• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team fell behind in both games last week against Ohio State but showed their poise in the face of adversity as they came back in both games. BSU scored four goals in seven minutes Friday in order to come back from being down 3-0. The Beavers ended up with a 4-4 tie with the Buckeyes in that game. Saturday, BSU again put up a comeback but fell short 5-3. *WCHA Defensive Player of the Week Erika Wheelhouse* paced the Beavers with six assists last weekend.

### Quick Take - Maine

• The Maine Black Bears picked up two comeback victories over No. 9 Quinnipiac University last weekend. The Black Bears were down 3-0 Friday but came back to pick up a 4-3 win over the Bobcats. Saturday, Maine was down 4-1 heading into the third but used four late goals including two from *Hockey East Co-Player of the Week Danielle Ward* to come away with the win. Ward also scored the game-winner in overtime. Ward comes into the weekend with three goals and two assists. Myriam Croussette leads the Black Bears in scoring with three goals and three assists.

## Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16, 2010, and their first ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win on Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

## Comeback Kids

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team proved they were poised in the face of adversity over the weekend as they mounted two comebacks against Ohio State University. The Beavers were down 3-0 early in the second period but tallied four goals in the span of seven minutes in the late second period and early third period to go ahead 4-3. The Beavers would end up tying the Buckeyes 4-4 Friday. Saturday BSU was down 4-1 early in the third and tallied two goals in the span of three minutes to go down 4-3. The Buckeyes would fend off Saturday's comeback.

## Moving Forward

• The BSU defense has taken to the offensive end this season to make up for several departures from the line-up after last season. BSU defeneman have tallied 13 of 27 points scored so far this season including three goals. **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) leads all defenseman in scoring with six assists while **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) has tallied one goal and three assists. **Marlee Wheelhouse** (Sr., D, Crookston, Minn.) and **Kimberly Lieder** (Sr., D, Eagan, Minn.) have also tallied points this season.

## Return of the King

• **Kristi King** (So., F, Stillwater, Minn.) returns to Orono this weekend after competing as a freshman for the Black Bears last season. King transferred to Bemidji State prior to the start of the 2011-12 season after tallying two goals and an assist for Maine last season. King tallied her first BSU goal last weekend putting the Beavers ahead 4-3 Friday after being down 3-0 heading into the third period against Ohio State. BSU would end up with a 4-4 tie against the Buckeyes.

## Wheelhouse With The Assist

• **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) tallied six assists on the weekend. The mark falls one short of her season total from the 2010-11 campaign. Wheelhouse assisted on three goals in the second period Friday to help BSU back into the game after being down 3-0 early in the second period.

## Erickson Breaks Lid After Scoreless First Weekend

• **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) was scoreless in BSU's first series against Providence College but her scoreless streak didn't last long. Erickson was vital in BSU's comeback Friday as she tallied two goals and one assist. Erickson came into the season as BSU's most likely replacement for the now departed Erin Cody. Erickson tallied 16 goals and 11 assists last season.

## Shootout Vets

• Despite two shootout losses BSU can sure say they are already shootout veterans four games into the season. BSU went to a shootout in their season opener against No. 10 Providence and in their first game of the Ohio State series last weekend.

## Upset-Minded

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team pulled off a 3-1 upset over No. 10 Providence Saturday evening building off of last season's plethora of upsets. BSU had five wins over ranked foes last season including their first win over a No. 1 opponents (Mercyhurst College) and their first win ever versus University of Minnesota Duluth. Saturday's victory also marks the second-consecutive season Bemidji State has picked up a win over a ranked opponent in their home opening series. BSU defeated No. 1 Mercyhurst in the second-ever game at Sanford Center last year.

## Tomcikova named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) was named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the ninth time in her career October 5 after notching 54 saves and allowing only one goal as the Beavers went 1-0-1 in a weekend series against No. 10 Providence College. Tomcikova boasted a .982 save percentage on the weekend and picked up her 15th career shutout in Friday's 0-0 tie with the Friars.

## Block Party

• The Wheelhouse sisters, Marlee and Erika, led the Beavers with a combined 25 shot blocks helping BSU to a 1-0-1 record against No. 10 Providence. The Wheelhouses, both from Crookston, Minn., paced a BSU defense that prevented the puck from getting to goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Jr., Bratislava, Slovakia.) BSU had 43 blocks compared to 21 blocks from the Friars on the weekend. Only one goal was scored against Tomcikova on the weekend. BSU enters the Maine series this weekend with 70 blocks. The Wheelhouse sisters each have 17 on the season.

## Z Watch

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) struggled against Ohio State as Ally Tarr and Natalie Spooner for Ohio State had her number over the weekend. Tomcikova had a strong weekend in the previous series against No. 10 Providence College only allowing one goal on the weekend and eventually being honored as the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week. Tomcikova needs only four more wins to move past Bre Dedrickson as BSU's all-time goalie wins leader. She is also inching closer to the top spot for games appeared in (89), minutes played (5,227:46) and career saves (2823).

## U.S. National Team invite

• Montana Vichorek (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) was invited to participate in the USA Women's Hockey National Festival which allowed her the chance to tryout for the USA Women's Hockey National Team. Vichorek was one of 79 players invited to participate in the camp.

## Newcomer watch

- After losing much of its scoring following the 2010-11 season, the BSU women's hockey team will look to several newcomers to fill voids in their lines for the 2011-12 season.
- **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) and **Natasha Kostenko** (Fr., F, Fannystelle, Manitoba) each began their collegiate careers with points in the Providence series. Kelly scored the game-winning goal in a 3-1 upset over the Friars while Kostenko added an assist in the same game.
- **Kristi King** (So., F, Stillwater, Minn.) scored her first goal at BSU against Ohio State to put BSU ahead 4-3 in Friday's contest.
- Newcomers **Kayleigh Chapman** (Fr., D, Virden, Manitoba), **Kristin Huber** (Fr., F, Kelowna, British Columbia) and **Whitney Wivoda** (Fr., F, Fairbanks, Alaska.) all have played this season but have yet to score.
- Freshmen **Alex Citrowske** (F, Prior Lake, Minn.) and **Tegan Rose** (D, Gibbons, Alberta) did not appear against Providence College or Ohio State University, along with freshman **Jenessa Philipczyk** (F, Stillwater, Minn.), a walk-on who intends to redshirt during the 2011-12 season.

## Special Teams

- BSU's penalty kill unit shined as the Beavers killed off 10 Providence power plays in the two-game series. In addition, Montana Vichorek capped off the weekend for the penalty kill unit with a short-handed goal Saturday to help secure a 3-1 victory for the Beavers over the No. 10 Friars.
- Against Ohio State, the opposite occurred as BSU's power-play unit was stellar accounting for four power-play goals against the Buckeyes while their penalty kill unit gave up two power-play goals to Ohio State.

## Off to the Races

- **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) began her collegiate career with some excitement as she scored what proved to be the game-winner to send the Beavers past No. 10 Providence. The goal was the first of her collegiate career. Kelly was joined by **Natasha Kostenko** (Fr., F, Fannystelle, Manitoba) who also added her first points of the season with an assist on a Kimberly Lieder (Sr., D, Eagan, Minn.) goal Saturday.

## Series History
