### Last Week for the Beavers

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team picked up a victory over No. 10 Providence College, 3-1, last Saturday. Friday, the Beavers went 65 minutes with Providence before the game officially ended in a 0-0 tie.

### Quick Take - Ohio State

• This weekend's series against Bemidji State will be the regular-season debut for the Ohio State University Buckeyes. OSU is under new leadership as former Robert Morris University head coach Nate Handrahan replaces the now-retired Jackie Barto. The Buckeyes are led by forwards Laura McIntosh (14g, 33a in 2010-11) and Natalie Spooner (26g, 13a in 2010-11) and defenseman Kelly Wild (3g, 16a). The Buckeyes went 14-19-3 (8-17-3) in Barto's final year at the helm. Last year the season series was 1-1-2 between the Buckeyes and Beavers. BSU picked up a victory at Sanford Center 4-1 to cap the 2010-11 regular season. The series currently stands at 16-25-9 between BSU and OSU.

## Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16, 2010, and their first ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win on Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

## Upset-Minded

The Bemidji State University women's hockey team pulled off a 3-1 upset over No. 10 Providence Saturday evening building off of last season's plethora of upsets. BSU had five wins over ranked foes last season including their first win over a No. 1 opponents (Mercyhurst College) and their first win ever versus University of Minnesota Duluth. Saturday's victory also marks the second-consecutive season Bemidji State has picked up a win over a ranked opponent in their home opening series. BSU defeated No. 1 Mercyhurst in the second-ever game at Sanford Center last year.

## WCHA Opener

This weekend's series against The Ohio State University marks the conference opener for Bemidji State. The Beavers have struggled in their WCHA openers going 4-18-2. This season's conference-opening series against the Buckeyes marks the first time BSU hasn't opened the season with University of Wisconsin since the 2007-08 season.

## Tomcikova named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week

Zuzana Tomcikova (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) was named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the ninth time in her career Wednesday after notching 54 saves and allowing only one goal as the Beavers went 1-0-1 in a weekend series against No. 10 Providence College. Tomcikova boasted a .982 save percentage on the weekend and picked up her 15th career shutout in Friday's 0-0 tie with the Friars.

## Block Party

The Wheelhouse sisters, Marlee and Erika, led the Beavers with a combined 25 shot blocks this weekend helping BSU to a 1-0-1 record against No. 10 Providence. The Wheelhouses, both from Crookston, Minn., paced a BSU defense that prevented the puck from getting to goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Jr., Bratislava, Slovakia.) BSU had 43 blocks compared to 21 blocks from the Friars on the weekend. Only one goal was scored against Tomcikova on the weekend.

## Off to the Races

**Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) began her collegiate career with some excitement Saturday as she scored what proved to be the game-winner to send the Beavers past No. 10 Providence. The goal was the first of her collegiate career. Kelly was joined by **Natasha Kostenko** (Fr., F, Fannystelle, Manitoba) who also added her first points of the season with an assist on a Kimberly Lieder (Sr., D, Eagan, Minn.) goal Saturday.

## Lieder Breaks in Scoring for BSU

• After a scoreless night Friday against No. 10 Providence, **Kimberly Lieder** (Sr., D, Eagan, Minn.) opened the lid on BSU's scoring with a rocket from the blue-line off a **Natasha Kostenko** pass. The goal was Lieder's second career goal and helped guide BSU past No. 10 Providence for a 3-1 upset victory.

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) continued where she left off last season with her play in the crease Friday and Saturday against No. 10 Providence. Tomcikova added the 15th shutout of her career Friday with 23 saves. Saturday, Tomcikova allowed one goal but got the victory in the upset win over Providence. She had 31 saves on the evening. Tomcikova inched closer to Bre Dedrickson's school record for career wins (33) with her 29th victory Saturday. She also moves closer to the career record for saves. Tomcikova now had 2,566 saves in her career and needs 509 to surpass Emily Brookshaw's 3,075 save mark.
