• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team picked up a split last weekend against No. 6/7 Minnesota Duluth at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth. The Beavers' 4-3 win Saturday marked the first time BSU has ever beat the historic UMD program on the road and only the second time they have ever beat the Bulldogs. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) led the charge for the Beavers with two goals and two assists on the weekend as she returned from injury. **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) was also strong with two power-play goals and an assist.

Quick Take - North Dakota

• Brian Idalski has the Fighting Sioux rolling through the first half of the season as they currently boast a No. 6 ranking in both major polls and find itself in third place in the WCHA standings. North Dakota is led by one of the best lines in the country with the Lamoureux twins and newcomer Michelle Karvinen. In goal, UND will be back stopped by Stephanie Ney, who comes in with a 2.51 goals against average.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75 He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

Tally Your Votes

• After falling out of the *USCHO.com* poll following a loss to Minnesota State, BSU is still receiving votes in both the *USCHO.com* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls. The Beavers have either received votes or been ranked in both polls since their victory over No. 10 Providence College Oct. 1. This makes it eight-consecutive weeks that BSU has received a vote or been ranked in both polls.

Revenge

• The Beaver players have their eyes set on avenging an overtime loss to North Dakota last season which ended BSU's season in the first round of the WCHA Playoffs. The loss is still fresh in the minds of last season's players as they host the Fighting Sioux this weekend in the first match-up between the schools since the loss.

Belly Full of Turkey

• Bemidji State is 1-2-3 in games in the Steve Sertich era that have been played directly after Thanksgiving Day. Their only win following Thanksgiving came in Sertich's first season over Vermont Nov. 25, 2006, however BSU has picked up ties with Vermont, Wisconsin and Ohio State following Thanksgiving.

Do-Over

• Bemidji State has struggled in first games of series this season as they are only 2-3-2 in the first game of series. However you do not want to catch the Beavers in the second game, or even moreso after they have suffered a loss. BSU is 6-1-0 in second games of series this season and 4-0-0 after suffering a loss.

Controlling Period No. 2 and 3

• BSU is winning games this season with their play in periods No. 2 and No. 3. The Beavers have outscored opponents 40-18 this season between the two periods. In Sunday's win against UMD the Beavers four goals came in the second and third periods with three goals to stamp their 4-3 victory over No. 6 in the third period.

Against Ranked Foes

• Bemidji State has started the season 3-2-1 against ranked foes as they have wins against No. 2 Minnesota, No. 6 Minnesota Duluth and No. 10 Providence. BSU also tied No. 10 Providence.

And The Points Keep Coming

BSU has had two players tie the school record for most points in a single game this season as **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied six points in a game. Vichorek notched two goals and four assists in a 8-1 win over St. Cloud State University while Lundquist tallied a goal and five assists versus Lindenwood University. Vichorek's mark also set the school record for points in a game by a defenseman. Lundquist's five assists set the school record for assists in a game.

Taking The Next Step

• With the program's start this season the Beavers appear to be taking the next step in building BSU into a nationally respected program. This can be evidenced in the strides made by several players this season. Nine Beaver skaters have already established career-bests for points in a season and BSU is only 15 games into the season. These players are: **Molly Arola** (4 points), **Tess Dusik** (7 points), **Sadie Lundquist** (23 points), **Emily McKnight** (3 points), **Mackenzie Thurston** (6 points), **Montana Vichorek** (18 points), **Erika Wheelhouse** (15 points), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (15 points) and **Abby Williams** (6 points).

Hard Work Pays Off

• After nearly two-and-a-half years with the program third-string goaltender **Jessica Havel** (Jr., Grand Rapids, Minn.) finally saw her first career action in the third period against Lindenwood University. Havel notched 10 saves in the third period for the Beavers.

Well Isn't That Special

• The BSU power play is currently ranked third in the nation with 21 goals on 63 attempts while their penalty kill is ranked seventh in the country only allowing six power-play goals this year. Combined, BSU's special teams are seventh in the nation. **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied five power-play goals this season to lead the Beavers and rank tied for fourth in the nation in power-play goals. BSU's 21 power-play goals leads the nation.

Chart Toppers

• BSU currently has players in the top 10 in several categories nationally. The Beavers have three players ranked among the top 10 for points per game for defensemen; **Montana Vichorek** (4), **Erika Wheelhouse** and **Marlee Wheelhouse** (T7). In addition, **Zuzana Tomcikova** is ranked in the top 10 for shutouts (T7). **Montana Vichorek** and **Sadie Lundquist** are ranked in a tie for fourth for power-play goals with five while **Marlee Wheelhouse** is tied for 10th. **Rachael Kelly** ranks in a tie for third for game-winning goals with three. Home Grown

• BSU has found success recruiting all over Minnesota and has delved into Canada for some talent but currently the Beavers' five leading scorers all hail from Northern Minnesota. **Sadie Lundquist** of Cloquet is currently BSU's leading scorer with eight goals and 15 assists. Emily Erickson of Coleraine has chipped in eight goals and 11 assists. Defensemen **Montana Vichorek** of Moose Lake and **Erika and Marlee Wheelhouse** round out BSU's leading scorers this season.

Moving Forward

• The Bemidji State defense has done a great job of helping score goals this season. The Beaver defensemen have accounted for 53 of 146 points this season. Three players (**Montana Vichorek**, **Marlee Wheelhouse** and **Erika Wheelhouse**) rank in the top 10 in the nation for defenseman scoring and are also among BSU's top five scorers this season. The BSU blue liners have scored 18 goals and tallied 35 assists this season led by Vichorek's seven and 11 assists.

Can't Stop, Won't Stop

• The Bemidji State women's hockey team has been a scoring machine this season goals accounting for 54 goals in 15 games. BSU's 11 goals against Lindenwood marked their highest scoring output since tallying 15 goals versus Wayne State University in 1999.

Friendly Confines

• Bemidji State is 4-1-1 at Sanford Center this season including upset victories over No. 2 Minnesota and No. 10 Providence. BSU is 13-6-3 since opening Sanford Center Oct. 15 against Mercyhurst College. The Beavers have only been swept at Sanford Center once since moving into their new home and that was against No. 1 Wisconsin last season. The Badgers would go on to capture the NCAA Division I National Championship. BSU has had six victories over top 10 teams at Sanford Center including their first-ever win over a No. 1 opponent (Mercyhurst) and their first-ever win over No. 3 Minnesota Duluth.

It Was The Best Start Ever...

• BSU's 9-4-2 start in the first 15 games is the best start Bemidji State has ever had. The start marks the first time the Beavers has had nine wins through the first 15 games since the 1999-00 season. The Beavers were 9-6-0 that season in the first 15 contests.

Poll Position

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team was ranked in a tie for 10th with Harvard during the week of Oct. 31 in *USCHO.com* poll. The ranking was the first in program history for BSU after upsetting No. 2 University of Minnesota 2-1 Saturday at Sanford Center.

• The Bemidji State Beavers have picked up two sweeps this season with two wins against University of Maine and two wins versus WCHA foe St. Cloud State University. The sweep of St. Cloud State was the first conference sweep of the season for BSU.

Comeback Kids

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team has shown time and time again this season that they are poised in the face of adversity. After mounting two comebacks against Ohio State University the week prior. BSU did it again as they came from behind in the waning minutes against Maine to come away with an overtime victory over the Black Bears, 3-2. BSU was down 2-1 with less than two minutes left when they pulled the goaltender in order to go on a six-on-four skater advantage via a power play. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) quickly netted the puck tying the game and forcing an overtime where **Tess Dusik** (So., F, Oak Bluff, Manitoba) tallied the game winner two minutes into the extra period. BSU again came back after going down 1-0 early last Sunday against Minnesota Duluth. The Beavers scored four goals in the final two periods to pick up their second-ever win over the No. 6 Bulldogs.
