; 0-0-0 GWC)

- Friday's match between the Beavers and Fighting Sioux will mark the ninth contest. UND owns the current record in the series winning the first seven meetings.
- BSU's only win against UND came during the last meeting between the two teams, when the Beavers won by a 2-0 margin at home on Aug. 29, 2007.
- Last time out UND dropped a pair of non-conference home games. Falling 3-1 to Drake University on Aug. 27 and then were shutout 2-0 against UW-Green Bay on Aug. 29.
- Currently the Sioux are led by Caitlyn Haring, who has one goal and one assist so far on the season. Other goal contributors for the Sioux this season include: Francie Piche, Rachel Dallman, and Rachel Loomis, who all have scored one goal.

Scouting Viterbo University (0-3-0; 0-0-0 MCC)

- Sunday's home match will mark the first-ever meeting between the two teams.
- Last time out Viterbo lost two non-conference games, dropping a 3-2 decision to Illinois Institute of Technology in double overtime on Aug. 22. In their home opener on Aug. 26 the V-Hawks lost 5-2 against Trinity Christian College.
- The V-Hawks are led by Kelsie Golabowski with two goals. Danika Spitzer and Steph Wisen both have scored the other two goals for Viterbo.

Scouting Minnesota, Crookston (0-1-1; 0-0-0 NSIC)

- Tuesday's match will be against a familiar team, but will not count towards NSIC standings.
- The Golden Eagles are currently 0-1-1 after playing St. Joseph's College to a 0-0 tie and losing to Indiana Wesleyan 5-0.
- Key players for UMC include: Jensen Crots, Megan Flynn, Megan Gibeault, Anna Ogaard, Kaitlyn Ostergren and Amye Berg.
