Last Week for the Beavers

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team picked up a sweep of University of Maine last weekend in a nonconference match-up in Orono, Maine. The Beavers came from behind in the third period last Friday to defeat the Black Bears 3-2 in overtime. On Saturday, BSU used the most goals they have scored since 2001 to take down Maine 7-0. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) paced BSU with three goals and one assist and was thus named the *Beaver Pride Female Athlete of the Week* for her performance.

Quick Take - St. Cloud State

• The St. Cloud State Huskies enter the weekend with a 1-5 (0-4-0 WCHA) mark. The Huskies are coming off two losses to Ohio State University last weekend in Columbus, Ohio. St. Cloud State has been led thus far by Brittany Toor's one goal and three assists. They have scored seven goals this season and have allowed 27. In goal, senior Taylor VanDenakker has seen the brunt of the duty starting four games. She comes into the weekend with a 4.30 goals against average and 169 saves.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16, 2010, and their first ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win on Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

Can't Stop, Won't Stop

• The Bemidji State women's hockey team was a force to be reckoned with last Saturday as they picked up a 7-0 victory over University of Maine. The seven goals against the Black Bears marks the most goals BSU has scored in a single game since tallying eight goals versus St. Cloud State University Oct. 26, 2001.

Cleaning Up

• The Beavers picked up their first series sweep of the season over the weekend with two wins over the University of Maine. The sweep marks the first time BSU has picked up a sweep in a series since defeating Minnesota State University in a series last January.

It Was The Best Start Ever...

• BSU's 3-1-2 start in the first six games ties the best start the BSU program has ever had. The Beavers also went 3-1-2 to begin the 2001-02 season under Jason Lesterberg. Bemidji State finished the year with a 12-13-8 mark (7-11-6 WCHA).

Stepping Up

• **Emily Erickson (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.)** finally showed BSU fans the Emily Erickson of old last weekend as she led the team with three goals and one assist in two victories over Maine. Erickson's late first period goal brought the Beavers back from a 2-1 deficit and helped the Beavers capture the overtime victory. Erickson tallied two goals Saturday in a 7-0 win over the Black Bears including her first short-handed goal of her career.

No Goals For You

• **Alana McElhinney** (Sr., G, Calgary, Alberta) put up her third career shutout with 17 saves in a 7-0 victory over Maine last Saturday. The game served as McElhinney's debut on the season taking over for **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia), who had started BSU's first five games.

More Power

• BSU has taken advantage of their power plays this season tallying seven goals on 29 power plays so far. Last Friday, the Beavers used three power-play goals to pick up a comeback victory in overtime against the Maine Black Bears. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) each have two power-play goals for the Beavers.

Home Grown

• BSU has found success recruiting all over Minnesota and has even delved into Canada for some talent but currently the Beavers' four leading scorers are all Northern Minnesota products. Crookston-native **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D) currently leads all scorers with two goals and six assists while **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) and **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) has each added seven points. **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) has chipped in six points for the Beavers thus far.

Comeback Kids

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team has showed time and time again this season that they are poised in the face of adversity. After mounting two comebacks against Ohio State University the week prior, BSU did it again as they came from behind in the waning minutes Friday against Maine to come away with an overtime victory over the Black Bears, 3-2. BSU was down 2-1 with less than two minutes left when they pulled the goaltender in order to go on a six-on-four skater advantage via a powerplay. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) quickly netted the puck tying the game and forcing an overtime where **Tess Dusik** (So., F, Oak Bluff, Manitoba) tallied the game-winner two minutes into the extra period.

Moving Forward

• The BSU defense has taken to the offensive end this season to make up for several departures from the line-up after last season. BSU defensemen have tallied 20 of 54 points scored so far this season including six goals. **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) leads all players in scoring this season with two goals and six assists while **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) has tallied two goals and five assists. **Marlee Wheelhouse** (Sr., D, Crookston, Minn.) and **Kimberly Lieder** (Sr., D, Eagan, Minn.) have also tallied points this season with Wheelhouse notching a goal and an assist and Lieder accounting for one goal and one assist.

Wheelhouse With The Assist

• **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) tallied six assists against Ohio State University Oct. 7-8. The mark falls one short of her season total from the 2010-11 campaign. Wheelhouse assisted on three goals in the second period Friday to help BSU back into the game after being down 3-0 early in the second period.

Overtime

• **Tess Dusik's** overtime goal last Friday against Maine gave BSU their first overtime victory since defeating Minnesota State University 2-1 in overtime Dec. 11, 2010. The overtime win is only the seventh all-time for the Beavers. Last Friday's overtime game was the third of the season already for BSU. The other two overtime games (Ohio State and Providence) went to a shootout.

Shootout Vets

• Despite two shootout losses BSU can sure say they are already shootout veterans four games into the season. BSU went to a shootout in their season opener against No. 10 Providence and in their first game of the Ohio State series.

Upset-Minded

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team pulled off a 3-1 upset over No. 10 Providence Saturday evening building off of last season's plethora of upsets. BSU had five wins over ranked foes last season including their first win over a No. 1 opponents (Mercyhurst College) and their first win ever versus University of Minnesota Duluth. Saturday's victory also marks the second-consecutive season Bemidji State has picked up a win over a ranked opponent in their home opening series. BSU defeated No. 1 Mercyhurst in the second-ever game at Sanford Center last year.

Tomcikova named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) was named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the ninth time in her career October 5 after notching 54 saves and allowing only one goal as the Beavers went 1-0-1 in a weekend series against No. 10 Providence College. Tomcikova boasted a .982 save percentage on the weekend and picked up her 15th career shutout in Friday's 0-0 tie with the Friars.

Block Party

• The Wheelhouse sisters, Marlee and Erika, led the Beavers with a combined 25 shot blocks helping BSU to a 1-0-1 record against No. 10 Providence. The Wheelhouses, both from Crookston, Minn., paced a BSU defense that prevented the puck from getting to goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Jr., Bratislava, Slovakia.) BSU had 43 blocks compared to 21 blocks from the Friars on the weekend. Only one goal was scored against Tomcikova on the weekend. BSU enters the St. Cloud State series with 83 blocks, however Maine only kept team blocks and did not give credit to individual players.

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) picked up the win in Friday's 3-2 overtime victory over Maine. Tomcikova's victory moves her within three of Bre Dedrickson's career wins mark. Erickson just broke the top 10 for career power-play goals after tallying a power-play goal versus Maine last Friday. She has nine for her career. **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) is also closing in on a top 10 mark for career assists. Wheelhouse needs 12 more assists to tie Amy Shepler for 10th. - **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) was invited to participate in the USA Women's Hockey National Festival which allowed her the chance to tryout for the USA Women's Hockey National Team. Vichorek was one of 79 players invited to participate in the camp.
