The Beavers took an early 2-0 lead Friday but ultimately fell 3-2 to the Golden Gophers. The opposite happened Saturday as BSU was down 2-0 and came back to get a 3-3 tie with Minnesota.

Quick Take - Wisconsin

• The University of Wisconsin comes into the weekend ranked No. 1 in the nation. They are coming off two wins at home against University of Minnesota Duluth last weekend. Wisconsin is led by the trio of Brianna Decker, Brooke Ammerman and Hilary Knight, three of the nation's best players. In net, Alex Rigsby comes in with a 1.53 goals against average. Wisconsin is the only team to sweep Bemidji State this season (Dec. 9 and 10).

HEAD COACH STEVE SERTICH



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers open their new home,

the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomickova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75 He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

Comeback Kids

• Bemidji State staged several comebacks earlier in the season and went back to its roots last Saturday as the Beavers came back from a 2-0 deficit to tie No. 2 Minnesota 2-2 early in the third period. After a third goal put Minnesota ahead 3-2 late in the third period BSU looked to be down and out until an **Erika Wheelhouse** goal with 49 seconds left tied the teams at 3-3 and sent the Beavers and Golden Gophers to overtime. Minnesota eventually won the shootout but BSU still received a point from the valiant effort.

In Good Company

• Only two teams have not lost to Minnesota this season on its home ice at Ridder Arena. Those two teams meet this weekend as Bemidji State and Wisconsin square off. The Beavers and Badgers both earned ties against the Golden Gophers this season in Minneapolis.

Fill The Bowl

• Saturday's game against Wisconsin will serve as the Badger's "Fill the Bowl" game at the Kohl Center. This year's Fill the Bowl game will support Second Harvest Foodbank to help Madison area families in need. For every fan in attendance, Becker Law office will donate \$1. Students and fans alike are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items to be donated as well. Tickets for general public fans are only \$1. Last season the Badgers hosted 10,668 fans when they attempted to "Fill the Bowl"

Sensational Senior Class

• The BSU senior class consisting of Kimberly Lieder, Alana McElhinney, Zuzana Tomcikova, Montana Vichorek, Marlee Wheelhouse and Lauren Williams became the all-time winningest class in program history with last Saturday's 5-3 victory over Ohio State University. The group has 46 wins in its four years which surpassed the 45 wins of the 2002-03 senior class which included current assistant coach Amber Fryklund.

Follow The Lieder

• **Kimberly Lieder** hasn't always showed up on the stat sheet this year but what she has down at the blue line has been just as important as defensive mates **Montana Vichorek**, **Marlee Wheelhouse** and **Erika Wheelhouse**. Lieder has been a great defenseman and has been on ice for a lot of goals this season. The senior who rose from walk-on to top player currently is among the leaders in the nation for +/- at +14.

Helping from the Blue Line

• **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) became the school's all-time leader is assists by a defenseman with a helper on Erika Wheelhouse's goal with 49 seconds left Saturday against No. 2 Minnesota. The senior has 53 assists in her career. which surpasses Lisa Peters' mark She is also approaching records for points by a defenseman (needs 17 points to tie) and assists (needs 17 assists to tie). Vichorek is currently tied for 9th for points with 70 in her career.

Leading Minnesotans

• **Sadie Lundquist** currently leads all native Minnesotans in the WCHA in scoring with 29 points this season. BSU is currently led by five native Minnesotans in scoring with **Emily Erickson** (25 points), **Montana Vichorek** (24 points), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (23 points) and **Erika Wheelhouse** (22 points) rounding out the Beavers' top scorers.

Season Records

• In addition to a plethora of career records BSU is setting, members of the team have also been busy setting or inching closer to season records. **Montana Vichorek** and **Erika Wheelhouse** have already set the mark for assists by a defenseman in a season with 16 while **Sadie Lundquist** recently set the mark for power-play goals in a season with her seventh netter against Minnesota last Saturday. In addition, Lundquist needs three assists to tie the season mark for assists and Vichorek needs three points to tie the mark for points by a defenseman.

Falling out of the Polls

• After spending four straight weeks in the *USCHO.com* poll and five straight weeks in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll the Beavers fell out for the first time Jan. 16 after a split with Ohio State University at home. Bemidji State is still the top vote-getter in both polls. BSU has been ranked or received votes every week since the start of the season following a victory over then-No. 9 Providence College Oct. 1.

Against Ranked Foes

• BSU is 4-6-2 against ranked opponents this season. The Beavers have beaten No. 2 University of Minnesota, then-No. 6 University of Minnesota Duluth, then-No. 6 University of North Dakota and then-No. 9 Providence College this season. BSU's win against Minnesota Oct. 29 helped catapult them into the rankings for the first time in program history.

Kelly Named WCHA Rookie of the Week...Again

• **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) garnered *WCHA Rookie of the Week* honors Jan. 11 for the second time this season. Kelly picked up the honor earlier this season after tallying a vital goal in BSU's upset of then-No. 2 University of Minnesota Oct. 9. Kelly was selected this week after notching two assists in the Beavers' 4-0 win over Minnesota State.

Z Watch

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) has set BSU marks in wins, saves and minutes played this season. The Beaver netminder has only one major record left to set as she needs only three games appeared in to break Emily Brookshaw's record for most games appeared in.

Not Getting Past

- Zuzana Tomcikova set her career record for saves with 51 against Wisconsin Dec. 9.

Do-Over

- Bemidji State has struggled in first games of series this season as they are only 3-8-2 in the first game of series. However you do not want to catch the Beavers in the second game, or even moreso after they have suffered a loss. BSU is 10-2-1 in second games of series this season and 7-1-1 after suffering a loss.

It Was The Best First-Half Ever...

- BSU's 12-7-2 first-half record is the best in program history. The 12 wins for the Beavers surpasses BSU's previous best of nine wins before the turn of the calendar year accomplished in the program's second season (1999-00).

More Power

- The BSU power play is currently ranked fourth in the nation with 29 goals on 115 attempts. **Sadie Lundquist** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) is tied for eighth in the nation with six power-play goals.

Moving Forward

- The Bemidji State defense has done a great job of helping score goals this season. The Beaver defensemen have accounted for 79 of 223 points this season. Three players (**Montana Vichorek**, **Marlee Wheelhouse** and **Erika Wheelhouse**) rank in the top 10 in the nation for defenseman scoring and are also among BSU's top five scorers this season. The BSU blue liners have scored 24 goals and tallied 55 assists this season led by Vichorek's seven and 16 assists.

Can't Stop, Won't Stop

- The Bemidji State women's hockey team has been a scoring machine this season accounting for 84 goals in 27 games. BSU's 11 goals against Lindenwood marked their highest scoring output since tallying 15 goals versus Wayne State University in 1999.

Wheelhouse Selected WCHA Defensive Player of the Week

- **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) earned *WCHA Defensive Player of the Week* honors for a second time this season after notching a goal and three assists to help BSU to a split with No. 6 North Dakota. Wheelhouse also earned the honor after tallying six assists on the weekend against Ohio State University Oct. 7-8. The mark fell just one assist short of her season total from the 2010-11 campaign.

And The Points Keep Coming

BSU has had two players tie the school record for most points in a single game this season as **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied six points in a game. Vichorek notched two goals and four assists in a 8-1 win over St. Cloud State University while Lundquist tallied a goal and five assists versus Lindenwood University. Vichorek's mark also set the school record for points in a game by a defenseman. Lundquist's five assists set the school record for assists in a game.

Taking The Next Step

- With the program's start this season the Beavers appear to be taking the next step in building BSU into a nationally respected program. This can be evidenced in the strides made by several players this season. 12 Beaver skaters have already established career-bests for points in a season and BSU is only 27 games into the season. These players are; **Molly Arola** (6 points), **Tess Dusik** (11 points), **Kimberly Lieder** (7 points), **Sadie Lundquist** (29 points), **Emily McKnight** (3 points), **Mackenzie Thurston** (13 points), **Montana Vichorek** (24 points), **Erika Wheelhouse** (22 points), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (23 points); **Danielle Williams** (3 points), **Lauren Williams** (6 points) and **Abby Williams** (9 points).

Chart Toppers

- BSU currently has players in the top 10 in several categories nationally. The Beavers have three players ranked among the top 10 for points per game for defensemen; **Montana Vichorek** (T4), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (8) and **Erika Wheelhouse** (10). In addition, **Zuzana Tomcikova** is ranked in the top 10 for save percentage (T9). **Sadie Lundquist** is ranked in a tie for eighth for power-play goals. As a team for the Beavers are in the top 10 for power play (4).

Overtime

- **Tess Dusik's** goal Oct. 14 against Maine gave BSU their first overtime victory since defeating Minnesota State University 2-1 Dec. 11, 2010. The overtime win was only the seventh all-time for the Beavers. BSU again went to overtime against Minnesota and suffered their first loss of the season in an overtime Oct. 28. The Beavers and Golden Gophers again went to overtime Jan. 21
