### Last Week for the Beavers

• Bemidji State is coming off a split against Minnesota State last weekend as they struggled to score goals for the first time this season. After being upset Friday by the Mavericks with 17 seconds left in overtime, the Beavers rebounded with a 1-0 shutout over Minnesota State Saturday. **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) picked up her 33rd career victory in the win to tie Bre Dedrickson's mark for most wins at BSU. The Beavers only two goals on the weekend came from **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) and **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.)

### Quick Take - Lindenwood

• Lindenwood is in its first season of NCAA play as they transition from the club level where the Lions have won four National Championships since 2006. The Lions have struggled in their first year as they have faced NCAA Division I and Division III programs thus far this season. Lindenwood is led offensively by Alison Wickenheiser's five goals and eight assists. In goal, Taylor Fairchild has seen the bulk of the time for the Lions allowing 91 goals in 12 games this year.

## Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75 He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

## US Hockey Hall of Fame Face-off Classic

• Thursday's game serves as the US Hockey Hall of Fame Face-off Classic. **Steve Sertich**, a member of the 1976 US Olympic team and currently serves as the Vice President of the US Hockey Hall of Fame. The US Hockey Hall of Fame was dedicated in 1973. The Hall of Fame has 145 outstanding coaches, players, builders, administrators and two Olympic teams who have contributed to the success and promotion of American hockey. BSU played in the US Hockey Hall of Fame Game in 2008 against University of Wisconsin at the Eveleth Hippodrome.

## And We All Return To Our Roots...

• Thursday will be a sort homecoming for several members of the BSU team and staff. The Iron Range is responsible for producing three staff members including head coach **Steve Sertich**, a Virginia-native. In addition, assistant coach **Amber Fryklund** and equipment manager **Andrea Nichols** both hail from Hibbing. The Beavers also have several team members from Northeast Minnesota; **Molly Arola (Walker)**, **Emily Erickson (Coleraine)**, **Jessica Havel (Grand Rapids)**, **Sadie Lundquist (Cloquet)**. **Montana Vichorek (Moose Lake)**.

## Remaining Neutral

BSU is 1-4 in regular-season games played at a neutral site. Thursday's meeting with Lindenwood University at Eveleth is the first regular-season neutral site game for BSU since they last played in Eveleth against University of Wisconsin Oct. 18. The Beavers fell in the game 9-0. BSU also played neutral-site games against the Badgers in 1999 at Eau Claire, Wis. and at the Augsburg Tournament in 1998-99 season against Augsburg and St. Mary's.

After falling out of the *USCHO.com* poll following a loss to Minnesota State, BSU is still the top vote-getter in both the *USCHO.com* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls. The Beavers have either received votes or been ranked in both polls since their victory over No. 10 Providence College Oct. 1.

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) needs only one win to surpass Bre Dedrickson's career record of 33 wins. She tied Dedrickson's mark with her win Saturday over Minnesota State. Tomcikova needs 500 minutes played and 15 games appeared in to tie two Emily Brookshaw's records. Tomcikova is also chasing Brookshaw for the career saves mark. The senior netminder needs 272 saves to surpass Brookshaw's mark. Tomcikova is 5-3-2 with a 1.76 goals against average and 291 saves this season.

The line was tasked with the responsibility of serving as a defensive forward line and thus shutting down the Golden Gopher top unit. The trio did so holding Schoullis, Erickson and Kessel scoreless Saturday after the trio was responsible for all four goals in Minnesota's 4-1 victory Friday. The line of A. Williams, L. Williams and King has been dubbed the "Smurf" line after the loveable short blue creatures from the 1980s animated series. All three players are under 5-4 in height and thus have a diminutive stature similar to the "Smurfs" thus garnering the nickname.

## Well Isn't That Special

• The BSU power play is currently ranked fifth in the nation with 14 goals on 47 attempts while their penalty kill is ranked fourth in the country only allowing four power-play goals this year. Combined, BSU's special teams are ninth in the nation. **Marlee Wheelhouse** (Sr., D, Crookston, Minn.), **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied three power-play goals this season to lead the Beavers and rank tied for ninth in the nation in power-play goals.

## It Was The Best Start Ever...

• BSU's 7-3-2 start in the first 12 games is the best start Bemidji State has ever had. The start marks the first time the Beavers has ever had over six wins in the first 12 games. BSU had six wins in the first 12 games during the 1999-00 season and last season.

## A Month For Winning

• October was obviously a month for winning for BSU as they went 6-2-1 during the month with their only losses coming to Ohio State University and No. 2 Minnesota. The Beavers have earned victories over St. Cloud State University, No. 2 Minnesota, Maine and No. 10 Providence during October.

## Poll Position

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team was ranked in a tie for 10th with Harvard during the week of Oct. 31 in *USCHO.com* poll. The ranking was the first in program history for BSU after upsetting No. 2 University of Minnesota 2-1 Saturday at Sanford Center.

## Kelly Named WCHA Rookie of the Week

• **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) garnered WCHA Rookie of the Week honors Nov. 2 after scoring a goal to help catapult BSU to a 2-1 victory over No. 2 Minnesota. Kelly leads all Beaver newcomers in scoring with four goals and two assists.

## Gopher Killers

• Bemidji State upset No. 2 Minnesota for the program's fourth-ever victory over the Golden Gophers and Steve Sertich's fourth victory over a team ranked in the top five. Sertich teams have also defeated No. 1 Mercyhurst (2010-11), No. 3 Minnesota Duluth (2010-11) and No. 4 Wisconsin (2009-10).

## Against Ranked Foes

• Bemidji State has started the season 2-1-1 against ranked foes as they have wins against No. 2 Minnesota and No. 10 Providence. BSU also tied No. 10 Providence. The teams only loss game in the first game against No. 2 Minnesota Friday.

## Chart Toppers

• BSU currently has players in the top 10 in several categories nationally. The Beavers have two players ranked among the top 10 for points per game for defensemen; **Montana Vichorek** (8) and **Erika Wheelhouse** (10). In addition, **Zuzana Tomcikova** is ranked in the top 10 for save percentage (8) and shutouts (T5). **Marlee Wheelhouse**, **Erika Wheelhouse** and **Sadie Lundquist** are ranked in a tie for ninth for power-play goals. **Rachael Kelly** ranks in a tie for fsecond for game-winning goals with three. As a team for the Beavers are in the top 10 for scoring defense (T10), scoring margin (T10), power play (5) and penalty kill (4).

## Can't Stop, Won't Stop

• The Bemidji State women's hockey team has been a scoring machine this season goals accounting for 38 goals in 12 games. BSU's seven goals against Maine and eight goals versus St. Cloud State are their highest scoring performances since tallying eight goals against St. Cloud State Oct. 26, 2001. BSU has scored three or more goals in every game but their first game of the season.

## Cleaning Up

• The Bemidji State Beavers have picked up two sweeps this season with two wins against University of Maine and two wins versus WCHA foe St. Cloud State University. The sweep of St. Cloud State was the first conference sweep of the season for BSU.

## Comeback Kids

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team has shown time and time again this season that they are poised in the face of adversity. After mounting two comebacks against Ohio State University the week prior. BSU did it again as they came from behind in the waning minutes against Maine to come away with an overtime victory over the Black Bears, 3-2. BSU was down 2-1 with less than two minutes left when they pulled the goaltender in order to go on a six-on-four skater advantage via a power play. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) quickly netted the puck tying the game and forcing an overtime where **Tess Dusik** (So., F, Oak Bluff, Manitoba) tallied the game winner two minutes into the extra period.

## Moving Forward

• The Bemidji State defense has done a great job of helping score goals this season. The Beaver defensemen have accounted for 37 of 102 points this season. Two players (**Montana Vichorek**, and **Erika Wheelhouse**) rank in the top 10 in the nation for defenseman scoring and are also among BSU's top five scorers this season along with Marlee Wheelhouse. The BSU blue liners have scored 12 goals and tallied 25 assists this season led by Vichorek's four goals and 10 assists.
