NSIC semifinals pits UMD against BSU

Soccer Notebook

- After defeating No. 6 seed Augustana College 2-1 on Wednesday the No. 3 seed Beavers advance on to the semifinal round of the 2010 NSIC / US Bank Women's Soccer Tournament, the Beavers will play against No. 2 seed Minnesota Duluth on Friday at noon.
- Also advancing past the first round were No. 1 seed Winona State and No. 4 seed Minnesota State University, Mankato. With the Warriors advancing on, the semifinal and final rounds of the tournament will be held in Winona, Minn.
- **Ashlee Ellefsen** scored the first goal for the Beavers on Wednesday netting her 40th career goal in the 6th minute. Senior **Jenny Stromberg** wasn't ready to see her soccer career end and went on to score the game-winner in the final ten minutes of the game.
- The Beavers picked up numerous postseason honors as **Ashlee Ellefsen** was named the *2010 NSIC Offensive Player of the Year* and *All-NSIC First Team*. **Alysha Domiano** was named *All-NSIC Second Team* while **Jamie Ford** was named *All-NSIC Third Team*. Keeper **Samantha Ross** picked-up *All-NSIC Honorable Mention*.
- **Bri Scanlan** (Jr., Mid., East Grand Forks, Minn.) score both goals for the Beavers over the Oct. 30-31 weekend. The game-winner against Minnesota State was her third of the season.
- **Samantha Ross** recorded a career high 12 saves in Sunday's game against Minnesota State to pick up her 10th career clean sheet.
- Junior **Kari McAllen** scored her first goal of the season to lift BSU over Minot State 1-0 on Oct. 23.
- With the win over Minot State the BSU soccer team (12-3-0; 8-3-0 NSIC) tied it's record for most wins in a season with 12. The Beavers are one conference win shy of tying the school record for most conference wins in a season. A weekend sweep would set the mark at 10.
- **Ashlee Ellefsen** (Sr., For., Hugo, Minn.) keeps breaking records at BSU, and with her goal against Wayne State on Oct. 16, Ellefsen became the first player at Bemidji State to eclipse the century mark for points in a career. Still climbing in the record books, she owns the career-points record at BSU with 104, the career-goals record at BSU with 40 and the career-assists list with 24. She also owns the career-record for most game-winning goals (14).
- Along with Ellefsen, **Jamie Ford** (R-Sr., For., Edina, Minn.) is also making a name for herself in

Head Coach: Jim Stone

Head Coach Jim Stone



Entering his ninth year as head coach, Jim Stone is the winningest coach in Bemidji State University soccer history. Prior to his arrival in 2002, BSU had an overall record of 13-80-3. Shortly

after taking the helm, Stone created a competitive program that claimed an 11-12-0 record in 2004. Since the 2005 the soccer team has had an overall record of 52-32-19 and maintained a winning percentage of .500 or better each season.

Stone has the highest win percentage in BSU history (.516), along with the most wins (74). He is the only coach in BSU soccer history with a record higher than .500 in conference play (.506).

Under Stone's guidance BSU has garnered multiple all-region including: Kari Torgerson, Katie Meinhardt, Tegan Moehn, Ashlee Ellefsen and Alysha Domiano. BSU garnered its first-ever All-American with former goalkeeper Kari Torgerson and its second with Ashlee Ellefsen.

While Stone has been head coach his student-athletes have also excelled in the classroom with multiple athletes have been named to CoSIDA Academic All-District squads. Those include Brianna Duff, Erin Foss, Megan Wallner, Alysha Domiano, and Cristina Egnell who was also named CoSIDA Academic All-American.

the record books. Ford is the sole owner of the second spot on the career-points record at BSU with 77, second only to Ellefsen. Ford is in second for career-assists with 23, and in fourth for career-goals with 27.

- Assisting on Ellefsen's goal at St. Cloud State, Ford now owns the single-season record at BSU for most assists. She now has ten assists on the season.
- There have been 18 different players to record points for the Beavers, including three freshmen. 13 different players have scored goals.
- So far this season forward **Jenny Stromberg** (Sr., Elk River, Minn.) has already surpassed her career-goals total from the three previous seasons. Stromberg entered her senior year with four goals and has scored six this year, including three game-winners.
- Scoring her second goal of her career, **Bethany Fluto** (Jr., For., Bemidji, Minn.) knocked in the game-winner at Concordia-St. Paul. Both of her career goals have been game winners and have come this season.
- **Alysha Domiano** (Sr., Def., Dayton, Minn.) ended a two-year scoring drought on Sept. 18 when she scored the game-winning goal of the game against MSU Moorhead. She also picked up an assist on Sept. 19 against Minnesota, Crookston.
- **Samantha Lumberg** (Fr., D/M, Woodbury, Minn.) picked up her first collegiate point on Sept. 18 when she assisted on the second goal of the game against MSU Moorhead.
- The Sept. 7 game against Minnesota, Crookston saw **Mallory Lowe** (So., Def., Lino Lakes, Minn.) and **Danni Steele** (Fr., M/D, Mankato, Minn.) pick up their first-collegiate points each recording an assist.
- In the Sept. 7 game, red-shirt sophomore **Analey Skog** (For., St. Francis, Minn.) recorded one goal and one assist. Both were her firsts for the season.
- Freshman **Jessie Voeller** (For., White Bear Lake, Minn.) has had an amazing start for the Beavers, netting two goals and picking up two assists.
- Senior goalkeeper **Samantha Ross** (Stillwater, Minn.) was named NSIC Defensive Player of the Week for her efforts in net against the UMC on Sept. 7. En route to her fifth career shutout, Ross turned away six shots on goal en route to her second win on the season. With a 2-0-0 record to start the season, she also has a 0.67 goals against average and a .917 save percentage since the season has begun.
- Ellefsen was recognized for her production on the field against North Dakota University and Viterbo University over the Sept. 3-5 weekend. She netted two goals for the Beavers over the weekend, both proving to be game winners. In Grand Forks, N.D., Ellefsen scored the second goal of the game at the 56th minute mark. Following up against Viterbo, she scored the third goal of the game for the Beavers in the 72nd minute helping clinch the win. On the weekend she had 6 shots on goal, three in each game.

Scouting No. 2 Minnesota Duluth (10-5-2, 10-3 NSIC)

- The Bulldogs advanced to the semifinals over U-Mary with a score of 1-0. UMD scored their lone goal of a penalty kick that was awarded to them in the 68th minute. Bulldog keeper Hannah Bengston made eight saves in the match.
- In the UMD win over SMSU, the lone goal of the game was scored at the 26:51 mark when Lloyd headed the ball past SMSU goalkeeper Kendra Olchesfke to give the Bulldogs a 1-0 lead that will stand for the entirety of the match. The Woodbury, Minn. native was unassisted in her fourth goal of the 2010 season.
- Earlier this season, UMD downed the Beavers 1-0 on Oct. 22.

Scouting No. 1 Winona State (10-5-2, 10-3 NSIC)

- The Warriors advanced to the semifinals after downing Upper Iowa 3-1. Winona State's Jordyn Strege scored twice for the Warriors and Jennifer Deroo scored once.
- Winona State's Jennifer Deroo was named the 2010 NSIC Newcomer of the Year while WSU's keeper Anna Belpedio was named the 2010 NSIC Defensive Player of the Year.
- The Warriors had a total of seven players make the first or second All-NSIC teams.
- Winona State clinched its tenth NSIC Regular Season Championship with a 5-1 win over MSU Moorhead. The Warriors have claimed the last seventh NSIC titles and ten overall.
- Earlier this season the Beavers were the only team to deliver the Warriors a loss in conference action. BSU downed the Warriors 3-2 at the BSU Soccer Complex on Sept. 25. **Brianna Duff**, **Ashlee Ellefsen**, and **Bri Scanlan** all combined to score goals for the Beavers in the game. Ellefsen also assisted on both Duff's and Scanlan's goals.

Scouting No. 4 Minnesota State (10-7-1, 8-4-1 NSIC)

- The Mavericks advanced to the semifinals after defeating St. Cloud State 3-1. Brittany Henry scored twice for the Mavericks, in the 31st and 65th minutes, while Laura Leber scored the first goal of the game for MSU.
- MSU finished the NSIC in fourth place with a 8-4-1 record.
- The Mavericks have scored 37 goals this season, giving up 23.
- Sophomore forward Brittany Henry leads the team with ten goals and one assist.
- 26 of the 37 goals have been scored by underclassmen.
- .483 percent of the MSU shots taken have been on goal.
- Doher and Henry collect a total of 60 shots on goal.
- Senior forward Leber has 92 career points, good for fourth all-time at Minnesota State.
- MSU plays St. Cloud State Wednesday at 2 p.m., the two teams met earlier this season with the Mavericks earning a 1-0 victory.
- Minnesota State is 6-1 at home in NSIC action.
- Earlier this season the Beavers defeated the Mavericks 1-0 in Mankato, Minn. to claim the third place finish in the conference. **Bri Scanlan** scored the lone goal for the Beavers in the victory.
