PLAYER TO WATCH

Senior blueliner **Brad Hunt** has experienced a tremendous amount of success during his career when playing Ala.-Huntsville. In 15 games played, the defender has 5-13=18 points, which includes three power-play tallies and a game-winning goal. In addition, he is a +10 versus the Chargers.

THE MATCH UP

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team continues its six-game homestand this weekend as it welcomes University of Alabama-Huntsville to Sanford Center for a nonconference series.

The Beavers, 7-9-2 overall and 5-7-2 in Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) play, return to action after a WCHA series split versus then-No. 13 University of Denver. The Beavers let a one-goal lead slip late in the series opener, 3-2, but bounced back for a 2-1 victory in the finale to salvage two points in the league standings.

Offensively, BSU is lead by senior defenseman **Brad Hunt** (3-12=15) and junior forward **Jordan George** (11-4=15). Hunt leads the team with 12 assists this season and became the Beavers' Division I-era assists leader Dec. 10 posting his 79th collegiate helper. George has a team-best 11 goals on the season with nine in WCHA play to sit tied for seventh in the league. It's been goalie by committee through BSU's first 18 games as all three of the team's goaltenders have seen time between the pipes. **Andrew Walsh** improved to 3-2-1 with a career-best 36-save performance versus Denver Dec. 10. He owns team-bests in goals against average (2.82) and save percentage (.914). **Dan Bakala** is 4-6-1 in 13 appearances and has received the nod in nine of the team's last 11 contests. Defensively speaking, BSU owns the WCHA's top-ranked penalty-kill unit (52-of-60/.867) and has allowed just one power-play goal in 23 opportunities dating back to Nov. 19 (.956).

Alabama-Huntsville (1-17-1), comes into this weekend's series after being swept at Minnesota State University, Mankato last weekend dropping games of 4-2 and 9-1 to the Mavericks.

Freshman forward Kyle Lysaght leads a UAH attack averaging one goal per game this season with 5-4=9 points. Junior Justin Cseter is the team's top assist man with five. Clarke Saunders, UAH's sophomore goaltender, has shouldered the bulk of the goaltending duties seeing time in 16 games this season. He has a .911 save percentage and a 3.58 GAA.

THE RIVALRY

The Bemidji State/Ala.-Huntsville rivalry got its start March 11, 1994. The Beavers hold a 36-28-4 lead in the all-time series including a dominant 24-3-3 mark versus the Chargers since Mar. 3, 2006. The Beavers enter this weekend's two-game set unbeaten by UAH in 17 of the last 19 meetings (15-2-2).

In addition to being charter members of College Hockey America, these teams have a long-standing, bitter rivalry dating back to the NCAA Division II days. The Chargers and Beavers met in the national tournament on four occasions with BSU defeating UAH for NCAA Division II titles in 1994 and at John S. Glas Fieldhouse in 1997.

THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2011-12 season represents the 13th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 56th year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sport.

- ▶ BSU owns 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- ▶ The Beavers have captured 21 conference titles in 55 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- ▶ In 2009, BSU became the first No. 16 seed to ever earn a spot in the Frozen Four. In just its 10th year at the NCAA Division I level, only one team, the 1958 Denver Pioneers, found its way to college hockey's grandest stage faster.
- ▶ BSU has developed seven NHL players, six Olympians and 82 All-America honorees.
- ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 987-495-92 (.657) in 1,574 games.

GENERAL NOTES

THE COACHES

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State '86) is in his 11th season and has an overall record of 184-154-40 (.539) as BSU's head coach. In addition to directing the Beavers to seasons of at least .500 hockey in seven of the last eight seasons, Serratore's teams won CHA regular-season championships five times since 2003-04 and made trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2010, with a 2009 appearance in the Frozen Four. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year recipient and was *Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year Runner-up* in 2009.

► **Chris Luongo** has led the Chargers to a 5-43-3 overall record in two seasons as a collegiate head coach. He was promoted to his current position after two seasons as the Chargers' top assistant. An NHL defenseman with the Detroit Red Wings, Luongo played collegiate hockey at Michigan State University, where he was a member of the Spartans' 1986 national championship team.

LAST WEEK FOR THE BEAVERS

After the Beavers let a one-goal lead slip away in the WCHA series opener versus No. 17 Denver, 3-2, BSU used a career-high 36-save performance from Andrew Walsh to bounce back and salvage a series split and two points in the WCHA standings with a 2-1 victory in the finale. Ben Kinne scored the game-winner for BSU.

LAST TIME VERSUS ALA.-HUNTSVILLE

The Beavers last met the Chargers Jan. 7-8, 2001 at the Von Braun Center in Huntsville, Ala. Dan Bakala stopped 16 of 17 shots and Kyle Brodie scored his first collegiate goal, which stood as the game-winner, to take game 1 3-1. UAH jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first period of game 2 and despite a pair of third-period goals by BSU, the Beavers could not catch the Chargers, 4-3. The UAH victory snapped a series-long 13-game unbeaten streak by the Beavers.

BEAVERS PICKED TO FINISH TENTH

Western Collegiate Hockey Association coaches picked Bemidji State to finish 10th in the 41st Annual Grand Forks Herald Preseason Coaches' Poll. A tenth-place finish is just where the Beavers end the 2010-11 season with a 8-15-5 mark in league play. The Beavers garnered 30 points in the poll to six points behind University of Alaska-Anchorage. Denver University was forecast as the favorite to win the 2011-12 regular-season and the MacNaughton Cup. The Pioneers garnered seven of 12 first-place votes and 115 points to edge University of North Dakota (110).

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Junior forward **Ben Kinne** (St. Paul, Minn.) will captain the Beavers during the 2011-12 campaign. Senior defenseman **Brad Hunt** (Ridge Meadows, British Columbia) and junior blueliner **Jake Areshenko** (Port Coquitlam, British Columbia) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as alternate captains.

PLAYING CLOSE TO HOME

Seven of the 28 players on the Beavers' 2011-12 roster hail from the state of Minnesota. **Drew Fisher** calls International Falls his hometown, **Shea Walters** is from Hibbing, **Sam Rendle** is from Grand Rapids and **Ben Kinne**, from St. Paul, **Danny Mattson**, from Minneapolis, **Matt Hartmann**, who calls Hugo home, and **Sam Windle**, from Maple Grove, are from the Twin Cities-metro area.

FAMILIAR LOOK

Tom Serratore returns 20 letter winners from a year ago including **Jordan George** and **Brad Hunt**. George posted a career-high 17-19=36 points in 2010-11 to lead the team, while Hunt registered 3-18=21 to finish fourth on the team. BSU returns 59 percent of scoring for a year ago, which includes 62 percent of its assist scoring (90-of-145), 49 percent of its goal scoring (43-of-89).

HOME SWEET HOME

The Beavers had to adapt to playing on the road quickly in 2011-12 as eight of their first 10 games of the season took place away from home in a string that concluded Nov. 5. Now BSU finds itself in the midst of playing 10-of-12 games at Sanford Center to wrap up the calendar year. The Beavers are 3-6-1 on the road this season and are 4-3-1 at home.

THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In 2010-11, the three-goal mark was a threshold for Bemidji State. The Beavers were 0-15-2 when allowing more than two goals and were 13-3-2 when scoring at least three. That trend has continued into 2011-12. This season, BSU is 5-1-2 when scoring in excess of three goals, and is 2-8-0 when scoring fewer than three.

SUCCESS VERSUS ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE

Brad Hunt leads all current Beavers in play versus Ala.-Huntsville. The senior has 5 goals and 15 assists for 18 point sin 15 games versus the Chargers. He is a +10 and has three power-play goals and a game-winning goal.

QUICK TO STRIKE

BSU is 4-3-1 when scoring first in 2011-12. Even more, the Beavers have found the back of the net on their first shot on goal in three times this season and scored on one of its first three shots on goal seven times. Scoring first in 20 of 38 contests of 2010-11 the Beavers lit the lamp during the first minute of play three times a year ago. BSU was 10-8-2 when scoring first.

GENERAL NOTES

BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 988 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 1,010 victories. Seventeen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2011-12 BSU foe Minnesota which leads Division I with 1,645 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,600 or more all-time wins, while Michigan is second with 1,542 victories.

180 IN THE BOOKS

In his 11th season as a collegiate head coach, BSU's bench boss **Tom Serratore** recently achieved another milestone—his 180th victory as a head coach in a 6-5 triumph over Michigan Tech Oct. 21, 2011. He is 184-154-40 (.540) since inheriting the Beaver hockey program from legendary R.H. "Bob" Peters prior to the 2001-02 season. Serratore is second at the school in victories by a head coach behind Peters, who posted 702 wins at BSU from 1966-2001.

CLIMBING BSU'S DIVISION I ASSISTS LIST

Brad Hunt has accumulated 79 assists during his first 130 games, or just over three complete seasons as a Beaver to surpass BSU great Matt Read (2007-11) to sit atop the BSU Division I assists list and match Paul Ferry (1989-93) and Chris Morque (1990-94) for second on BSU's all-time assist-scoring by defensemen list. Terry Mattson (1986-89), father of current Beaver freshman Danny Mattson, currently holds that title after piling up 81 helpers during his collegiate career.

BSU VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

In 2010-11 the Beavers played 17 games against teams holding down one of the nation's top 15 rankings, which included three of the top four teams according to USA Today and USA Hockey Magazine. BSU was 7-8-2 versus the nation's top 15 last season. After going 0-5-1 versus nationally-ranked competition during the first two months of 2010-11, the Beavers are 8-4-1 versus the top 15 since Dec. 3. BSU is 3-7-0 versus the nationally-ranked in 2011-12.

Since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 17-52-4 (.254) versus teams in the top-15. With that said, BSU is now 15-17-2 (.469) versus the top 15 since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign.

OFFENSIVE DEFENSEMAN

Junior defenseman **Brad Hunt** has been a big factor for BSU on both ends of the ice since becoming a Beaver in 2008-09. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has been a true offensive threat—especially on the power play. As a freshman, he was third on the team scoring 9-23=32 points with a team-leading 7-16=23 coming on the man advantage. As a sophomore he had seven goals and a team-leading 26 assists to pace all BSU defenders, while ranking sixth among the nation's top blue-liners (0.89 ppg). His 17 points (5-12=17) on the power play again paced the team. Last season, he had two goals and 18 helpers. Twelve points (2-10=12) came on the man advantage to place him fourth on the team in power-play scoring. This season he enters the 11th week of play leading the team (3-12=15) in scoring and has three power-play points (0-3=3).

COMEBACK KIDS

Through 18 games of the 2011-12 campaign, the Beavers have trailed in all but three games. In 1,094:19 minutes of play this season, BSU has had the lead for just 376:39 and 56:34 of lead time came in a 2-1 victory versus No. 13 Denver Dec. 10.

THE HUNT FOR POWER-PLAY GOALS

In his fourth season, defenseman **Brad Hunt** has piled up 14 power-play goals, including seven in 2008-09, which matched a BSU Division I-era record for power-play goals by a defender. Hunt is currently tied with Clay Simmons (1999-02) for BSU's Division I-era mark for power-play goals by a defenseman. Hunt's last power-play goal came Mar. 4, 2011 versus Minnesota—23 games ago—the longest PPG drought of his career.

BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

This season's juniors currently lead BSU's scoring race with 24-28=52 points after 2-5=7 points versus Denver Dec. 9-10. Next is the senior class with 14-19=33 points, followed by the sophomores (4-12=17). The BSU freshman class has a goal and seven assists to its credit

DON'T CALL IT A SHUT-OUT

BSU was held without a goal Oct. 29 at Minnesota Duluth. The shutout marked the first time the Beavers were scoreless in a game since a Dec. 11, 2010 game at Wisconsin.

PENALTY KILLERS...

The BSU penalty-kill unit finished the weekend series versus Denver a perfect 8-for-8 (1.00). On the season, BSU is now 66-for-78 (.846), which includes snuffing our 52-60 (.867) opponent power plays in WCHA play to lead the league in efficiency.

FREAKY FRIDAY

BSU was a meager 4-10-4 in the first game of the weekend series in 2010-11, while the team has experience much greater success, a 10-7-1 record, in the final game of a series. Ironically, this season BSU is 3-4-2 on Friday this season and 4-5-0 on Saturday.

MAN ADVANTAGE

The Beavers finished their WCHA series versus Denver going 1-for-5 (.200) on the man advantage and have now scored a power-play goal in four of five games. The Beavers are 11-for-55 (.200) on the power-play this season, with a 10-or-44 (.227) on the man advantage in league play to rank fourth.

WALTERS-POWERED POWER PLAY

Shea Walters leads all BSU players with 3-4-7 points on the power-play, with 2-4=6 coming in WCHA play to share the No. 19 spot among league players.

THEN THERE WERE SEVEN

Matt Read, a 2011 graduate of Bemidji State and the Beavers' Division I-era scoring leader, made the Philadelphia Flyers' 2011-12 opening-day roster and scored his first NHL goal in the Flyer's second game of the season.

Read's trip to the NHL makes seven products of the Beaver Hockey program to skate in the NHL ranks. He joins former BSU goaltender Matt Clime (2005-2009) and his teammate Andrew Murray (2001-05) as the only other former Beavers currently in the NHL.

ITS SHARE OF OT

Extending their March 17 WCHA Final Five quarterfinal game versus Minnesota Duluth to overtime, the Beavers completed the 2010-11 season playing in 12 overtime games, marking its most since playing in a school-record 15 in 2002-03.

In the 11 years since the Beavers moved to Division I, they have escaped overtime with at least a tie in 76 percent (67) of the 88 games that have needed extra time to decide the outcome.

Since March 11, 2006, BSU is 12-6-19 in games extended to sudden death, including a 1-0-2 record in extra time in 2011-12.

SHOOT THE PUCK

BSU has been out shot in 15 of its 18 games this season. BSU was out shot 28-23 Dec. 9 and 37-24 Dec. 10 versus DU. The Beavers trail their opponents 562-418 (-8.0 spg) on the season, which includes a 461-326 (-9.6 spg) differential in WCHA games. BSU is 4-9-2 when being out shot this season and 2-0-0 when out shooting its foes with a win in its only game with the shots even.

DIRECTIONS TO THE SCORING COLUMN

With nine new faces in the BSU line up, the opening of the WCHA season brings with it many collegiate firsts--games, goals, assists. Freshman Mitch Cain and junior transfer David Boehm were the first of BSU's new faces to log a point. Sophomore Garrett Ladd and junior Matt Hartmann (0-0=0) remain the only BSU veterans without a point to their name.

ASSISTANCE FROM THE GREASE

January 7, BSU's blueliners produced a goal and three assists including a helper from goaltender Dan Bakala. The assist was the third of his career and first to come from between the pipes for the Beavers since Bakala contributed to a goal Nov. 12. With three in his career, he is just two behind Jim Scanlan who holds BSU's all-time record with five during his career.

THIRD PERIOD WOES

BSU was out scored 3-1 in the third periods of its Dec. 9-10 series versus DU, BSU has struggled to generate scoring in the final period of 2011-12 games. BSU has now been out scored 24-10 in the third period of 2011-12 games, which includes a 20-8 deficit in the third period of WCHA contests. Only Alaska-Anchorage has scored fewer goals in the third period this season (7). On the flip side, nobody in the WCHA has allowed more third period goals than BSU (20).

1-0 WINS...

BSU's victory versus UND Nov. 20 seventh 1-0 victory in the history of the program. Since making the jump to NCAA Division I for the 1999-2000 campaign, BSU is 3-57-7 when scoring only one goal.

GENERAL NOTES

IT'S A FINE LINE...

Last season, 19 of BSU's 38 games were decided by one goal or less, which included seven one-goal losses by the Beavers. Bemidji State was 7-7-5 in games decided by a goal or less. BSU is 4-4-0 in one-goal games this season.

ANOTHER GOAL FOR WALTERS

With a pair of goals in the LSSU series Nov. 4-5, Shea Walters established a new career-high single-season goal scoring total. His previous high water mark came in 2008-09 when he recorded four goals as a freshman.

I AM IRON MAN

Brad Hunt is BSU's current Ironman. Since stepping on campus in the fall of 2008, he has dressed and played in each of the Beavers' 130 games consecutively. Matt Read set a new mark for game played during BSU's Division I era a year ago, playing in 147 games for BSU, which included 143 straight to begin his career.

THE HUNT FOR 100 IS OVER

Alternate Captain Brad Hunt scored the game-winning goal in a 3-1 victory at St. Cloud State Dec. 3 eclipsing the 100-point plateau. During his three seasons in the green and white, he has accumulated 22-79=101 points to climb to sixth on BSU's all-time defense-men scoring list. With two points this weekend, he will match Paul Ferry (1989-93) for fifth on the all-time list with 103 career points and will bypass Brendan Cook (2001-05), who recorded 55-47=102 points as a Beaver, to hold down the fourth spot on BSU's Division I-era scoring list.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

BSU captain Ben Kinne is back in action this season after missing the entire 2010-11 season after suffering a stroke in the offseason. He has been practicing, is in good health and has played in each of the Beavers first 16 games. In his first two seasons at BSU he piled up 18-21=39 points and played a significant role on BSU's power-play and penalty-kill units. He has 5-3=8 points in 2011-12.

BLUELINE'S OFFENSIVE PUSH

The Beavers' got three assists from its defensive corps Dec. 9-10 versus DU. Beaver defensemen have now scored in 14 of BSU's 18 games this season and have accounted seven goals and 24 assists (7-24=31) accounting for 25 percent of BSU total scoring with an average of 1.72 points per game in 2011-12.

IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

After eight of their first 10 games on the road, the Beavers are glad to be back on home ice for eight of 10. No two players are more excited to be back home than **Jordan George** and **Brad Hunt**. Eight of George's team leading 15 points have come in eight games at Sanford Center, while Hunt has registered six of his team-best 12 helpers at home.

HINTS AT THE OUTCOME

The Beavers are 16-2-3 since 2008-09 when captain **Ben Kinne** scores a goal. This season Kinne has five goals and BSU is 3-1-1 in those contests. Alternate captain **Jake Areshenko** scored less frequently, but has the same effect on the game's outcome. BSU is 8-2-3 when he logs a point and 2-0-0 when he scores a goal.

WCHA LAURELS FOR WALSH

Freshman goaltender **Andrew Walsh** was named *WCHA Rookie of the Week* Dec. 13 after a career-best 36-save victory over Denver--marking the second time this season, the Dawson Creek, B.C. native has been recognized by the league and the third time a member of the BSU hockey program has been selected for the honor this season. Walsh also earned the league's top defensive award Oct. 25 and Brad Hunt was selected last week.

RENDLE OUT OF COMMISSION

Sophomore blueliner Sam Rendle is out for the season electing to have surgery to repair his injured shoulder over the semester break. He posted 3-8=11 points in 34 games for the Beavers as a freshman a year ago. Rendle has experience more success versus Denver than any other current BSU player. He has two goals in three games versus DU.

HAPPY TO HELP

Junior blueliner Jake Areshenko posted two assists in the Beavers Dec. 9 contest versus Denver marking the multi-point game in the blueliner's career.

ANYONE INTERESTED A SHORT-HANDED GOAL?

This season BSU has just one short-handed goal and that came off the stick of injured **Sam Rendle** Oct. 7 at Miami--the Beavers' first game of 2011-12. Only two players in BSU's lineup have a short-handed goal **Ben Kinne** (3/7/09) and **Jordan George** (2/12/10). Since moving to the NCAA Division I level for the 1999-2000 season, BSU lowest single-season total for shorties is three in 2002-03, 2007-08 and 2010-11.

BEAVERS AT SANFORD CENTER

This season BSU is 4-3-1 on its home ice. Last year, the Beavers first in Sanford Center, BSU didn't log its fifth victory until Feb. 19 (5-7-2).

NONCONFERENCE ACTION

The Beavers are 2-2-0 in nonconference play this season, but all four games have been played on the road. BSU was 1-1-0 in non-WCHA play at home last year.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

As Bemidji State has made inroads in its development as a Division I program, its progress in the classroom has been remarkable.

In its 11th year under head coach Tom Serratore, the BSU program has become an academic juggernaut, annually dominating the academic honor roll while members of College Hockey America and have now carried that tradition on to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. In addition, BSU has had 14 College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District V selections over the last eight years and has passed the NCAA's first five Academic Progress Rate performance checks with flying colors.

Overall, the BSU men's ice hockey team carries a cumulative GPA of over 3.5.

NCAA Academic Progress Rate

Bemidji State men's hockey received a score of 970 in the May 2009 release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score. BSU helped the sport of men's ice hockey achieve an aggregate score of 970, the third-highest of any men's sport in the Division.

The NCAA has established an APR cut rate of 925, which equates to a graduation rate of approximately 50 percent, for all NCAA Division I sports. Programs which fail to meet the cut rate when 2006-07 numbers are added to the 2005-06 and 2004-03 data risk reductions in scholarships.

Academic All-WCHA

BSU led College Hockey America in Academic All-CHA honorees each of its final eight years in the league. In 2010-11, the Beavers began a new tradition of excellence in the WCHA. BSU led the Association with 21 of its 26-man roster earning a place on the Academic All-WCHA squad. In addition, Bemidji State placed a league-leading 11 players selected for the WCHA's prestigious Scholar Athlete award.

BSU has an all-time total of conference 161 Academic picks at the NCAA Division I level and 153 honorees have come in the last 10 years under head coach Tom Serratore.

CHA Student-Athlete of the Year

Kyle Hardwick was named 2010 CHA Student-Athlete of the year at the league's 2010 awards banquet. The honor is the second to be garnered by a member of the BSU hockey team since the league's inception. Andrew Murray became the first player in CHA history to be named Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year, picking up the historic sweep at the 2005 CHA awards banquet. Murray, a unanimous First-Team All-CHA pick, became the first BSU skater to be named CHA Student-Athlete of the Year.

Academic All-District V

Over the last eight years, 14 Beavers have been honored on the CoSIDA Academic All-District V At-Large Team. In 2005, Peter Jonsson became just the second BSU men's hockey player to be named Academic All-America. He was the only men's hockey player in the nation to earn First-Team laurels in 2005. He was a two-time Academic All-District V selection, so honored in 2004 and 2005.

BSU's other Academic All-District picks include Riley Weselowski (2006-07-08), Andrew Murray (2005), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Bill Methven (2003) Travis Winter (2008-09), Cody Bostock (2009), Kyle Hardwick (2009-10) and Ryan Adams (2010-11).

BEMIDJI STATE HEAD COACH TOM SERRATORE

Bemidji State '87 / 11th season at BSU

- Five-Time CHA Coach of the Year (2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010)
- Five-Time Spencer Penrose Award Finalist (2002, 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010)

Conventional sports wisdom has long contended it is never wise to follow a legend. However, sporting a remarkable laundry-list of achievements after nearly nine years as head coach at Bemidji State, it appears Tom Serratore is more than comfortable in the role.

The legacy Serratore was asked to continue upon accepting the role as Bemidji State's seventh head coach in 2001 is one of the finest in all of collegiate athletics. Serratore walks by the trophy case on his way to practice each day, in full view of the 13 small-college national championship trophies enshrined therein, trophies won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters.

Serratore not only had the challenge of inheriting one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, he also was called to oversee its growth into a Division I program.

While Serratore will be the first to admit he'll not be able to replicate Peters' achievements, there can be little doubt the program is in the right hands.

BSU finished 4-26-4 in 2000-01, the year before Serratore took control of the program. He led BSU to a 12-18-5 record during his rookie campaign and increased BSU's win total each of the four years that followed. BSU finished 23-13-1 in 2004-05, giving the Beavers a school-record for wins in a Division I season and back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time as a Division I program. In 2008-09 Serratore led the Beavers through the regular season to post their fourth CHA championship in six years before their third CHA Tournament championship, the program's first NCAA Division I Tournament victory and a chance represent the university and the CHA in the Frozen Four for the first time. The 2009-10 campaign served as the Beaver's last as a member of College Hockey America and Serratore's BSU squad went out with a bang. The team posted a 23-10-4 overall record with a 14-3-1 mark in CHA play en route to the team's third consecutive league regular-season championship and fifth in nine seasons as members of the league. Bemidji State capped the season by earning its first at-large bid and its fourth appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Under Serratore's guidance, 28 BSU skaters earned All-CHA honors, including two-time First-Team All-CHA picks Marty Goulet (2002-03), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Matt Climie (2006-07), Travis Winter (2006-07), Cody Bostock (2007-08), Brad Hunt (2009-2010) and Matt Read (2009-2010) with four Beavers earning CHA Rookie of the Year laurels. BSU had multiple skaters named First-Team All-CHA seven of its final eight seasons in the league, including a school-record three first-teamers in 2003.

Academic excellence has been a staple of the BSU program under Serratore and that trend has continued in the WCHA. The Beavers had a 21 skaters named to the 2010-11 WCHA All-Academic Team with 11 players earning WCHA Scholar Athlete laurels--both numbers were far and away the highest among league member institutions. Under Serratore's guidance have a league-high 153 student-athletes have been named to conference all-academic teams over the last 10 years. In addition, BSU has had nine CoSIDA Academic All-District V selections during his reign, including 2005 First-Team Academic All-America selection Peter Jonsson.

Serratore's achievements have not gone unnoticed. He is a five-time CHA Coach of the Year, winning the honor in 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2010 in 10 years as a collegiate head coach he has been named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the American Hockey Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year, five times, including a runner-up finish in 2009.

Serratore took the reigns as the seventh head coach at Bemidji State in 2001 after having spent the previous three seasons as the associate head coach for Peters. Prior to coming to BSU, Serratore spent five years

OXFORD, Ohio (Steve Cady Arena) -- Junior forward Aaron McLeod scored twice and the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team got two goals in the final 6:10 of play to defeat No. 1 Miami University 5-3 at Steve Cady Arena in Oxford, Ohio.

After a shaky first period, BSU seemed to get better as the game rolled on. The tentative Beavers got whistled for a penalty early and the RedHawks capitalized, taking a 1-0 lead on a goal just 2:10 into the game. The power-play marker came off the backhand of Curtis McKenzie.

BSU regrouped after allowing the early goal and despite trailing 1-0, held a 7-4 edge in shots on goal.

Bemidji State shook the butterflies before the second period and knotted the score just 1:44 in.

McLeod finished an end-to-end rush putting the puck over the shoulder of Cody Reichard for BSU's first goal of the 2011-12 season. Sophomore Jeff Jubenville earned an assist on the play after carrying the puck into the neutral zone, fighting through a hook and put the puck on the stick of McLeod between the circles.

The momentum would quickly switch ends as it took the top-ranked RedHawks just 1:32 to regain the lead (3:16). Chris Wideman funneled the puck to the net and Blake Coleman deflected it past BSU goaltender Dan Bakala and into the back of the cage.

Entering the final frame trailing by a goal, the Beavers netted four goals to solidify the win.

Just over five minutes in (5:08), Jake Areshenko potted his second collegiate goal unleashing a shot from the point that glanced off the left post and off the skate of MU goaltender Reichard before sliding beyond the goal line. McLeod picked up his second point of the night as he and senior defender Brad Hunt earned assists on the scoring play.

McLeod would give the Beavers their first lead of the game, 3-2, when he netted and unassisted goal at the 8:30 mark of the period, but BSU would not make it easy on itself. Drew Fisher was whistled for a penalty with 6:10 left in the game. It took 1:40, but MU connected on its second power-play of the night when Alex Wideman tucked a rebound past Bakala.

Bemidji State would gain momentum and the lead less than three minutes later (18:05). Darcy Findlay intercepted a pass out of the corner and buried a backhand to put the Beavers up 4-3.

BSU was called for its sixth penalty of the game immediately following the goal setting the RedHawks up on the man advantage for the final 1:50 of regulation. MU would later pull its goaltender, but David Boehm came up with the puck, found Sam Rendle and the Grand Rapids, Minn. native secured the 5-3 win with an empty-net goal.

Bakala made 17 saves in the game, collecting his first win of the season (1-0-0). In the loss, Reichard (0-1-0) turned away 19 BSU shots and allowed four goals.

Tonight's game was a momentous occasion for three BSU players. Boehm, Matt Prapavessis and Tyler Tosunian each made their debuts for the Beavers.

BSU has now won 41 of 56 season-openers all time and is 2-3-0 versus Miami, with both wins coming over the RedHawks when they carried the nations No. 1 ranking.

The Beavers put the RedHawks on a 5-on-3 power-play opportunity late in the second frame to allow MU to tie the score 2-2 and a power-play miscue led to the short-handed, go-ahead goal with just under five minutes to go in the third.

For the second consecutive night, Miami was the first to light the scoreboard. Tomassoni took a pass from Austin Czarnik and beat BSU goaltender Dan Bakala at the 8:06 mark of the first period to put MU up 1-0.

Trailing 1-0 to open the second period, Shea Walters collected a loose puck on the doorstep and buried his first goal of the season. Hunt got the play started with a shot from the blueline. Orban picked up the shot off the boards and left it in front for Walters and the Beavers converted their first power-play chance of the season.

Just over six minutes later (10:20) the Beavers took the lead, 2-1, when Jordan George put a rebound past the Miami goaltender Connor Knapp for his first tally of 2011. Captain Ben Kinne and Hunt were credited with assists on the play.

Following the goal BSU's Radoslav Ilo and Jake Areshenko were called for slashing penalties separated by just 14 seconds that gave the RedHawks a 1:46 5-on-3 opportunity. Miami took full advantage of the chance scoring the equalizing goal just 63 seconds later on a Chris Wideman slapshot from the blueline.

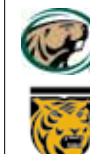

Each teamed completed the night 1-for-4 on the man advantage, with MU's short-handed marker standing as the decisive goal.

Jake Areshenko funneled the puck toward the net and Brance Orban, who centered the puck to the slot, were credited with assists on the scoring play.

CC regained the lead, 2-1, eight minutes later (14:40) on its second 4-on-4 goal of the game. Jaden Schwartz scored his first goal of the season after holding the puck long enough to force BSU goaltender Dan Bakala to commit and buried a shot in the virtually open net.

The Tigers' lead swelled to 3-1 at the 5:45 mark of the third period. Defender Michael Boivin beat Bakala with a backhand from the left circle.

With 2:00 minutes left in regulation, BSU Head Coach Tom Serratore pulled BSU's goaltender in favor of an extra attacker and just moments into play, the tactic resulted in a Brad Hunt slap shot ringing off the left post, but that was as close as the Beavers would come. Although the team held the puck in the zone for all but the final 10 seconds, it was unable to get the puck through traffic to find the back of the net.

Bakala was tested often tonight. He made 25 saves and helped the BSU penalty-kill unit hold a high-octane offensive CC team scoreless on four power-play opportunities. He falls to 1-2-0 on the season.

Howe earned the win turning away 25 of 26 BSU shots.

In addition to Cain, tonight's game was one to remember for Danny Mattson also made his debut in the green and white.

The BSU-CC series is now at 4-2-1 all-time, while CC owns a 4-1-0 advantage versus the Beavers in Colorado Springs, Colo.

(World Arena) -- Holding the lead on four different occasions, which included a 4-3 edge to open the third period, the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team saw No. 8 Colorado College score three unanswered goals during the final 20 minutes as the Tigers outlasted the Beavers to gain a 6-4 victory and a series sweep.

Shea Walters and Radoslav Ilo each posted career nights for the Beavers recording a goal to go with two assists, while Brance Orban added a pair of assists, but BSU was unable to match the firepower on the CC line up. On the strength of a hat trick from Rylan Schwartz and three points (1-2-3) from brother Jaden and Scott Winkler, the Tigers' potent offense was too much for the Beavers down the stretch.

Bemidji State drew first blood for the first time all season when Walters put a rebound back from the left post on the power play. Ilo, who took the initial shot, and Orban were credited with assists on the play.

A delayed-penalty situation allowed CC even the second of the 11:34 mark of the first period. Jeff Collett wrapped around the goal and stuffed the puck past BSU goaltender Mathieu Dugas, who was in the net for his first start of the season.

The Beavers regained the lead at the 16:08 mark on a tremendous effort by newcomer Mitch Cain. The rookie picked up the puck on BSU's own blue line and skated into the offensive zone before getting a backhand off the pads of the CC goalie. Linemate Drew Fisher followed on the play and pocketed the rebound to give the Beavers a 2-1 lead.

Despite trailing 13-9 in shots on goal, the Beavers took a 2-1 lead into the locker room after 20 minutes of play. The lead would last only 37 seconds. CC won the second period's opening face off and when Winkler deflected a shot off R. Schwartz's skate in front and past Dugas.

Junior captain Ben Kinne opened an action-packed first period that saw seven goals scored with is second lamplighter of the season at the 2:51 mark on a wrist shot from between the circles. George and Prapavessis were credited with assists on the play.

Carl Nielsen tied the score 6:17 mark sparking a run of three goals by the Huskies, including tallies by David Johnstone and Blake Pietila, to take a 3-1 lead 12:49 into the first.

Following MTU's third goal, BSU head coach Tom Serratore quickly pulled goaltender starting Dan Bakala and inserted Andrew Walsh. BEMIDJI, Minn. (Sanford Center) -- The University of North Dakota's Mario Lamoureux scored an even-strength goal at the 15:22 mark of the third period to break a 2-2 tie and propel the Fighting Sioux to a 5-2 victory over Bemidji State Saturday in Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) men's hockey action at Sanford Center.

The win continued UND's long-standing reign in the series. The Fighting Sioux have now won the last 14 head-to-head matchups between the teams and own a 22-1-1 record in the all-time series.

The Beavers were the first to strike, getting a goal from **Brance Orban** at the 1:22 mark of the first period. Freshman **Mitch Cain** won an offensive zone face off to the junior and Orban ripped a shot past the UND goaltender Aaron Dell for his third goal of the season.

Four minutes and 38 seconds later (6:49), the Fighting Sioux tied the score on a rebound goal by Corban Knight. The goal came just six seconds into UND's first power-play opportunity of the evening. The team would finish the game 2-for-4 on the man advantage capitalizing on another power-play opportunity late in the third to put the game out of reach.

Ties 1-1 to open the second period, North Dakota broke the deadlock at the 4:30 mark of the period on a Brendan O'Donnell lamplighter.

The goal would stand as the only maker of the second period giving the visiting Sioux a one-goal edge as the third period got underway.

Forward **Shea Walters** scored his career-high sixth goal of the season just 72 seconds into the third period to even the score at 2-2. **Brady Wacker** found Walters open on the right post the senior converted. **Jamie MacQueen** was also credited with an assist on the play.

When MacQueen was sent to the box for hooking at the 4:49 mark of the third, all momentum seemed to swing in North Dakota's favor. Although the team was held scoreless during the two-minute power-play chance, UND attempted 12 shots, getting five on target. The Sioux controlled play for the remainder of the period and got the back breaking goal with just 4:38 left in regulation.

Brock Nelson would add a power-play goal at the 18:30 mark and an empty-net tally with 29 seconds on the clock to put the game out of reach.

The Fighting Sioux finished the game with a 36-25 edge in shots on goal despite trailing BSU 11-7 after the first period.

BSU was 0-for-2 on the man advantage marking the seventh consecutive game they have been held scoreless on the man advantage.

Dan Bakala played 59:41 between the pipes for the Beavers and posted 31 saves. Allowing four UND goals, he fell to 2-5-1 on the season.

BEMIDJI, Minn. (Sanford Center) -- The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team has piled up nearly 1,000 victories in 56 years of hockey history, but since Feb. 7, 1970, none of them have come against University of North Dakota until Sunday night. **Jordan George's** second period power-play lamplighter proved to be the only goal of the game as **Dan Bakala** turned aside 26 Fighting Sioux shots on route to a 1-0 victory and his seventh career shutout.

The BSU win ended a 41-year drought versus UND and snapped North Dakota's 14-game winning streak in the all-time series. UND still holds a 22-2-1 record in the all-time series.

After a scoreless first period, the Beavers got the break they needed at the 7:56 mark of the second period. UND's Mark MacMillan was whistled for tripping and before the Fighting Sioux could oral the puck, Andrew MacWilliam took an interference penalty setting BSU up with a two-minute 5-on-3 power-play opportunity.

One-minute, 12-seconds into the penalty, George collected a rebound off the left pad of North Dakota goaltender Aaron Dell and roofed his team-leading seventh goal of the season. The goal marked an end to another significant drought for the Beavers. BSU's last goal on the man advantage came Oct. 22--a scoreless streak spanning eight games and 20 power-play opportunities.

Senior defender **Brad Hunt** inched closer to BSU great and former teammate Matt Read (2007-11) with an assist on BSU's scoring play. With 76 assists during his collegiate career, he is just two helpers from BSU's Division I-era assists mark.

The Beavers clung to 1-0 lead through the remainder of the second despite taking two penalties late in the period.

The third period has been an Achilles heel for the Beavers in 2011-12. Through 13 games, BSU had been out scored 19-8 in the third, which includes a 15-4 deficit in the final period of WCHA contests, but the Beavers buckled down and killed nine minutes of penalties, included a five-minute major, to keep the Fighting Sioux of the scoreboard.

Defensively, Bemidji State was solid from the opening face off to the final horn. In addition to Bakala's shutout, the team piled up 21 blocked shots. BSU's penalty-kill unit was a perfect 6-for-6 on the night, while its power-play finished with a goal on three man advantage chances.

Bakala improved to 3-5-1 on the season.

(National Hockey Center) -- Junior **Jordan George** scored two goals and posted an assist to lead the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team to a 6-6 tie with St. Cloud State University Friday at National Hockey Center. **Aaron McLeod** added a pair of goals and **Brad Hunt** posted two assists as nine BSU players had a hand in scoring.

In a wild Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) contest that saw 12 goals scored, four lead changes and the score tied on four occasions, the Beavers rallied from a pair of two-goal deficits to earn a tie and a point in the league standings.

Bemidji State was first to strike in a high-tempo, five-goal first period. McLeod redirected a pass from **Jamie MacQueen** between the pads of SCSU's freshman goaltender Ryan Faragher to give the Beavers a 1-0 lead 5:03 into the game.

St. Cloud State would respond with a Nick Oliver goal at the 11:31 mark of the period and would get goals from Ben Hanowski and Taylor Johnson during the next 4:14 to extend his lead to 3-1 with 4:15 to go in the first. But the Huskies would commit a costly turnover in their own zone and Bemidji State would make them pay. **Jeff Jubenville** picked up the puck and placed a reefy pass on the stick of George, who pocketed a backhand over Faragher to nifty the Beavers to within a goal, 3-2. Before the first period expired (17:23).

In a penalty-riddled second period, the Beavers and Huskies each got seven shots on goal and netted a power-play marker, but the Beavers managed to record an even-strength goal to even the score at 4-4 after 40 minutes.

George registered his second goal of the night at the 1:25 mark of the second, just 39 seconds into the Beavers' first power-play opportunity of the night. **Brady Wacker** posted the first of his two points on the night (1-1=2), scoring his second goal of the season at the 3:30 mark to put the Beavers up 4-3, before SCSU bounced back with a Hanowski power-play marker at the 9:16 mark that would knot the game 4-4. George was credited with an assist on the play.

Tied 4-4 to open the third, the Huskies got goals from Travis Novak and Jordy Christian to take a 6-4 lead just 5:42 into the frame.

But the resilient Beavers would not back down.


After sitting out of BSU's last three games due to injury, **Radoslav Ilo** sparked the team's second comeback with an unassisted goal at the 10:06 mark of the third. He skated from end to end and scored stick side for his second goal of the season. Just over three minutes later (13:23), McLeod took a pass from **Matt Prapavessis**, skated down the slot, got the goaltender to commit low and roofed his second goal of the night to settle the score at 6-6. Hunt was also credited with an assist on the play, his team-leading 11th of the season and 78th of his career, matching BSU great Matt Read (2008-11) for BSU's Division I-era assists record (78).

The score would stay locked at 6-6 through the end of regulation and despite out shooting SCSU 5-3 and dominating the extra period, the Beavers would settle for the tie on the road marking just the third point taken by BSU on the Huskies' ice since Mar. 7, 1987.

Despite getting just two power-play opportunities on the night, BSU won the special teams battle finishing 1-for-2 (.500) on the man advantage, while snuffing out two of the Huskies' three power-play chances, holding the hosts to just one shot on the power-play.


Relieving Bakala at the 15:45 mark of the first period, **Andrew Walsh** was credited with the tie. He allowed three goals in 49:15 and piled up 14 saves, which included three stops in overtime. He moves to 2-2-1 in his career.

The Beavers continue to hold an edge in the all-time series 44-39-4.

ST. CLOUD, Minn. (National Hockey Center) -- **Brad Hunt** became the sixth defenseman in the history of the Bemidji State University men's ice hockey program to eclipse the 100-point mark Saturday netting the game-winning goal to lead the Beavers to a 3-1 victory at St. Cloud State University.

Defense and special teams stood tall for the Beavers in a game riddled with penalties. The BSU penalty-kill snuffed out all five of the Huskies' power-play opportunities, allowing just five shots on goal in 9:06, which included a five-minute major, while the power-play unit recorded a goal in three chances.

On the back end, **Dan Bakala** bounced back from an early exit Friday, to stop 33 of 34 SCSU shots on goal to gain the win and improve to 4-5-1.

After a track meet-type, 65-minute, 6-6 tie in the series opener, the teams picked up right where they left off to open at the finale.

St. Cloud State opened the scoring at the 3:25 mark of the game, when Nick Oliver snuck the puck through traffic and into the back of the BSU net.

Just as they had twice the night before, the Beavers regrouped and rallied to even the score. This time the SCSU lead would last only 47 seconds.

Jordan George erased the one-goal deficit with his team-leading 10th goal of the season, and third of the weekend, after taking a pass from **Aaron McLeod** in the slot and dropping a backhand over the shoulder of SCSU goaltender Ryan Faragher. Junior blueliner **Matt Carlson** was also credited with an assist on the play marking the first point of his junior season.

The Beavers would take a 2-1 lead into the first intermission thanks to the eventual game-winning goal by Hunt. **Jeff Jubinville** won an offensive zone face off to Hunt at the top of the right circle. The senior skated to the top of the slot, wound up and like he has so many times during his career, unleashed a laser through traffic and past Faragher.

Things got ugly for the Beavers in the second period. Owing the narrowest of leads, 2-1, the Beavers were whistled for three penalties, which included a five-minute major and game misconduct. The BSU penalty-kill unit successfully held the SCSU power-play crew without a goal for 5:25, but failed to generate any offensive push as the team was out shot 10-1 in the frame.

Clinging to a 2-1 lead, the Beavers found themselves short a man for the first 3:35 of the third period, but caught a break when Cam Ried was penalized of cross-checking forcing the teams to 4-on-4 for the bulk of the remaining **Brady Wacker** major.

The Beavers took advantage of another break at the 15:48 mark when Nic Dowd was sent to the box for hooking setting the Beavers up with their third power-play opportunity of the evening. Sixty-one seconds into the man advantage, **Branche Orban** scooped up a loose puck in the BSU defensive zone and found **Radoslav Ilo** streaking up the ice. Ilo netted his second goal in as many nights, completing the 2-on-1 with a slapshot goal.

The Beavers were out shot 34-14 in the game. BSU's 14-shot victory stands as the lowest shot total in a win since it was out shot 42-14 at Colorado College Dec. 29, 2006.

BSU owns a 45-39-4 advantage in the all time rivalry and with a win and a draw, earned a series win in St. Cloud for the first time since back-to-back victories Dec. 9-10, 1983.

George's team-leading 11th goal of the season, assisted by Kinne and **Brad Hunt** on the power play, got BSU and opened the floodgates for the BSU Student-Athlete Advisory Committee's annual Teddy Bear Toss, during which the generous Beaver Hockey fans peppered the ice with over 500 stuffed animals.

With an assist on the play, Hunt surpassed former teammate and Matt Read (2007-2011) to claim the top spot on BSU's Division I-era assist list with 79.

Bemidji State took a 1-0 lead into the third period, a frame that the Beavers have been out scored 23-11 through their first 16 games season.

The Pioneers came out of the second intermission determined to get back into the game.

Junior forward **Aaron McLeod** denied the Pioneers' on their first legitimate scoring opportunity of the game diving in front of a virtually open net, taking a point-blank shot in the bread basket just 46 seconds into the final period.

At the 4:03 mark the Beavers got a bit of breathing room when **Shea Walters** found Kinne on his forehead nearing the right post. The senior pushed the puck through DU goaltender Juho Olkinuora's pads to put the Beavers up 2-0.

The Pioneers continued to pressure the Beavers. Aided by a pair of power-play opportunities, DU out shot the Beavers 19-5 in the final 20 minutes. Walsh stood tall making 18 saves.

The Pioneers' only goal of the game came at the 11:47 mark. Daniel Doremus collected a rebound off the shot of David Makowski on the left post that rooted it for his third goal of the season. Despite DU pulling its goaltender with nearly two minutes to play, that was all the Pioneers could muster as the Beavers clamped down and claimed the win.

Walsh improved to 3-2-1 on the season with the win. BSU was 1-for-3 on the power-play, while its penalty-kill unit completed the night a perfect 6-for-6 to improve its league best numbers to 66-for-78 (.846).

The BSU victory was the first ever over Denver. BSU is now 1-9-0 all-time versus the Pioneers in a rivalry dating back to 1967.
